FPC Informational Memorandum: Social Security Numbers

Issue:

During traffic stops and field interviews, some Milwaukee Police Department (MPD) members may ask citizens for their social security numbers. Requesting a social security number can lead to an adverse confrontation. Citizens are often within their legal rights to refuse to provide the number. In a case brought to the attention of the FPC, an MPD officer is alleged to have insisted that a citizen provide his number. When the citizen in question refused to provide their social security number, they claim they were threatened with a citation and/or arrest¹. Such encounters may damage police-community relations. This memorandum examines the policy, procedure and customs of the MPD pertaining to the circumstances in which a social security number should be requested by a member.

Findings:

MPD Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) 710 – Field Interview/Traffic Warning Cards (February 15, 2000) states that members who initiate contact with suspicious persons, or persons involved in faulty driving habits or minor traffic violations are to submit a Field Interview/ Traffic Warning Card (FI card). It denotes the fields to be entered, which include: Officer's Payroll Number, Date and Time of Stop, Name of Person Stopped, Associates of Person Stopped, Date Of Birth, Age, Sex, Race, Division of Interest (such as Gang, Vice, Homicide, etc.) and Vehicle Information. The information requested for the FI cards include space for a social security number. Although not explicitly stated, there is no requirement to record a social security number. The SOP is silent concerning the circumstances in which the social security number should be requested. The FI card is to be turned in to the member's supervisor as soon as practicable after the contact occurred. The completed FI cards are forwarded to clerical staff on a daily basis for entry into the department's database. The FI cards are kept on file for seven (7) days at the work location after entry into the database, and then destroyed.

The majority of members carry FI cards on their person. Some members may write the information in their memo book and either transfer the information to a FI card at a later time, or enter it directly into the database when they return to their work location.

If a citizen is arrested, he/she is transported to the district station and booked. During the booking process, the member enters the citizen's personal information into the arrest report database. The database includes a field for the social security number.

In one instance, as a member was investigating a burglary of a business, he came across a citizen in a business in the vicinity of the burglary. As the member motioned to the citizen to come out of the business, the citizen waved the member off and continued closing his business for the day. When the member saw the citizen standing outside the business and watching the investigation, the member spoke with the citizen and allegedly demanded his social security number. The citizen refused to give his social security number and as a result was allegedly threatened with arrest.

law enforcement officer. No state law prior to January 1975 was located that requires disclosure to a law enforcement officer.

Congress enacted the 1998 Identity Theft and Assumption and Deterrence Act³ and made identity theft a felony. The U.S. Government Accountability Office reported the increased potential for identity theft using social security numbers in a 2006 report. As a result, the President's Task Force on Identity Theft by Executive Order 13402 was established on May 10, 2006. This Task Force subsequently issued its report on identity theft and this influenced many states to limit the inclusion of social security numbers in public records and to explore alternatives to using the numbers as identifiers. Identity theft can occur from police records, through open records requests for police document files, by inadvertent release of records, and by failure to properly redact government records.

Technology Alternatives:

Since the Field Interview/Traffic Warning Card SOP was last revised in 2000, technological innovations have been developed or improved. These innovations provide members with improved means to confirm the identity of persons that provide correct information and also recognize when persons are likely providing false identification information. None of the technology alternatives rely upon the social security number as an identifier.

MPD has been using the Morpho RapID mobile fingerprint scanner for just over a year. MPD purchased 130 scanners with grant funding and is in the process of deploying them throughout the department. With the citizen's consent, the citizen places his/her index finger onto the scanner screen for the device to read the fingerprint. If the citizen has been fingerprinted by MPD in the past, their name, date of birth, race, gender and Bureau of Identification number appear in approximately 20 seconds.

MPD Standard Operating Procedure 370 – Field Identification (April 13, 2007) states that during a field interview and the citizen's identity is in question, the citizen may consent to use the fingerprint scanner as part of the identification process. If a person does not consent, the member does not have authority to demand fingerprint identification. The scanner provides a quick and accurate confirmation of the citizen's identification, which allows the citizen to be released on the street instead of from a district station or the prisoner processing section. It is an effective method of deterring false identification.

In addition, the Wisconsin Department of Motor Vehicles maintains a database of driver's records and motor vehicle registrations. The database is accessible during any traffic stop or field interview via police radio or Mobile Data Computer in police vehicles. A properly trained member can query a citizen and corroborate the information provided with the Department of Motor Vehicle records to confirm a person's identification. The database also allows an experienced member to establish that false identification is being provided to a reasonable certainty in many instances.

Dear Mr. Granitz:

In response to your recent inquiries as to the above-referenced complaint, the Fire and Police Commission does maintain jurisdiction over the officers involved in the incident that occurred on March 15, 2007. In an effort to save the taxpayers from having to pay twelve officers overtime and the expense that it would take to mediate with all twelve officers, only to determine which two officers were involved, it made sense to eliminate the uninvolved officers from the process.

As you will recall, Cindy Janusz informed you on April 15, 2008 that Mr. Edwards described the officers over the telephone to her as both being white males, with the main officer being 6'6" tall, 230 lbs. and in his mid forties. The other officer involved was described as being 5'9" tall, 170 lbs. an in his mid twenties. From those descriptions and information she received from you, or officers she spoke with, she eliminated all officers that were not white males, and those that were not in the area of Mr. Edwards' arrest. Upon eliminating those officers, Ms. Janusz sent a letter to you and copied Mr. Edwards. Upon Mr. Edwards' receipt of the letter, he contacted Ms. Janusz and informed her that he knows Officer John Schott and Sgt. Joel Kujawa, and neither one was involved. With that information, it was decided that it would be best to get photographs of all of the officers that were involved in the incident for Mr. Edwards to view and pick out the correct officers.

On October 21, 2008, Mr. Edwards came to the Fire and Police Commission to view the photographs. Mr. Edwards narrowed down the officers to four—Officer Kurt Kezeske, Officer Todd Smolen, Officer Alan Schlief and Officer Todd Johnson. Mr. Edwards advised her that because they were in their tactical uniforms, which included their heads being somewhat covered, he could not make a positive identification from photographs which only included their faces. At this point, it was determined that it would be best if these four officers were requested to participate in mediation and the two that were not involved to be eliminated at that time.





We have received your claim in the amount of \$495.00, relating to damage sustained to your fence when a City tree fell on it on or about October 7, 2009 at 2245 West Walnut Street.

Our investigation reveals that the Forestry Section responded to a request for service on October 7, 2009 involving a City tree branch down at this location. The branch came from a tree that was alive and showed no external signs of decay. The records also noted the trees in the area were last pruned in April, 2004 pursuant to the City's programmed pruning schedule. They also searched their records for the last 5 years and found no requests for service for this tree prior to this incident. The Section followed its standard procedures and this loss occurred during windy conditions, as such, we are denying your claim.

If you wish to appeal this decision, you may do so by sending a letter within 21 days of receive of this letter to the Milwaukee City Clerk, 200 East Wells Street, Room 205, Milwaukee, Wiscomsin 53202, requesting a hearing.

To file a claim against the City a claimant must comply with Section 893.80(1), Wis. Stats., a copy of which is printed on the reverse side of this instruction sheet. Generally the statue requires the claimant to submit to the City Clerk:

- 1. A document stating the circumstances of the claim which must be signed by the claimant, or his/her agent or attorney. This document should be filed within 120 days of the event.
- 2. A document stating the address of the claimant and a statement of the relief sought. If money damages are sought, a specific sum must be stated.

(The above information may be combined in a single document.)

The following information should also be submitted to allow the City to promptly act on your claim:

- Proof of the amount of the claim by means of either itemized receipts or two itemized estimates.
- A phone number where the claimant can be reached during business hours as well as the claimant's e-mail address, if any.
- 3. As detailed a description of the incident as possible, including the date, time and place.


ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Before you can file a lawsuit against the City of Milwaukee for reimbursement, State law requires that you first follow the claim procedures established by the City Clerk.

Filing a claim against the City does not automatically guarantee reimbursement from the City. However, the City examines each claim on an individual basis in determining if reimbursement is legally required.

In order to obtain reimbursement for a claim against the City, you must prove that the City or its employees acted unlawfully. or negligently.

Only the City Attorney or the Common Council and the Mayor can authorize payment of a claim against the City. Any other representations made by City employees are not legally binding on the City.



893.80 Claims against governmental bodies or officers, agents or employees; notice of Injury; limitation of damages and suits. (1) Except as provided in subs. (1 g), (1 in), (1 p) and (8), no action may be brought or maintained against any volunteer fire company organized under ch.. 213, political corporation, governmental subdivision or agency thereof nor against any officer, official, agent or employee of the corporation, subdivision or agency for acts done in their official capacity or in the course of their agency or employment upon a claim or cause of action unless:

- (a) Within 120 days after the happening of the event giving rise to the claim, written notice of the circumstances of the claim signed by the party, agent or attorney is served on the volunteer fire company, political corporation, governmental subdivision or agency and on the officer, official, agent or employee under s. 801.11. Failure to give the requisite notice shall not bar action on the claim if the fire company, corporation, subdivision or agency had actual notice of the claim and the claimant shows to the satisfaction of the court that the delay or failure to give the requisite notice has not been prejudicial to the defendant fire company, corporation, subdivision or agency or to the defendant officer, official, agent or employee; and
- (b) A claim containing the address of the claimant and an itemized statement of the relief sought is presented to the appropriate clerk or person who performs the duties of a clerk or secretary for the defendant fire company, corporation, subdivision or agency and the claim is disallowed.







At 1934 N. 18th Street, Milwaukee WI 53205 RE:

On September 2, 2009 an excess of damage was made at my home. It was stated to me by officers at the time that someone had told the Milwaukee Police Department that I or members of my family sold drugs and stored weapons in my home. This was determined to be untrue and there was no disclosure as to who had given the police the false information leading to this incident. This is a new home that I had built in 2003. It is very disappointing for this to happen.

Officer Kujawa (employee Identification number 00702D) gave me a damage notice which indicated damage to only the front entry door and my bedroom door, the only two doors that were locked at the time. I have enclosed a copy of that damage notice. However several other doors were damaged including the garage door. The garage door was damaged/bent when one of the officers stood on the cross bar/strut which is not intended for that purpose.

The front closet door near the front entry door has a puncture hole in it as a result of the front door knob slamming into it by officers; the basement door has a puncture hole in it from being forced onto the door stop. The pantry door also has a puncture hole from being forced onto the door stop; the laundry room door is split near the door knob and my bedroom door and lock set are totally destroyed. The frame of the front entry door is busted and shattered with pieces from the top of the frame broken off. The lock set and the section of the door where it is connected is also bent on the front entry door causing it to jam.


The relief sought is replacement of all interior doors including locksets that were damaged during this incident, replacement of the front entry door including the lockset and repair of the strut on the garage door. I have included two sets of estimates for the materials. The labor costs are included for repairing the garage door and I am requesting in addition to the written estimates the amount of \$700.00 to have the exterior door, its frame and hardware installed and for the installation of the interior doors. The estimate (\$892.00) plus \$700.00 labor totals \$1592.00 for the total amount requested in this claim. I have enclosed pictures for your review.

We return the enclosed document which has been filed with the City Clerk and ask that it be introduced into and referred to the Committee on Judiciary & Legislation with the following recommendation.

Claimants, Mark and Luanne Schimmel, 3410 South 86th Street, Milwaukee, WI 53227, allege that they sustained damage to their personal property in their home's basement and incurred clean-up costs on July 9, 2009 due to water backing up into their home that was caused by a water main break. They claim damages in the amount of \$5,457.14.

Our investigation reveals that the Milwaukee Water Works (MWW) received a report of a leak and water in the basement at 3424 South 86th Street. A MWW field investigator was dispatched and a possible break in an 8-inch water main was confirmed in the area of South 86th Street and West Holt Avenue. The MWW contacted Digger's Hotline and repair activities were subsequently commenced. The main was repaired and placed back in service later that day.

The basement backup occurred in this situation because the main ruptured near to a sewer manhole chimney. The water broke through the chimney and travelled down to the sewer and back up into the homes.

The Sewer Maintenance Section (SMS) reviewed their records relative to this situation. The SMS investigated several backwaters in the 3300 and 3400 blocks of South 86th Street. The SMS sewer jet vac cleaned the sanitary and storm sewers and restored them to proper working order. The sanitary sewer is on a regular cleaning schedule and was

Since the sewer is on a regular cleaning schedule, the manhole chimney is on a regular inspection cycle, and the MWW responded to the water main break in a timely manner and followed standard procedures, we recommend denial of the claim.

They claim damages in the amount of \$6,867.00.

Our investigation reveals that the Milwaukee Water Works (MWW) received a report of a leak and water in the basement at 3424 South 86th Street. A MWW field investigator was dispatched and a possible break in an 8-inch water main was confirmed in the area of South 86th Street and West Holt Avenue. The MWW contacted Digger's Hotline and repair activities were subsequently commenced. The main was repaired and placed back in service later that day.

The basement backup occurred in this situation because the main ruptured near to a sewer manhole chimney. The water broke through the chimney and travelled down to the sewer and back up into the homes.

On July 9, 2009 my husband went into the basement at 8:00 am and discovered our basement floor was covered in about 2" of mud, and a mound of sand at least 2 ½ ft high around our sewer.

We immediately called our American Family Insurance Agent who arrived about an hour later. She immediately estimated the damage done and unfortunately informed us that this would not be covered under our policy.

We have lived in our house for 34 years and never have we had a drop of water in our basement, even when we had a water main break right in front of our house.

I also called the city's hotline (286-CITY) and explained what had happened and they were rude and hung up on me. I called back and they gave me the telephone number of Alderman Dudzik. I called and got a claim form from Dudzik's secretary.

On the afternoon of July 9th we tried to light our water heater, which is only 3 years old, and it wouldn't light. We called Blau Plumbing and they said we needed a new one due to the water damage. We had a new one installed on 7/11/09 by Fennig Plumbing and Heating.

At approximately 1:15 am on July 9, 2009, a water main break occurred in the 3400 block of S 86th ST in Milwaukee, roughly along the property line of our residence at 3428 S 86th St. The water released from the water main break traveled underground to an adjacent sanitary sewer manhole riser located approximately 6 to 10 feet from the break in the water main. The high volume of water released into the sewer could not exit properly at the end of our block and as a result a combination of sewage, silt and dirt surrounding the water main break back flowed into the basement of our residence causing considerable damage to property and structure.

At the time of this incident, this combination of sewage and silty water flowed in to our basement from both the floor drain, up through the toilet and even out of our vanity sink, to a depth of approximately 5 inches. Although the city water department was promptly notified of the main break, and crews arrived shortly thereafter, this sewage and main break water mixture continued to flow into our basement for approximately 2-3 hours.

There was a considerable loss of personal property as a result of this sewer back up, and a detailed itemized list is attached. In addition, considerable structural damage to our finished basement in our residence occurred as well. Two itemized estimates are attached for your reference.

It is documented that there have been a number of water main breaks in our neighborhood over the past several months and this information was supplied to residents at a neighborhood meeting hosted by Alderman Joe Dudzik on August 25, 2009. It is our belief that the City of Milwaukee knew there was history of water main breaks in the area. In addition, the sewer inspection report also supplied to residents at that same 8-25-09 meeting showed that the sewer pipe (only) in the 3400 block of S 86th was last inspected and cleaned in April of 2008.

It has come to our attention that the City of Milwaukee on December 15, 2005, signed a stipulation and order in the Milwaukee County Circuit Court, Branch 16 requiring the City of Milwaukee to 'internally inspect each of its sanitary sewer manholes at least once every five years to identify defects which may contribute to leakage.'

According to the 2008 Compliance Maintenance Annual Report (CMAR) filed by Dept of Public Works on behalf of the City of Milwaukee, only 15% of Manhole Inspections and 14% of Manhole Rehabilitations were completed that year, resulting in a Failing or "F" grade for sewerage collection systems as reported to the WI-DNR. Clearly the mandatory and required sanitary sewer manhole inspections and repairs every five years are not being met.

At the August 25, 2009 meeting, DPW Sewers Division Manager, Robert Brooks, stated that the sanitary sewer jetting procedure uses a water spray at approximately 1200 psi. The water main pressure in our neighborhood is typically 50-60 psi. The suggestion by the city officials at this meeting that the force of the water main break somehow crumbled or caused the sanitary sewer manhole riser to develop an opening seems highly unlikely given that the sewer Department themselves routinely use a water jet procedure that uses 1200 psi.

It seems very reasonable to assume that a gradual buildup of sand, silt and gravel at the ends of sanitary sewer pipe in the 3400 block of S 86th ST which impeded and prevented the proper flow of sewage water led directly to the sewer backup into our basement on July 9, 2009.

We believe the City had reasonable opportunity over a period of time to be aware of and correct the existing problems with the sanitary sewer line and water main on our block, and that this incident was not the result of a single causation on July 9th. Furthermore, the City of Milwaukee failed to complete the required sewer manhole inspections according to the Circuit Court Order Stipulation, effective as of June 2006.

Therefore, we feel the City of Milwaukee is clearly liable for damages resulting from the sanitary sewer back up into our basement on July 9, 2009 and we seek compensation for the resulting damages. Our claim for reimbursement is as follows \$15,878.25 for structural loss, plus personal property loss of \$6,678.54 minus our homeowner's insurance settlement of \$5,000.00 for a total of \$17,556.79.

We seek a claim for compensation for the \$17,556.79.

We return the enclosed document which has been filed with the City Clerk and ask that it be introduced into and referred to the Committee on Judiciary & Legislation with the following recommendation.

Claimants, Michael G. and Cheryl L. Krzewinski, 8527 West Holt Avenue, Milwaukee, WI 53227, allege that they sustained damage to their home's basement and personal property in it on July 9, 2009 due to water backing up into their home that was caused by a water main break. They claim damages in the amount of \$19,971.26.

Our investigation reveals that the Milwaukee Water Works (MWW) received a report of a leak and water in the basement at 3424 South 86th Street. A MWW field investigator was dispatched and a possible break in an 8-inch water main was confirmed in the area of South 86th Street and West Holt Avenue. The MWW contacted Digger's Hotline and repair activities were subsequently commenced. The main was repaired and placed back in service later that day.

The basement backup occurred in this situation because the main ruptured near to a sewer manhole chimney. The water broke through the chimney and then travelled down to the sewer and back up into the homes.

The Sewer Maintenance Section (SMS) reviewed their records relative to this situation. The SMS investigated several backwaters in the 3300 and 3400 blocks of South 86th Street. The SMS sewer jet vac cleaned the sanitary and storm sewers and restored them

The City was not aware of any problems with the manhole chimney prior to this incident and inspects all manhole chimneys in the City on a five-year cycle. Manhole chimneys in the subject area were scheduled to be inspected in 2010.

Since the sewer is on a regular cleaning schedule, the manhole chimney is on a regular inspection cycle, and the MWW responded to the water main break in a timely manner and followed standard procedures, we recommend denial of the claim.





2009 SENATE BILL 442

January 7, 2010 – Introduced by Senators Plale, Decker, Kreitlow, Taylor, Lassa, Hansen, Wirch, Lehman, Schultz and Kedzie, cosponsored by Representatives Molepske Jr., Clark, Townsend, Gunderson, A. Ott, Kerkman, Honadel, Zipperer and Gottlieb. Referred to Committee on Ethics Reform and Government Operations.

AN ACT *to create* 66.0902 of the statutes; **relating to:** requiring local units of government to use the qualifications—based selection process for certain public works consulting contracts.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill requires the use of a new method for the selection of a consultant by any city, village, town, or county (political subdivision), including a first class city, which is presently only Milwaukee, special purpose district, including a school district, or subunit (local governmental unit) if the consultant is required for a project that relates to certain public works contracts including the inspection of local bridges. Generally, under the bill, a local governmental unit is required to hire a consultant for a project based only on the consultant's qualifications.

A consultant is defined under the bill as a person who provides architectural services, engineering services, land surveying services, landscape architecture services, photogrammetric services, or professional geology services for a project. A project under the bill is a project of a local governmental unit that requires a consultant and relates to the planning, study, design, or construction inspection or administration of the public work or building, the total cost of which is estimated by a local governmental unit to be at least \$250,000 and that will be funded to some extent by the state government. A consultant's services on a project are separate, however, from the contract for the actual construction, repair, remodeling, or improvement of the public work or building. The value estimate and state funding requirements do not apply to local bridge inspections, however.

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The bill requires a local governmental unit to create a procedure to solicit proposals from consultants for projects, but the proposals may not contain any information on proposed fees, level of efforts, or costs. The local governmental unit must rank the consultants based on the consultants' qualifications as described in their proposals. The proposals must contain certain information about the consultants, including their specialized experience, capabilities, and technical competence; their quality of work and ability to meet schedules; and their proposed method of project management.

After the local governmental unit ranks the consultants, it must enter into negotiations with the highest ranked consultant to finalize the terms of the contract, including the fees, level of efforts, and costs. If the local governmental unit and consultant are unable to reach an agreement, the local governmental unit must enter into negotiations with the next highest ranked consultants, in order of their ranking, until a contract is finalized. If no agreement is reached with any of the consultants, the local governmental unit may retain a consultant for the project under any other allowable method.

The provisions created in the bill do not apply to a project that is needed to protect public health or welfare due to an emergency situation. Also under the bill, a local governmental unit may enter into a contract with a consultant with whom it has an established relationship, and who has previously provided similar services, without evaluating proposals from other consultants.

For further information see the *state and local* fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. 66.0902 of the statutes is created to read:

66.0902 Qualifications-based selection; engineering, architecture, and land surveying contracts. (1) Definitions. In this section:

- (a) "Architectural services" means the provision of services that consist of the practice of architecture, as defined in s. 443.01 (5).
- (b) "Consultant" means any person who provides architectural services, engineering services, land surveying services, landscape architecture services, photogrammetric services, or professional geology services.
- (c) "Engineering services" means the provision of services that consist of the practice of professional engineering, as defined in s. 443.01 (6).

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- (d) "Landscape architecture services" means the provision of services that consist of landscape architecture, as defined in s. 443.01 (3r).
 - (e) "Land surveying services" means the provision of services that consist of land surveying, as defined in s. 443.01 (4).
 - (f) "Level of effort" means the number of hours a consultant spends, or purposes to spend, on a project, broken down by the number of hours spent on the specific tasks of the project.
 - (g) "Local governmental unit" means a political subdivision of this state, a special purpose district in this state, an agency or corporation of a political subdivision or special purpose district, or a combination or subunit of any of the foregoing charged with procuring the services of a consultant.
 - (h) "Photogrammetric services" means activities associated with measuring, locating, and preparing maps, charts, or other graphical or digital presentations depicting natural or man made features, phenomena, and legal boundaries of the earth including surveys, maps, charts, remote sensing data, and images, and aerial photographic services.
 - (i) "Political subdivision" means any city, village, town, or county.
 - (j) "Professional geology services" means the provision of services that consist of the practice of professional geology, as defined in s. 470.01 (2).
 - (k) "Project" means any project of a local governmental unit that is related to a public work or building to which all of the following apply:
 - 1. The total cost of the complete project is estimated by the governing body of the local governmental unit to be at least \$250,000.
- 2. The state government provides some amount of financial assistance to the project.

- 3. The services of a consultant are required for the planning, study, design, or construction inspection or administration of the public work or building, but are separate from the contract for the actual construction, repair, remodeling, or improvement of the public work or building.
- (2) QUALIFICATIONS-BASED SELECTION. (a) Except as provided in sub. (4), for any project undertaken by a local governmental unit, the consultant that must be hired may be selected only on the basis of the consultant's qualifications, as determined under this subsection.
- (b) A local governmental unit shall develop a procedure to solicit proposals from consultants for projects, and shall rank the proposals according to the qualifications of the consultants. The proposals may not include any fees or costs for the proposed project, and the local governmental unit may not solicit fee, level of effort, or cost information from consultants except as provided in sub. (3).
- (c) To determine the qualifications of a consultant, the local governmental unit shall require that a proposal submitted for a project contain at least all of the following information about the consultant:
- 1. Its specialized experience, capabilities, and technical competence to meet the project requirements.
- 2. Its resources that are available to perform the required work, including any specialized services, within the time limits specified by the local governmental unit.
- 3. Its proposed approach to meet the project requirements and its proposed methods of project management.
- 4. The quality of its past work, its ability to meet schedules, and its cost control and contract administration practices.
 - 5. Its proximity to, and familiarity with, the project location.

- **(3)** Negotiation. (a) Following the receipt and ranking of the proposals, a local governmental unit shall negotiate with the highest ranked consultant to specify the terms of the contract, including costs, level of effort, and fees.
- (b) If the local governmental unit and the selected consultant are unable to negotiate a contract at a fee that is acceptable to the local governmental unit, the local governmental unit shall terminate negotiations with the consultant by written notification. Subject to sub. (4), the local governmental unit shall then commence negotiations with as many of the other consultants as necessary, as provided in this subsection and in the order of their ranking, until a contract is entered into.
- **(4)** EXCEPTIONS. (a) If a local governmental unit is unable to enter into a contract with a consultant under sub. (3), it may retain a consultant for the project under any other method that is authorized by law.
- (b) The procedures and requirements for selecting consultants under this section do not apply for the repair and reconstruction of any public work or building when damage or threatened damage to the public work or building creates an emergency, as determined by resolution of the governing body of the local governmental unit, in which the public health or welfare of the local governmental unit is endangered. Whenever the governing body of the local governmental unit determines by majority vote at a regular or special meeting that an emergency no longer exists, this paragraph no longer applies.
- (c) If a local governmental unit has an established relationship with a consultant who previously has provided similar services to the local governmental unit, the local governmental unit may solicit a proposal for another project directly from that consultant without soliciting proposals from other consultants.

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(5)	LOCAL BRIDGE INSPECTIONS.	If a local authority hires a consultant for
inspectin	g highway bridges under s. 84	4.17 (3) (b), the provisions of this section apply
to the hir	ring of the consultant, except	that the provisions specified in sub. (1) (k) 1.

Generally, under the bill, a local governmental unit is required to hire a consultant for a project based only on the consultant's qualifications.

A consultant is defined under the bill as a person who provides architectural services, engineering services, land surveying services, landscape architecture services, photogrammetric services, or professional geology services for a project. A project under the bill is a project of a local governmental unit that requires a consultant and relates to the planning, study, design, or construction inspection or administration of the public work or building, the total cost of which is estimated by a local governmental unit to be at least \$250,000 and that will be funded to some extent by the state government. A consultant's services on a project are separate, however, from the contract for the actual construction, repair, remodeling, or improvement of the public work or building. The value estimate and state funding requirements do not apply to local bridge inspections, however.

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The bill requires a local governmental unit to create a procedure to solicit proposals from consultants for projects, but the proposals may not contain any information on proposed fees, level of efforts, or costs. The local governmental unit must rank the consultants based on the consultants' qualifications as described in their proposals. The proposals must contain certain information about the consultants, including their specialized experience, capabilities, and technical competence; their quality of work and ability to meet schedules; and their proposed method of project management.

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After the local governmental unit ranks the consultants, it must enter into negotiations with the highest ranked consultant to finalize the terms of the contract, including the fees, level of efforts, and costs. If the local governmental unit and consultant are unable to reach an agreement, the local governmental unit must enter into negotiations with the next highest ranked consultants, in order of their ranking, until a contract is finalized. If no agreement is reached with any of the consultants, the local governmental unit may retain a consultant for the project under any other allowable method.

The provisions created in the bill do not apply to a project that is needed to protect public health or welfare due to an emergency situation. Also under the bill, a local governmental unit may enter into a contract with a consultant with whom it has an established relationship, and who has previously provided similar services, without evaluating proposals from other consultants.

For further information see the *state and local* fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. 66.0902 of the statutes is created to read:

66.0902 Qualifications-based selection; engineering, architecture, and land surveying contracts. (1) Definitions. In this section:

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- (b) "Consultant" means any person who provides architectural services, engineering services, land surveying services, landscape architecture services, photogrammetric services, or professional geology services.
- (c) "Engineering services" means the provision of services that consist of the practice of professional engineering, as defined in s. 443.01 (6).

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- (d) "Landscape architecture services" means the provision of services that consist of landscape architecture, as defined in s. 443.01 (3r).
- (e) "Land surveying services" means the provision of services that consist of land surveying, as defined in s. 443.01 (4).
- (f) "Level of effort" means the number of hours a consultant spends, or purposes to spend, on a project, broken down by the number of hours spent on the specific tasks of the project.
- (g) "Local governmental unit" means a political subdivision of this state, a special purpose district in this state, an agency or corporation of a political subdivision or special purpose district, or a combination or subunit of any of the foregoing charged with procuring the services of a consultant.
- (h) "Photogrammetric services" means activities associated with measuring, locating, and preparing maps, charts, or other graphical or digital presentations depicting natural or man made features, phenomena, and legal boundaries of the earth including surveys, maps, charts, remote sensing data, and images, and aerial photographic services.
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- 2. The state government provides some amount of financial assistance to the project.

3. The services of a consultant are required for the planning, study, design, or
construction inspection or administration of the public work or building, but are
separate from the contract for the actual construction, repair, remodeling, or
improvement of the public work or building.

- (2) QUALIFICATIONS-BASED SELECTION. (a) Except as provided in sub. (4), for any project undertaken by a local governmental unit, the consultant that must be hired may be selected only on the basis of the consultant's qualifications, as determined under this subsection.
- (b) A local governmental unit shall develop a procedure to solicit proposals from consultants for projects, and shall rank the proposals according to the qualifications of the consultants. The proposals may not include any fees or costs for the proposed project, and the local governmental unit may not solicit fee, level of effort, or cost information from consultants except as provided in sub. (3).
- (c) To determine the qualifications of a consultant, the local governmental unit shall require that a proposal submitted for a project contain at least all of the following information about the consultant:
- 1. Its specialized experience, capabilities, and technical competence to meet the project requirements.
- 2. Its resources that are available to perform the required work, including any specialized services, within the time limits specified by the local governmental unit.
- 3. Its proposed approach to meet the project requirements and its proposed methods of project management.
- 4. The quality of its past work, its ability to meet schedules, and its cost control and contract administration practices.
 - 5. Its proximity to, and familiarity with, the project location.

- **(3)** Negotiation. (a) Following the receipt and ranking of the proposals, a local governmental unit shall negotiate with the highest ranked consultant to specify the terms of the contract, including costs, level of effort, and fees.
- (b) If the local governmental unit and the selected consultant are unable to negotiate a contract at a fee that is acceptable to the local governmental unit, the local governmental unit shall terminate negotiations with the consultant by written notification. Subject to sub. (4), the local governmental unit shall then commence negotiations with as many of the other consultants as necessary, as provided in this subsection and in the order of their ranking, until a contract is entered into.
- **(4)** EXCEPTIONS. (a) If a local governmental unit is unable to enter into a contract with a consultant under sub. (3), it may retain a consultant for the project under any other method that is authorized by law.
- (b) The procedures and requirements for selecting consultants under this section do not apply for the repair and reconstruction of any public work or building when damage or threatened damage to the public work or building creates an emergency, as determined by resolution of the governing body of the local governmental unit, in which the public health or welfare of the local governmental unit is endangered. Whenever the governing body of the local governmental unit determines by majority vote at a regular or special meeting that an emergency no longer exists, this paragraph no longer applies.
- (c) If a local governmental unit has an established relationship with a consultant who previously has provided similar services to the local governmental unit, the local governmental unit may solicit a proposal for another project directly from that consultant without soliciting proposals from other consultants.

Jeff, I recommend **opposing** this legislation based on the fact that it precludes us from considering consultant fees as part of the selection criteria. Fees become very critical in determining the value of the service that a consultant will provide to us. It is very common, on any given RFP, to have several closely qualified consultants to perform a certain task or scope where only fees could determine the ranking of these consultants. This is a **value** approach of consultant selection which is prevalent amongst other municipalities.

Please note that we avoid using fees as a criteria when we predict using such professional services on state and federally funded projects.
