(11th Aldermanic District) THE CHAIR Sponsors: ---2,460.29 claim related to damage to a private vehicle parked at the Milwaukee Police Department parking structure. There is no evidence that a city vehicle caused the damage. 9. 051524 Resolution relating to the appeal of Ingrid Johansson relative to a claim for property damage. (5th Aldermanic District) THE CHAIR Sponsors: ---\$413.08 claim related to damage from a forced entry by the Milwaukee Police Department. The police exercised appropriate action and the city is not liable. 10. Resolution relating to a claim from Brenda Brown for property damage. (7th 051634 Aldermanic District) THE CHAIR Sponsors: ---\$27,256 claim related to repairs done a private residence as part of the Neighborhood Improvement Project program. There is no evidence that the city was negligent in the matter.

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Resolution relating to the appeal of Atty. James Rice on behalf of Benjamin Rothschild relative to a claim for property damage. (3rd Aldermanic District)

---\$1.429.36 claim related to damage to a private vehicle which was towed by the city. From city records, it appears that the vehicle was damaged prior to its

being towed.

12. <u>051528</u> Resolution relating to a claim from William and Patrick Bigalke for property damage. (13th Aldermanic District)

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---\$11,144.39 claim related to items damaged in a basement due to a water backup. The sewer was on a regular cleaning schedule and the city had no notice of a prior problem, so it cannot be held liable.

13. Osticotencation relating to an appeal from Rafael Escobedo-Xicotencation property damage. (12th Aldermanic District)

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---\$2,587.94 claim related to a traffic accident between a private vehicle and a city vehicle. The city proposed a settlement of 50% (1,293.97) of the lower estimate of the damages, which was rejected by the claimant.

14. Ostical Resolution relating to an appeal from Fannie Eason for property damage. (7th Aldermanic District)

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---\$784 claim related to damage to a private garage door. There is no evidence to support the allegation that the damage was caused by a city vehicle.

15. Resolution authorizing payment of the claim of Lawrence Pierce, C.I. File No. 05-I -133.
