---\$14,000 claim related to a burglary at a private residence. The City Attorney's position is that the police department followed all standard procedures in investigating the crime.

Resolution relating to an appeal from Leonard Bryant for property damage. (2nd Aldermanic District)

Sponsors: THE CHAIR

---\$1,177.44 claim related to damage to a private vehicle that occurred during an arrest. The City Attorney's position is that the officers acted appropriately and the damage was caused by the person being taken into custody, not the officers.

---\$2,263.73 claim related to backwater in a private residence. The City Attorney's position is that was not negligent in this matter and followed normal procedures.
