Analysis

This ordinance revises various provisions of the code for purposes of correcting errors, clarifying language and eliminating obsolete provisions.

Body

The Mayor and Common Council of the City of Milwaukee do ordain as follows:

Part 1. Section 81-87 of the code is amended to read:

81-87. Parking Permit: On-street Commuter Parking, Impacted Areas. There shall be no fee charged for on-street commuter parking permits for impacted areas issued on [[either a quarterly or]] an annual basis.

(See s. 101-27.7).

Part 2. Section 90-11-2-b-2-g of the code is amended to read:

90-11. Renewal of License.

PROCEDURE FOR NOWRENEWAL.

b. Hearing.

b-2-g. If the chair should at any time determine that a hearing is or will be contested, the chair will announce that a time limit of 30 minutes shall be provided opponents of the license renewal and a time limit of 30 minutes for the applicant supporters of the license renewal. This time will be extended for relevant questioning by licensing committee members. If upon expiration of 30 minutes for opponents or 30 minutes for the applicant and proponents the chair should determine, subject to the approval or objection of the committee, that a full and fair hearing of relevant issues requires an extension of time to protect the interests of the public and the applicant, a reasonable extension of time may be granted. Individuals opposing the proposed license and members of the public supporting the proposed license [[shall be limited to not more than 2 minutes testimony each, or a lesser

amount of time if the chair determines that further limitation is necessary for the efficient conduct of the hearing]] >> may be limited to not more than 2 minutes testimony each, or a greater or lesser amount if the chair determines that a different time limit is appropriate to the fair and efficient conduct of the hearing<<. The applicant shall have the privilege of using any portion of applicant's 30 minutes for presentation and testimony. At any time, the chair may overrule or prohibit redundant testimony or argument found unnecessary to substantiate or corroborate testimony and argument previously presented.

Part 3. Section 101-44-1 of the code is amended to read:

101-44. Bus Stops Locations and Regulations.

1. LOCATIONS. No operator of a duly authorized common carrier of passengers may regularly stop on any highway within the limits of this city for the purpose of receiving or discharging passengers except at such locations approved by the transit stop [[subcommittee of the utilities and licenses]] >> technical<< committee [[of the common council]]]. Formal action by the common council shall not be required except in cases of dispute. The infrastructure services division of the department of public works shall keep and maintain appropriate record of such locations approved by the transit stop [[subcommittee of the common council]] >> technical committee<<.

This is written in response to your comments made on Monday, April 26, 2010 at the Judiciary and Legislation Committee Meeting regarding Mr. Walter Lowe's claim.

Let there be no misunderstanding - Mr. Lowe did not make any payment on the special assessment bill, number 9999157856, for his property at 4426 North 88th Street. Funds were withdrawn and transferred from the Contemplated Specials Account (tender type CS) to pay the special improvement bill in full on May 4, 2007. Mr. Lowe was sent a receipt of the transaction, number 00211483, as the current owner of the property (reference Exhibit A).

Had Mr. Lowe made a cash payment, his payment receipt would have indicated a tender type of CA. His receipt, number 00211483, does not; it has a tender type of CS. A sample of a cash payment on a different special improvement bill from the same series is attached as Exhibit B, which shows the CA tender type. A sample check payment receipt is attached as Exhibit C, which shows the CK tender type. An index of all of the iNovah cashier system tender types is also attached.

Also, note that an iNovah system query reveals that only one payment, that of May 4, 2007 made from the Contemplated Specials Account, is the only payment made on the special improvement bill in question. No duplicate payment was ever made or received on the special improvement bill due on Mr. Lowe's property. A copy of the query results is attached.

This office finds Mr. Lowe's claim groundless and recommends that it should be denied.



We have received your claim in the amount of \$921.15, relating to damage to your vehicle that was allegedly caused by a City excavation operation at South 5th Street and West Walker Street on February 19, 2010.

Our investigation reveals that the Infrastructure Services Division (ISD) reviewed its records relative to this incident. They found the ISD engaged in emergency electrical repairs. There was no time to set "No Parking" signs due to the nature of the operation. The ISD spoke with the crew on scene that day and none of the members touched your vehicle. The crew was also adamant they caused no damage to the vehicle and no stone or concrete chip were observed. The crew also noted they placed themselves between the work area and your vehicle. Since there is not evidence to support your claim and the ISD followed its normal procedures, the City cannot accept liability and we are denying your claim.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR FILING A CLAIM AGAINST THE CITY OF MILWAUKEE

To file a claim against the City a claimant must comply with Section 893.80(1), Wis. Stats., a copy of which is printed on the reverse side of this instruction sheet. Generally the statue requires the claimant to submit to the City Clerk:

- A document stating the circumstances of the claim which must be signed by the claimant, or his/her agent or attorney. This document should be filed within 120 days of the event.
- 2. A document stating the address of the claimant and a statement of the relief sought. If money damages are sought, a specific sum must be stated.

(The above information may be combined in a single document.)

The following information should also be submitted to allow the City to promptly act on your claim:

- Proof of the amount of the claim by means of either itemized receipts or two itemized estimates.
- 2. A phone number where the claimant can be reached during business hours as well as the claimant's e-mail address, if any.
- As detailed a description of the incident as possible, including the date, time and place.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Before you can file a lawsuit against the City of Milwaukee for reimbursement, State law requires that you first follow the claim procedures established by the City Clerk.

Filing a claim against the City does not automatically guarantee reimbursement from the City. However, the City examines each claim on an individual basis in determining if reimbursement is legally required.

In order to obtain reimbursement for a claim against the City, you must prove that the City or its employees acted unlawfully. or negligently.


Only the City Attorney or the Common Council and the Mayor can authorize payment of a claim against the City. Any other representations made by City employees are not legally binding on the City.





We have received your claim in the amount of \$1,006.50, relating to damage allegedly sustained on January 6, 2010 due to a water main break near your property located at 7901 West Winfield Avenue.

Our investigation reveals that the Milwaukee Water Works (MWW) records indicate that at 10:36 p.m. on January 5, 2010 their control center received a report of a leak in the street in the area of North 80th Street and West Winfield Avenue. They dispatched a field investigator who confirmed a break in an 8-inch water main at 6346 North 80th Street and immediately shut off the water. The MWW notified the Department of Public Works (DPW)-Sewers to open the catch basins in the area. The DPW responded and followed standard procedures. We return the enclosed document which has been filed with the City Clerk and ask that it be introduced and referred to the Committee on Judiciary and Legislation with the following recommendation.

Claimant, Demco Wisconsin 5, LLC by Manager Michael DeMichele, 2060 North Humboldt Avenue, Suite 250, Milwaukee, WI 53212 allege that on or about December 2, 2009 they suffered damages and costs related to a water leak at their building located at 223 North Water Street. They seek damages in the amount of \$5,194.34.

Our investigation reveals that the Milwaukee Water Works (MWW) responded to a request to turn the water off on December 2, 2009 at this location due to flooding conditions. The MWW confirmed a branch leak and began its correlation and repair work. They encountered several complications with crowded utilities and deep placement due to grade changes over the years. The MWW then excavated to expose an inactive water service and disconnected it at the water main. This action stopped the leak and the area was back-filled and blacktopped with a temporary asphalt patch. The MWW



Dear Ms. Fleming:

As we discussed, I am hereby requesting that the City of Milwaukee Water Works ("MWW") reimburse the owner of the aforementioned property, Demco Wisconsin 5, LLC ("DW5"), for damages it withstood due to the City water main break in Water Street on Wednesday and Thursday, December 2nd and 3rd.

An accurate description of the damaging events is as follows:

On Wednesday, December 2, 2009, at approximately 11:45 a.m., I received a call from my 1st floor and basement tenant at 223 N. Water Street that there was a leak in the basement at the front of the building and it was running into their space. After, arriving on the scene, I witnessed water shooting out of the area of the existing 6" water lateral serving the building. I contacted our plumber, Cornerstone Plumbing who responded immediately to help me determine what was happening. Our building in the

Third Ward is typical in the manner that the front wall of the building is under the sidewalk at the curb line of the street.

Cornerstone Plumbing diagnosed the problem as not coming from the buildings' plumbing but coming from <u>outside</u> the building and spraying in the brick wall around the existing lateral pipe below the curb line of the street. We contacted the MWW for immediate response. They arrived 45 minutes later; meanwhile I was mopping to try to contain the water and mess and keep it off of the adjacent electrical panels. Fundamentally, besides the basic issues with water pouring into one's basement, the building at 223 N. Water St. has the unique problem of having a "hung sewer". That is, the sewer lateral enters the building at an elevation that is at the <u>top</u> of the ceiling of the basement, not under the floor, so there are no drains in the basement and no way to get the water spraying in into a sewer.

When a MWW service person arrived, he first tried turning off the lateral serving our building. This had NO effect on the pressure of the water spraying into the building. We were standing in shoe-deep water. The representative from the MWW contacted the main office of MWW for additional support. MWW could not find the source of the water entering the building. Meanwhile, water continued to spray into the building under force and there was concern the brick wall would fail and a large scale flood could overwhelm the basement. I contacted Paul Davis Restoration to assist me in managing the water entering the building, which I could clearly not keep up with, as I had no idea of how long this would go on. Paul Davis Restoration ("PDR") fortunately brought in a man with a vacuum truck run by a gas engine that could suck up the water from the floor through a hose leading out of the building and into the storm sewer.

I was directed by MWW personnel to contact Jesse Hernandez from MWW in order to arrange for temporary water service to the building charged by a neighboring building. MWW personnel arrived to provide temporary service, however, were not willing to make plumbing modifications to charge our system with the neighbors water. They just wanted to screw a hose to a pipe and turn it on. Having a restaurant tenant, Rustico, a business that depends upon water, we had to have the temporary service. Therefore, I directed my plumber to make the modification to our hose bib to accept the

charging hose from the building next door to get temporary water service. He completed it and we successfully received water through the hose into the building's piping system.

The water poured in all day and night. I dealt with several different representatives of MWW such as Tim Frederichs on site and Mike Lloyd in the office. I stayed at the property all day trying to manage the information, control the damage and ease my tenants' concerns. That evening, around 8 p.m., with the water still pouring in and the vac-truck operator pumping it out as fast as he could, I was told that the MWW personnel had still had not found the source of the leak.

The vac-truck operator worked all night long, managing the removal of water as it came in. PDR returned around 9:30 p.m. to apply stop leak to the brick wall to try to slow the leak as it was overwhelming the vac-truck. They had minor success and it allowed the vac-truck to catch up and not burn out.

I arrived the next morning at 8 a.m. MWW representatives had a large hole around 25' deep in the northbound land of N. Water Street. They were working on an old lateral that they believed had broken and never been turned off at the valve. Around 10 a.m. they were successful in turning the valve off to the old lateral and the water pressure subsided and the water stopped coming into our basement. The vac-truck operator, who worked tirelessly for 21 hours straight, was finally able to go home.

I called our plumber back to disconnect the temporary water service and put the building back on line to the normal water service. I brought in a handyman to tear out a couple of partitions in the basement that were adjacent to the water leak and water logged.

As we continue to shift towards a more globalized economy, market opportunities are expanding across the globe, and the need for producers to receive and ship goods more frequently and quickly over long distances is increasing. Accordingly, the 21st Century has been dubbed the Fast Century - an era when speed and agility determine commercial success. While this shift has been beneficial for the United States, the globalized economy has also created a multitude of new international competitors. Nowhere is this competition more apparent than with the expansion of shipping services.

Strategic accessibility, shaped by evolving transportation technology and infrastructure, significantly impact where modern industries locate and where commercial growth and economic development occur. To serve the economic demands of connectivity, speed, and agility, a new urban form comprising a multimodal transportation network and aviation-intensive businesses called the "aerotropolis" is springing up around the world. Similar in shape to the traditional metropolis design, the aerotropolis can extend up to 30 miles out from major airports and is centered around a planned, coordinated multimodal freight and passenger transportation network. Aerotropolises are emerging because of the advantages airports provide to business in a fast-paced, globally networked economy.

Aerotropolises require a coordinated, localized transportation network of unprecedented scale called an aerotropolis transportation system. Development of aerotropolis transportation systems is vital to U.S. economic competitiveness as cities around the world like Paris, Amsterdam, and Beijing create world class transportation networks and compete against American cities to attract corporate headquarters, warehouses, and logistics centers.

In an effort to increase the United State's economic competitiveness and spur the development of domestic aerotropolis transportation systems, I am introducing the Aerotropolis Act of 2010. This legislation will amend the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA–LU) to ensure that projects that assist in the establishment of aerotropolis transportation systems are eligible to receive funds under the Projects of National and Regional Significance Program.

Currently, aerotropolis transportation systems are developing in cities across the United States like Detroit and Indianapolis, but these cities are not able to generate sufficient funding for these complex, intermodal networks. An aerotropolis transportation system is a perfect fit for the Projects of National and Regional Significance Program since the program is designed to fund high-cost projects that enhance U.S. competitiveness and cannot easily be addressed through traditional funding mechanisms.

Please join me in enhancing American economic competitiveness and advancing the development of aerotropolis transportation systems by becoming an original cosponsor of the Aerotropolis Act of 2010. 2009-10 Legislative Session Wrap-up

The City of Milwaukee's Intergovernmental Relations Division (IRD) recently completed its efforts during the 2009-10 Wisconsin Legislative Session. The following are some statistics regarding the City's legislative efforts.

- The Legislature introduced 1686 bills in the 2009-10 session, 978 in the Assembly and 708 in the Senate. IRD reviewed those bills and the City of Milwaukee registered on 158 (roughly 10%), including 94 Assembly bills and 64 Senate bills.
- Of all the bills that were introduced, 250 have been signed into law by the Governor, and another 55 have been enrolled and await action by the Governor. The City of Milwaukee supported 21 of these bills.
- Of the 106 items in the legislative package, 18 of the Acts that were signed into law or are awaiting action include items directly from the City of Milwaukee legislative agenda. Two others were items that the IRD team was authorized to pursue or support outside of the legislative package. (See attached)
- Additionally, another 10 items from the legislative package were introduced as bills but did
 not pass into law including booting, straw purchasing, property appraiser licensing. Another
 14 items were drafted as bills but never introduced including red light running, parking
 tickets as prima facie evidence and billboard valuation. 16 items from the package were
 addressed during the budget and another 7 items were resolved administratively or some
 action was initiated.
- IRD was authorized to oppose 25 bills that were introduced. None of these bills passed to become law. Some examples of the bills we opposed include:
 - Water privatization restriction
 - Quality Based Selection process for engineering and design contracts
 - CCAP access restrictions
- IRD was authorized to register in support on 79 bills. Many of these were initiated from the legislative package as discussed above. There were an additional 7 bills that the City supported through separate Judiciary and Legislation action and 3 of these bills became law. They were:
 - Requiring day care van alarms Act 19
 - > Felony for injury to law enforcement officer Act 251
 - Requires DOT to provide law enforcement with electronic access to photographs Act 167

City of Milwaukee Legislative Priorities Enacted during the 2009-10 Session

The Wisconsin State Legislature adjourned its 2009-2010 session as of April 22, 2010. The Intergovernmental Relations Division (IRD) team was authorized to seek legislation as guided by the City's Legislative Agenda and additional priorities passed by resolution during the session. IRD was successful in securing passage of the following legislation sought by the City.

Legislation that passed from the City's Legislative Agenda:

Wisconsin Act 2:

- Provides protections for tenants in foreclosure actions.
- Plaintiff in a foreclosure action must notify tenants of the details of such action. Allows tenant to withhold rent for last period of occupancy equal to security deposit.
- Landlord must notify any potential tenants in writing of any foreclosure action that has been taken on the property.
- No information can be placed on the Wisconsin Circuit Court Access concerning removal of a tenant from a residential property if due to foreclosure of the property.
- Establishes licensure requirement for mortgage loan originators.

Proposal from Legislative Agenda: Reduce the impact from the foreclosure crisis; and, Support better regulation of the Mortgage Broker Industry and high cost loans.

Wisconsin Act 8:

• Removes requirement that a person convicted of a drug violation will be subject to a mandatory driver's license suspension. The decision is left to the discretion of the court.

Proposal from Legislative Agenda: Support the Center for Driver's License Recovery efforts to repeal mandatory suspension following a criminal drug conviction.

Wisconsin Act 12:

- Prohibits smoking in certain specified "enclosed places".
- AB 720 modifies Act 12 with technical changes, including clarifying the definition of a solid wall.

Proposal from Legislative Agenda: Support a smoking ban in indoor public places only if applied statewide.

Wisconsin Act 18:

- Allows board of city service commissioners to certify any number of the top scoring candidates to fill a civil service vacancy. Previously the law specified that 3 candidates be certified (5 for management positions).
- Requires that all persons on the list with the same test score be included on the same certification

Proposal from Legislative Agenda: Allow City of Milwaukee, Board of City Service Commissioners to establish by rule for the number of test scores to be used in certifying candidates from eligible lists.

Wisconsin Act 28 (Budget Bill - specific items from Legislative Agenda)

- Allows city to extend a TIF for 1 year to improve housing stock 75% to benefit affordable housing.
- Authorized Schools of Public Health and Freshwater Science
- Decreased Aid reduction to MPS for Milwaukee Parental Choice Program costs and increased high poverty aid to MPS.
- Changed state law from secondary to primary enforcement of seat belt law.

Proposals from Legislative Agenda:

- Support extension of TID increments for funding an affordable housing trust fund
- Fund a School of Public Health at UW-Milwaukee
- Support incentives to grow water-based industry in Milwaukee. Including creation and location of a UW Milwaukee School of Fresh Water Sciences.
- Correct the School Choice Funding Flaws
- Support primary enforcement of seatbelt laws.

Wisconsin Act 47

- Changes from January 15 to September 30, the date when the debt amortization fund commission must make an annual report to the City of Milwaukee's Common Council. The information is typically not available until the middle of the year.
- Clarifies that the commission may use the fund to acquire city bonds, notes, and other securities. Previous statute did not specify city notes and other city securities.
- Specifies that as a means to cancel debt, the commission may use the fund to make interest
 and principal payments on general obligation bonds or notes, regardless of the maturity of
 the debt.

Proposal from Legislative Agenda: Update statutes related to the Public Debt Amortization Fund.

Wisconsin Act 50

- Requires manufacturers of specified electronic devices sold in the state to recycle a targeted amount of such devices.
- The target is based on the manufacturer's sales of such devices in the state.
- The mandate is enforced through restrictions on sales and assessment of fees. A manufacturer can earn credits for recycling more than the target.
- Also establishes a ban on land filling and incineration of certain electronic devices.

Proposal from Legislative Agenda: Support "e-waste" legislation mandating manufacturer responsibility for recycling of consumer electronics.

Wisconsin Act 102

 Makes court-ordered operating privilege revocation for a fourth offense OAR, OWS, or OWD permissive rather than mandatory.

Proposal from Legislative Agenda: Support the Center for Driver's License Recovery efforts regarding 4 critical policy measures regarding driving privileges, suspension, revocation

Wisconsin Act 103

• Allows a court that suspends or revokes a person's operating privilege to take possession of a person's operator's license, but the court is not required to do so

Proposal from Legislative Agenda: Support the Center for Driver's License Recovery efforts regarding 4 critical policy measures regarding driving privileges, suspension, revocation

Wisconsin Act 147

- For a city of the first class, removes the restriction from neighborhood improvement district assessments for properties with fewer than 8 residential units.
- Only those properties which are exempt from general property tax would continue to be restricted from such an assessment.

Proposal from Legislative Agenda: Allow for the collection of neighborhood improvement district (NID) special assessments from residential properties containing less than eight residential dwelling units.

Wisconsin Act 173

- Repeals the statute providing that counties and cities were strictly liable for injuries to persons or property caused by a mob or riot within their jurisdiction
- Authorizes a first class city, consistent with other municipalities, to use the bidder prequalification procedure for public contracts.

Proposal from Legislative Agenda: Repeal City Liability for failure to control mob action that causes damage & Propose repealing last sentence of §66.0901(2) which prevents first class cities from prequalifying bidders.

Wisconsin Act 188

- Creates requirements for mortgage brokers in dealing with residential mortgage loan applicants.
- Requires the broker to present loan options in objective unbiased manner, restricts the
 broker from benefitting from any undisclosed remunerations, either direct or indirect, and
 requires the broker to account to the borrower for any money or property received as the
 borrower's agent.

Proposal from Legislative Agenda: Reduce the impact from the foreclosure crisis; and, Support better regulation of the Mortgage Broker Industry and high cost loans.

Wisconsin Act 191

- Allows the board of a retirement system in a city of the first class to determine by rule the
 conditions under which a employee retirement account is presumed abandoned and to
 determine the manner in which such funds can be used to reduce employer funding
 obligations to the retirement system.
- Abandoned ERS funds no longer subject to the custody of the State.

Proposal from Legislative Agenda: Seek legislation to allow us to retain unclaimed funds in the Employes' Retirement System Trust, rather than pay them to the State.

Act 258

• Requires mental health check as part of DOJ background check for handgun purchases.

Proposal from Legislative Agenda: Reduce illegal guns and improve public safety.

Act 272

- Expands the entities to which a political subdivision may make energy efficiency loans to include commercial and industrial premises located in the political subdivision
- Also authorizes a political subdivision to make similar loans for water efficiency improvements.

Proposal from Legislative Agenda: Support legislation to authorize the ME2 program.

Senate Bill-383 (enrolled—ready for action by Governor)

- Rewrites the statutes pertaining to municipal court administration and procedure.
- Allows the municipal court to order the assignment of up to 25 percent of the defendant's income, including lottery winning, for the payment of the judgment and provides procedural safeguards.

Proposal from Legislative Agenda: Seek legislation that would allow for assignment of income to pay municipal court judgments.

Senate Bill 524 (enrolled - ready for action by Governor)

 Allows for subpoenas and warrants requiring providers of electronic communications to provide customer information or disclose contents of wire or electronic communications.

Proposal from Legislative Agenda: Revise search warrant statute to allow for electronic communication search warrants

Senate Bill 530(enrolled - ready for action by Governor)

- Limits payday loans to \$1,500 or 35% of monthly income, whichever is less.
- Auto title loans would be limited to half the value of a vehicle.
- Creates a Database to track payday loans and provide data currently unavailable about the volume and amount of loans being lent
- Limits rollovers to only 1. Rollovers account for around 90% of all payday lending profits.
- Strengthens auto title provisions.

Proposal from Legislative Agenda: Better regulate the pay day loan and small consumer loan industry

Legislation that passed from separate Council Resolutions:

Wisconsin Act 66

- Allows a local governmental unit to adopt a resolution that allows the environmental remediation tax increments generated from one ERTID (donor) to be donated to pay for environmental remediation in another ERTID (recipient).
- The joint review board is still required to approve the resolution.

Resolution directing IRD to: Seek legislation allowing for an ERTID to donate tax increment to another ERTID.

Wisconsin Act 207

- Currently, for the library board of a public library established in a first class city, seven members constitute a quorum.
- Under this Act, a majority of the seats on the board that are currently filled constitutes a quorum.
- It also removes the requirement that the representative from the County Board of Supervisors cannot reside in the city.

Resolution instructing IRD to: Seek legislation to change the library board quorum requirements to be either seven members or a majority of the filled seats and to remove the requirement that the County Executive appointment must live in the county, but not live in the City.




