



Spent 1 year at Tecumseh Products Co. as a Pollution Control Chemist. Spent 8 years at Kohler Co; 5 years responsible for all environmental laboratory analysis and the last 3 years was responsible for all environmental compliance for all of Kohler Co.'s domestic operations. Left Kohler Co. in 1985 to start a hazardous waste transportation and remediation business in conjunction with E & K Hauling. Grew company from ~\$100,000 in sales first year to well over \$9 million by 1992. In 1993 the E & K companies joined several other Wisconsin waste management companies to become Superior Services. 



Analysis

This resolution makes the following changes to the Youth Council's By-Laws:

- 1. Any member who misses three regular or any six meetings shall have his or her seat on the Youth Council deemed vacant.
- 2. An obsolete reference to the Selection Committee is removed.

Whereas, The Youth Council of the City of Milwaukee requested, through the passage of Youth Council Resolution Number 1111 on May 9, 2012, changes to the Youth Council's By-Laws; and

Whereas, The Common Council recognizes the importance of full participation at Youth Council meetings and supports the implementation of an attendance policy for the Youth Council; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, By the Common Council of the City of Milwaukee, that the Common Council amends the Milwaukee Youth Council's By-Laws, as provided on pages 1 and 6 of the attached Youth Council By-Laws.

Milwaukee Youth Council By-laws Last Revised: May 9, 2012

ARTICLE I MEETINGS

- **Section 1. Regular Meetings.** The regular meetings of the Youth Council shall be held once each month on the second Wednesday of the month. Whenever a regular meeting day of the Youth Council falls on a legal holiday or a day that is a holiday by usage, the regular meeting of the Youth Council shall be held on a date to be determined by the Executive Committee.
- **Section 2. Special Meetings.** Special meetings may be called upon the request of any five members of the Youth Council. Any request made pursuant to this paragraph shall be submitted, in writing, to the office of the City Clerk. This request shall include the reason or reasons for requesting the special meeting. When a special meeting is called, notice shall be sent via electronic mail or by telephone to every member of the Youth Council at least 48 hours before the time of the meeting. The notice shall state the business to be transacted at the meeting and no other business shall be transacted.
- **Section 3. Location.** All meetings of the Youth Council shall be held at City Hall.
- **Section 4. Notification Requirements for Meetings.** Before convening a meeting of the Youth Council or any of its committees, the president of the Youth Council or a committee chair shall inform the office of the City Clerk of the time, date, place and subject matter of the meeting. The office of the City Clerk shall give public notice of the meeting in accordance with the requirements of the Wisconsin Open Meetings Law. This notice shall include posting on the City of Milwaukee's official website.
- **Section 5. Quorum.** A majority of the members at the time of the meeting shall constitute a quorum.
- **Section 6. Absences.** Any member who fails to appear and answer to his or her name when the roll is called at any regular meeting or special meeting, including committee meetings, shall be recorded as absent or excused. If a member cannot attend due to sickness or for a duly-authorized reason, the member shall notify the office of the City Clerk who shall notify the president or the committee chair before the meeting is called. No member present at any meeting of the Youth Council shall withdraw from the meeting without permission from the chair. >> Any member who misses three regular or any six meetings shall have his or her seat on the Youth Council deemed vacant. <<
- **Section 7. Order of Business.** The president of the Youth Council shall, when present, take the chair at the hour fixed for the meeting and call the members of the Youth Council to order. Before proceeding to business, the roll of the members shall be called, and the names of those present, excused and absent entered in the minutes. If a quorum is present, the order of business shall be:

- 1. Pledge of allegiance.
- 2. Approval of the minutes of the previous meeting.
- 3. Presentations.
- 4. Unfinished business.
- 5. Reports of standing committees.
- 6. Matters for consideration
- 7. Communications to be ordered on file.
- 8. Announcements

Section 8. Recording of Meetings. The proceedings of the Youth Council shall be recorded. Original recordings shall be preserved in accordance with the record retention schedule established by the office of the City Clerk.

Section 9. Rules. 1. Parliamentary Authority. *Robert's Rules of Order* shall govern the proceedings of the Youth Council in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with these rules, the City of Milwaukee Code of Ordinances, the Milwaukee City Charter, or the laws of the state of Wisconsin.

2. Suspension of Rules. No rules may be suspended, rescinded or amended without the concurrence of two-thirds of the members of the Youth Council.

Section 10. Seconds. A motion shall not need a second.

Section 11. Roll Calls. The ayes and noes shall be ordered upon any question at the request of any member and the Clerk shall call the roll of members in numerical order by aldermanic district with the exception of the Youth Council president who shall vote last. The Clerk shall enter in the minutes the names of members voting in the affirmative and those voting in the negative. No member shall explain his or her vote during the call of the roll.

_

ARTICLE II OFFICERS

- **Section 1. President.** When the Youth Council President is unable to attend to the duties of the office, his or her place shall be taken by the vice-president who shall serve as acting president of the Youth Council and discharge all the duties of the office until the president returns. If the vice-president is also absent, successors to the office shall be the remaining members of the Executive Committee by order of aldermanic district.
- **Section 2. Election of Youth Council President. 1.** The Clerk shall serve as temporary chair for purposes of presiding over the election of the Youth Council president.
- **2.** The Clerk shall call for nominations by saying: "Nominations are now in order for the office of Youth Council president."
- 3. Nominations need not be seconded.
- **4.** After all candidates have been nominated, the Clerk shall ask three times whether there are further nominations. If not, the Clerk shall declare nominations closed.
- **5.** The Clerk shall call the roll according to the order of aldermanic districts. Each Youth Council member shall orally state the name of the candidate or his or her choice. After the roll call vote, the Clerk shall announce the totals for each candidate.
- **6.** The candidate receiving a majority vote of the Youth Council members is elected. If no one receives the vote of the majority of Youth Council members, another ballot shall be taken repeating the procedures established in pars. 2 to 5.
- **Section 3. Election of Youth Council Vice-President.** The Youth Council Vice-President shall be elected in the same manner as the President as set forth in Article II, Sec. 2, pars. 2 to 6 except that the Youth Council President shall preside over the election of the Vice-President in the same manner that the Clerk presides over the election of the President.
- **Section 4. Clerk.** The City Clerk shall designate a representative of the office of the City Clerk to serve as Youth Council Clerk.

ARTICLE III CONDUCT OF MEMBERS

- **Section 1. Decorum. 1.** Any member who fails to take his or her seat after being requested by the president to do so, or is guilty of using any profane or unparliamentary language, or is guilty of any unprofessional conduct, shall be censured by a vote of a majority of the members present. No member of the Youth Council shall interfere with the orderly progress of the meeting by leaving his or her seat or engaging in unnecessary conversation.
- **2.**At Youth Council meetings, business attire is expected.
- **Section 2. Remuneration.** No member of the Youth Council shall receive any remuneration for his or her services.
- **Section 3. Limitations on Speech.** No member shall be recognized by the president unless the member is at his or her own place. No member shall speak more than twice on any question until all members who desire to speak have been heard, and then not without first obtaining recognition from the president. In speaking, members shall confine themselves to the question under consideration and shall avoid all personalities. The president of the Youth Council shall not address matters of substance, but shall confine his or her remarks to procedural matters, unless he or she relinquishes the chair and takes a seat among the other Youth Council members.

ARTICLE IV YOUTH COUNCIL FILES

- **Section 1. Form.** All Youth Council files shall be introduced in proper form, as established by the office of the City Clerk. The office of the City Clerk shall correct any mere clerical errors in any Youth Council file.
- **Section 2. New Files. 1.** New matters for consideration by the Youth Council shall be presented only at Youth Council meetings. The office of the City Clerk shall not accept any matter not properly identified as to source or authorship.
- 2. All new matters introduced shall be referred to the Executive Committee for its determination as to whether they require the preparation of legislation, the gathering of additional information, are simply to be placed on the agenda of a future meeting of the Youth Council, or some combination of these. The Executive Committee shall forward to the Youth Council a report on the status of all matters referred to it pursuant to this section.
- **Section 3.** Adoption of Resolution on Day of Introduction. Whenever a resolution is requested to be adopted on the same day it is introduced, the office of the City Clerk shall furnish each Youth Council member with a copy of the resolution and shall, upon request, read the resolution in its entirety. Resolutions to be adopted under this rule shall require a two-thirds vote of the members of the Youth Council at the time of the vote.
- **Section 4. Reintroduction.** Whenever any measure has been introduced for the consideration of the Youth Council and failed of adoption or passage, this measure, unless substantially changed, shall not be introduced again until at least three months from the date of the Youth Council meeting at which it failed of adoption or passage.
- **Section 5. Matters Placed on File.** A matter placed on file can, by motion adopted by majority vote at a regular meeting of the Youth Council, be taken from file and will follow the same procedure as if it were being originally introduced. All matters on file two years after the date of their introduction shall be deemed to have been indefinitely postponed as of the date that the matter was placed on file.

ARTICLE V COMMITTEES

- **Section 1. Executive Committee.** An Executive Committee comprised of the Youth Council President, who shall be the chair; the Youth Council Vice-President; and three other members of the Youth Council appointed by the Youth Council President shall have jurisdiction over:
- 1. Setting the agenda for regular meetings of the Youth Council.
- **2.** Determining whether new matters submitted for Youth Council consideration by Youth Council members require the preparation of legislation, further information to be gathered, both of the foregoing or neither.
- **3.** Rules and procedures of the Youth Council.
- [[Section 2. Selection Committee. No member of the Selection Committee may review applications received from his or her own district.]]
- **Section 2. Committee Meetings. 1.** The office of the City Clerk, upon the request of the chair or a majority of the members of any committee, shall call the committee at the time and place designated by the chair or by the majority.
- 2. All committee meetings shall be held at City Hall.
- **Section 3. Committee Reports.** When a committee has met and considered a matter referred to it, it shall report on the matter to the Youth Council. Each committee shall present a written report containing a listing of its recommendations to the Youth Council on all matters considered.

Guangdong is a province on the South China Sea coast of the People's Republic of China. The province was previously often written with the alternative English name Kwangtung Province. It surpassed Henan and Sichuan to become the most populous province in China in January 2005, registering 79 million permanent residents and 31 million migrants who lived in the province for at least six months of the year. [2][3] The provincial capital Guangzhou and economic hub Shenzhen are amongst the most populous and important cities in China.

Since 1989 Guangdong has topped the total GDP rankings among all provincial-level divisions, with Jiangsu and Shandong second and third in rank. According to provincial annual preliminary statistics, [4] Guangdong's GDP in 2010 reached CNY 4,550 billion, or USD 689.02 billion, making its economy roughly the same size as that of Turkey or Indonesia. [5] Guangdong has the fourth highest GDP per capita among all provinces of mainland China, after Jiangsu, Zhejiang and Liaoning. The province contributes approximately 12% of the PRC's national economic output, and is home to the production facilities and offices of a wide-ranging set of multinational and Chinese corporations. Guangdong also hosts the largest Import and Export Fair in China called the Canton Fair in Guangdong's capital city Guangzhou.

Name

"Guang" itself means "expanse" or "vast", and has been associated with the region since the creation of Guang Prefecture in AD 226. "Guangdong" and neighbouring Guangxi literally mean "expanse east" and "expanse west". Together, Guangdong and Guangxi are called the "Dual-Guangs" (*• lieng gueng). During the Song dynasty, the two Guangs were formally separated as Guangnan Dong lu (***) and Guangnan Xi lu (***), which became abbreviated as Guangdong lu (***) and Guangxi lu (***). The modern abbreviation */* (Yue) is a shortened form of Baiyue (***), a collective name for various peoples that lived in southern China in ancient times.

Prior to the introduction of Hanyu Pinyin, the province was known as **Kwangtung Province**. One should note that **Canton**, though etymologically derived from a Portuguese transliteration of "Guangdong", refers *only* to the provincial capital instead of the whole province, as documented by authoritative English dictionaries. The local people of the city of Guangzhou (Canton) and their language are still commonly referred to as Cantonese in English. Because of the prestige of Canton and its accent, Cantonese *sensu lato* can also be used for the phylogenetically related residents and Chinese dialects outside the provincial capital.

History

Guangdong was far away from the centre of ancient Chinese civilization in the north China plain. It was populated by peoples collectively known as the Baiyue, who may have spoken Tai–Kadai languages and been related to the Zhuang people in modern Guangxi.

Chinese administration in the region began with the Qin Dynasty. After establishing the first unified Chinese empire, the Qin expanded southwards and set up Nanhai Commandery at Panyu, near what is now part of Guangzhou. It used to be independent as Nanyue between the fall of Qin and the reign of Emperor Wu of Han. The Han Dynasty administered Guangdong, Guangxi, and northern Vietnam as Jiaozhi Province. Under the Wu Kingdom of the Three Kingdoms period, Guangdong was made its own province, the Guang Province, in 226.

As time passed, the demographics of what is now Guangdong slowly shifted to (Han) Chinese-dominance, especially during several periods of massive migration from the north during periods of political turmoil and/or nomadic incursions from the fall of the Han Dynasty onwards. For example, internal strife in northern China following the rebellion of An Lushan resulted in a 75% increase in the population of Guangzhou prefecture between 740s-750s and 800s-810s. [6] As more migrants arrived, the local population was gradually assimilated to Han Chinese culture, [7] or displaced. From the tenth to twelfth century, Persian women were to be found in Guangzhou (Canton), some of them in the tenth century like Mei Zhu in the harem of the Emperor Liu Chang, and in the twelfth century large numbers of Persian women lived there, noted for wearing mulitiple earrings and "quarrelsome dispositions". [8][9] Multiple women originating from the Persian Gulf lived in Guangzhou's foreign quarter, they were all called "Persian women" (*** Po-ssu-fu or Bosifu).

Together with Guangxi, Guangdong was made part of Lingnan Circuit (political division Circuit), or Mountain-South Circuit, in 627 during the Tang Dynasty. The Guangdong part of Lingnan Circuit was renamed Guangnan East Circuit *gu•ng* nán *d•ng* lù in 971 during the Song Dynasty (960-1279). "Guangnan East" is the source of "Guangdong".

As Mongols from the north engaged in their conquest of China in the 13th century, the Southern Song Dynasty retreated southwards, eventually ending up in today's Guangdong. The Battle of Yamen 1279 in Guangdong marked the end of the Southern Song Dynasty (960-1279).

During the Mongol Yuan Dynasty, large part of current Guangdong belongs to Jiangxi Province. [11] Its present name, "Guangdong Province" was given in early Ming Dynasty.

Since the 16th century, Guangdong has had extensive trade links with the rest of the world. European merchants coming northwards via the Straits of Malacca and the South China Sea, particularly the Portuguese and British, traded extensively through Guangzhou. Macau, on the southern coast of Guangdong, was the first European settlement in 1557.

In the 19th century, the opium traded through Guangzhou triggered the First Opium War, opening an era of foreign incursion and intervention in China. In addition to Macau, which was then a Portuguese colony, Hong Kong was ceded to the British, and Kwang-Chou-Wan to the French.

Guangdong was also the major port of exit for labourers to Southeast Asia and the West in the 19th century, i.e. United States and Canada. As a result, many overseas Chinese communities have their origins in Guangdong. The Cantonese language therefore has proportionately more speakers among overseas Chinese people than mainland Chinese. In the US, there is a large number of Chinese who are descendants of immigrants from the city of Taishan (Toisan in Cantonese), who speak a distinctive dialect related to Cantonese called Taishanese (or Toishanese).

During the 1850s, the Taiping Rebellion, whose leader Hong Xiuquan was born in Guangdong and received a pamphlet from a Protestant Christian missionary in Guangdong, became a widespread civil war in southern China. Because of direct contact with the West, Guangdong was the center of anti-Manchu and anti-imperialist activity. The generally acknowledged founder of modern China, Sun Yat-sen, was also from Guangdong.


During the early 1920s of the Republic of China, Guangdong was the staging area for Kuomintang (KMT) to prepare for the Northern Expedition, an effort to bring the various warlords of China back under the central government. Whampoa Military Academy was built near Guangzhou to train military commanders.

In recent years, the province has seen extremely rapid economic growth, aided in part by its close trading links with Hong Kong, which borders it. It is now the province with

the highest gross domestic product in China.

In 1952, a small section of Guangdong's coastline was given to Guangxi, giving it access to the sea. This was reversed in 1955, and then restored in 1965. Hainan Island was originally part of Guangdong but it was separated as its own province in 1988.

Geography



Guangdong faces the South China Sea to the south and has a total of 4,300 km of coastline. Leizhou Peninsula is on the southwestern end of the province. There are a few inactive volcanoes on Leizhou Peninsula. The Pearl River Delta is the convergent point of three upstream rivers: the East River, North River, and West River. The river delta is filled with hundreds of small islands. The province is geographically separated from the north by a few mountain ranges collectively called the Southern Mountain Range (••). The highest peak in the province is Shikengkong 1,902 meters above sea level.

Guangdong borders Fujian province to the northeast, Jiangxi and Hunan provinces to the north, Guangxi autonomous region to the west, and Hong Kong and Macau Special Administrative Regions to the south. Hainan province is offshore across from the Leizhou Peninsula. Certain of the Pratas Islands which have traditionally been regarded as part of Guangdong Province are administered by the Government of the Republic of China on Taiwan. [12]

Cities around the Pearl River Delta include Dongguan, Foshan, Guangzhou, Huizhou, Jiangmen, Shenzhen, Shunde, Taishan, Zhongshan and Zhuhai. Other cities in the province include Chaozhou, Chenghai, Kaiping, Nanhai, Shantou, Shaoguan, Xinhui, Zhanjiang, Zhaoqing, Yangjiang and Yunfu.

Guangdong has a humid subtropical climate (Köppen Cfa inland, Cwa along the coast), though nearing a tropical climate in the far south. Winters are short, mild, and relatively dry, while summers are long, hot, and very wet. Average daily highs in Guangzhou in January and July are 18 °C (64 °F) and 33 °C (91 °F) respectively, although the humidity makes it feel much hotter in summer. Frost is rare on the coast but may happen a few days each winter well inland.

Economy

After the communist revolution and until the start of the Deng Xiaoping reforms in 1978, Guangdong was an economic backwater, although a large underground, servicebased economy has always existed. Economic development policies encouraged industrial development in the interior provinces which were weakly joined to Guangdong via transportation links. The government policy of economic autarchy made Guangdong's access to the ocean irrelevant. I

Deng Xiaoping's open door policy radically changed the economy of the province as it was able to take advantage of its access to the ocean, proximity to Hong Kong, and historical links to overseas Chinese. In addition, until the 1990s when the Chinese taxation system was reformed, the province benefited from the relatively low rate of taxation placed on it by the central government due to its post-Liberation status of being economically backward.

Guangdong's economic boom began with the early 1990s and has since spread to neighboring provinces, and also pulled their populations inward. The economic growth of Guangdong province owes much to the low-value added manufacturing which characterized (and in many ways still defines) the province's economy following Deng

Xiaoping's reforms. Guangdong is not only China's largest exporter of goods, it is the country's largest importer as well. [13]

The province is now one of the richest in the nation, with the most billionaires in mainland China, [14], the highest GDP among all the provinces, although wage growth has only recently begun to rise due to a large influx of migrant workers from neighboring provinces. In 2011, Guangdong's aggregate nominal GDP reached 5.30 trillion RMB (US \$838.60 billion) with a per capita GDP of 47,689 RMB. [15] By 2015, the local government of Guangdong hopes that the service industry will account for more than 50% of the provinces GDP and high-tech manufacturing another 20%. [13]

In 2009, Guangdong's primary, secondary, and tertiary industries were worth 201 billion yuan, 1.93 trillion yuan, and 1.78 trillion yuan respectively. ¹⁵¹ Its per capita GDP reached 40,748 yuan (about US\$5,965). [16] Guangdong contributes approximately 12% of the total national economic output. [17] Now, it has three of the six Special Economic Zones: Shenzhen, Shantou and Zhuhai. The affluence of Guangdong, however, remains very much concentrated near the Pearl River Delta.

In 2008 its foreign trade also grew 7.8% from the previous year and is also by far the largest of all of China. By numbers, Guangdong's foreign trade accounts for more than a quarter of China's US\$2.56 trillion foreign trade or roughly US\$683 billion. last

Demographics

Guangdong officially became the most populous province in January 2005. [2][3] Official statistics had traditionally placed Guangdong as the 4th most populous province of China with about 80 million people (also, Sichuan, traditionally the most populous province, was divided into Sichuan and Chongqing in 1997) but recently released information suggests that there are an additional 30 million migrants who reside in Guangdong for at least six months every year, making it the most populous province with a population of more than 110 million. [21] The massive influx of migrants from other provinces, dubbed the "floating population", is due to Guangdong's booming economy and high demand for labor.

Guangdong is also the ancestral home of large numbers of overseas Chinese. Most of the railroad laborers in Canada, Western United States and Panama in the 19th century came from Guangdong. Many people from the region also travelled to the US / California during the gold rush of 1849, and also to Australia during its gold rush a decade or so later. Emigration in recent years has slowed with economic prosperity, but this province is still a major source of immigrants to North America and elsewhere in

The majority of the province's population is Han Chinese. Within the Han Chinese, the largest subgroup in Guangdong are the Cantonese people. Two other major groups are the Teochew people in Chaoshan and the Hakka people in Huizhou, Meizhou, Heyuan, Shaoguan and Zhanjiang. There is a small Yao population in the north. Other smaller minority groups include She, Miao, Li, and Zhuang.

Guangdong has a highly unbalanced gender ratio that is among the highest of all provinces in China. According to a 2009 study published in the British Medical Journal, in the 1-4 age group, there are over 130 boys for every 100 girls. [22]

Politics

Relations with Hong Kong and Macau

Hong Kong and Macau, while historically parts of Guangdong before becoming colonies of the United Kingdom and Portugal respectively, are special administrative regions (SARs). Furthermore, the Basic Laws of both SARs explicitly forbid provincial governments from intervening in local politics. As a result, many issues with Hong Kong and Macau, such as border policy and water rights, have been settled by negotiations between the SARs' governments and the Guangdong provincial government.

Media

Guangdong and the greater Guangzhou area is served by several Radio Guangdong stations and Guangdong TV. There is an English programme produced by Radio Guangdong which broadcasts information about this region to the entire world through the WRN Broadcast.

Culture

The central region, which is also the political and economic center, is populated predominantly by Cantonese speakers, though the influx in the last three decades of millions of Mandarin-speaking immigrants has diminished Cantonese linguistic dominance somewhat. This region is associated with Cantonese cuisine (simplified Chinese: ••; traditional Chinese: ••). Cantonese opera (simplified Chinese: ••; traditional Chinese: ••) is a form of Chinese opera popular in Cantonese speaking areas. Related Yue dialects are spoken in most of the western half of the province.

The area comprising the cities of Chaozhou, Shantou and Jieyang in coastal east Guangdong, known as Chaoshan, forms its own cultural sphere. The Teochew people here, alongside with Hailufeng people in Shanwei, speak Teochew (simplified Chinese: ••, traditional Chinese: ••), which is a Min dialect closely related to Min-nan and their cuisine is Teochew cuisine (simplified Chinese: •••; traditional Chinese: •••). Teochew opera (simplified Chinese: ••, traditional Chinese: ••) is also very famous with a unique form.

The Hakka people live in large areas of Guangdong, including Huizhou, Meizhou, Shenzhen, Heyuan, Shaoguan and other areas. Much of the Eastern part of Guangdong is populated by the Hakka people except for the Chaozhou and Hailufeng area. Hakka culture include Hakka cuisine (***), Han opera (simplified Chinese: **; traditional Chinese: **; traditional Chinese: **) •), Hakka Hanyue and sixian (traditional instrumental music) and Hakka folk songs (••••).

Zhanjiang area in southern Guangdong is populated by Hai'nan dialect (or Leizhou dialect as referred locally) speakers, Cantonese and Hakka are also spoken there.

Mandarin is the language used in education and government and in areas where there are migrants from other provinces, above all in Shenzhen. Cantonese maintains a strong position in common usage and media, even in eastern areas of the province where the local dialects are non-Yue ones.


Tourism

Whereas, A Continuum of Care (CoC) is a required structure for any community seeking funding from the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Supportive Housing Program (SHP); and

Whereas, The Milwaukee's Continuum of Care was established in 1995. The CoC structure was an unincorporated coalition of: homeless service providers, government entities, advocates, faith-based groups and others. Currently, the CoC has an elected Steering committee and two volunteer cochairs, one each from the public and private sector; and

Whereas, The CoC is responsible for coordinating the community's annual HUD application for SHP

funding, managing the community's application for State Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funding, implementing the 10-Year Plan to End Homelessness, conducting annual counts of homeless people (Point In Time Count), and addressing other matter which impact homeless people and the system developed to respond to their needs; and

Whereas, The CoC is recognized by local, state and federal government as the primary decision-making entity of homeless service issues in Milwaukee County; and

Whereas, The Milwaukee County served as the CoC Lead Agency from 1995 to 2001, and in 2001 to present, the Community Advocates assumed the Lead Agency role; and

Whereas, The Milwaukee CoC covers the City of Milwaukee, City of West Allis, City of Wauwatosa and the remainder of Milwaukee County; and

Whereas, The State of Wisconsin Department of Administration is the Lead Administrator for the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) of all CoC's in the State of Wisconsin; now therefore, be it
