

Resolution supporting passage of the federal Visa Waiver Program Enhanced Security and Reform Act.

Analysis

This resolution expresses the Common Council's support for the federal Visa Waiver Program Enhanced Security and Reform Act (H.R. 3855 and S. 2046), legislation currently pending in the U.S. House of Representatives and Senate. This legislation modifies the requirements of the current Visa Waiver Program by removing barriers for citizens of certain American allies, such as Poland, to travel to the United States without a visa.

Body

Whereas, On January 31, 2012, the Visa Waiver Program Enhanced Security and Reform Act was introduced in the U.S. House of Representatives and Senate (H.R. 3855 and S. 2046, respectively); and

Whereas, Currently, as part of the Visa Waiver Program, citizens of 36 foreign countries can travel to the United States for up to 90 days without a visa; and

Whereas, Current law uses the visa refusal rate as one of the criteria for designation in the Visa Waiver Program, and that number has kept certain American allies from participation in the program; and

Whereas, The Visa Waiver Program Enhanced Security and Reform Act amends the Immigration and Nationality Act regarding the Visa Waiver Program to:

- 1. Authorize the Secretary of Homeland Security to designate any country as a program country.
- 2. Adjust the visa refusal rate criteria, including the addition of a 3% maximum overstay rate.
- 3. Revise probationary and termination provisions.

Whereas, H.R. 3855 and S. 2046 modify the requirements of the Visa Waiver Program by removing barriers for citizens of certain American allies, such as Poland, to travel to the United States without a visa; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, By the Common Council of the City of Milwaukee, that the Common Council supports H.R. 3855 and S. 2046, and urges both houses of Congress to pass the Visa Waiver Program Enhanced Security and Reform Act; and, be it

Further Resolved, That the City Clerk shall send a copy of this resolution to each member of Wisconsin's Congressional delegation.

Time to Admit Poland into the Visa Waiver Program

Senator Mark Kirk (R-IL) and Congressman Mike Quigley (R-IL) returned from a four-day trip to Poland [1] this week. The bipartisan pair made the journey to discuss an important topic in U.S.-Polish relations: admitting Poland into the Visa Waiver Program.

Under the Visa Waiver Program [2], visitors from friendly member nations are able to travel to the U.S. for up to 90 days without first obtaining a visa. To ensure that dangerous individuals do not enter the United States through the program, a visitor must first submit information through the program's online portal, the Electronic System for Travel Authorization (ESTA). Once vetted and cleared, a traveler is then pre-approved for visa-free travel for up to two years.

Since its inception in 1986, the Visa Waiver Program (VWP) has reduced the workload on U.S. consulate offices while encouraging travel to and tourism in the United States. The program also offers tremendous benefits [3] in terms of economics, public diplomacy, and national security. In 2008 alone, nearly 17 million visitors entered the United States, spending more than \$100 billion in U.S. restaurants, hotels, and shops. These visitors not only infuse muchneeded money into the U.S. economy, but they also carry home with them their experiences and perceptions of American culture, helping to improve America's image throughout the world. Likewise, security measures added since the program's inception have made it an important counterterrorism tool.

In 2010, more than 152,000 [4] non-immigrant visitors entered the United States from Poland. Yet despite that country's longstanding interest in joining the Visa Waiver Program, these visitors were made to apply for visas before coming to the United States. Given the extensive benefits of the VWP and the long record of U.S.-Polish cooperation, Poland's exclusion from the program doesn't make sense.

Unfortunately, neither does the measure that is holding back Poland's admittance. In 2007, Congress passed legislation granting the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) the ability to consider the admittance of nations with visa refusal rates between 3 percent and 10 percent that otherwise met the requirements of the program. The conditions of this authority, however, centered on the ability of DHS to meet a mandate of biometrically tracking the exits of all foreign visitors from U.S. airports by July 1, 2009. Despite the fact that biometric air exit has little to do with the VWP (only roughly 1 percent of VWP entrants are believed to overstay) and adds little in terms of national security, when DHS failed to meet the mandate, its ability to waive the 3 percent visa refusal rate expired.

Poland has signed all of the necessary security and travel agreements needed to gain admittance into the program. The only thing holding it back now is its 9.8 percent visa refusal rate [5]. Instead of holding VWP expansion hostage to ridiculous mandates, Congress should decouple the biometric exit mandate from the program. Likewise, Congress and the **Administration should move to use** visa overstay rates, rather than visa refusal rates, ^[6] **as a** metric for admittance into the program. With Poland's overstay rate at around 2 percent in 2010 (incredibly low compared to the total visa overstay rate of approximately 40 percent), this change would advance the country's admittance and would serve as a better overall metric for the program.

Representatives Kirk and Quigley's visit to Poland should serve as a reminder to the rest of Congress that it is well past time to do better for our ally and admit Poland into the VWP.

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
Visa Waiver Program

The Visa Waiver Program (VWP) is a program of the United States Government which allows citizens of specific countries to travel to the United States for tourism or business for up to 90 days without having to obtain a visa. The program applies to the 50 U.S. states as well as the U.S. territories of Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands in the Caribbean, with limited application to other U.S. territories. Most of the countries selected by the U.S. government to be in the program are high-income economies with a very high Human Development Index and are regarded as developed countries.

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
Eligible countries

To be eligible for a visa waiver under the VWP, the traveler seeking admission to the United States must be a citizen of a country that has been designated by the United States Secretary of Homeland Security, in consultation with the Secretary of State, as a "program country". Permanent residents of designated countries who are not also citizens of a designated country do not qualify for a visa waiver. The criteria for designation as program countries are specified in Section 217 (c) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (Title 8 U.S.C. §1187). The criteria stress passport security and a very low nonimmigrant visa refusal rate: not more than 3% as specified in Section 217 (c)(2)(A) of the Immigration and Nationality Act, as well as ongoing compliance with the immigration law of the United States.

Eligibility for the visa waiver may be withdrawn at any time. Usually this may happen if the United States feels that citizens of a certain country are more likely than before to violate their VWP restrictions, such as working without a permit or overstaying their allowed period of stay in the United States. Accordingly, Argentina's participation in the VWP was terminated in 2002 in light of the financial crisis taking place in that country and its potential effect on mass emigration and unlawful overstay of its citizens in the United States by way of the VWP. Uruguay's participation in the program was revoked in 2003 for similar reasons. While a country's political and economic standing doesn't directly determine its eligibility, it is widely believed that citizens of politically stable and economically developed nations don't have much incentive to illegally seek employment and violate their visa while in the U.S., risks that the consul seriously considers in approving or denying a visa.

Citizens of 36 countries are eligible for visa-free entry into the United States under the VWP: State Department Visa Waiver Country List^[3] and DHS country list.^[4]

Slovenia was the only nation of the ten newly admitted member states that joined the European Union in 2004 that became a member of the program before it was extended in 2008.

Nominated countries

Countries nominated for status in the Visa Waiver Program are in between "road map" status and eligibility to participate. Nomination kicks off a detailed evaluation by the United States Department of Homeland Security of the nominated country's homeland security and immigration practices. There is no established timeline for how long a country may remain on the nominated list before either being approved or rejected from the program. [6]

Recent events of the program

After the expansion of the European Union in 2004, both the newly admitted countries and EU agencies began intensive lobbying efforts to include those new countries in the VWP. The U.S. Government initially responded to those efforts by developing bilateral strategies with 19 candidate countries known as the Visa Waiver Roadmap process. [11][12] The U.S. Government began to accept the possibility of departing from the original country designation criteria - which had been contained within immigration law *per se* - and to expand them by adding political criteria, with the latter being able to override the former. This development began first with Bill S.2844^[13] which explicitly named Poland as the only country to be added to the VWP, and continued as an amendment to the Comprehensive Immigration Reform Act of 2006 (S.2611), whose Sec. 413, Visa Waiver Program Expansion, [14] defined broader criteria that would apply to any EU country that provided "material support" to the multinational forces in Iraq and Afghanistan. However, the definition of that "material support" would be met again only by Poland and Romania, a fact that was not favorably received by the other EU candidate countries. Ironically, Poland remains the only Central European country that is not a participating nation in the VWP as of 2010 and USA remain the last non-Arab developed country in the World to require short-stay visas from Polish citizens.

A June 2007 Hudson Institute Panel stressed the urgency of the inclusion of Central Europe in the VWP: "An inexplicable policy that is causing inestimable damage to the United States with its new Central and Eastern European NATO allies is the region's exclusion from the visa waiver program. As Helle Dale wrote in the spring issue of European Affairs: "Meanwhile the problem is fueling anti-U.S. antagonisms and a perception of capricious discrimination by U.S. bureaucrats --- and damping the

visits to the U.S. of people from countries with whom Washington would like to improve commercial and intellectual ties. Meanwhile horror stories abound from friends and diplomats from Central and Eastern Europe about the problems besetting foreigners seeking to visit the United States. In fact bringing up the subject of visas with any resident of those countries is like waving a red flag before a bull." Visa waiver must be satisfactorily addressed and resolved at long last." [15]

During his visit to Estonia in November 2006, President Bush announced his intention "to work with our Congress and our international partners to modify our visa waiver program". In 2006, the Secure Travel and Counterterrorism Partnership Bill was introduced in the Senate but no action was taken and that bill, as well as a similar one introduced in the House the following year, died after two years of inactivity. [16] The bill would have directed the Secretary of Homeland Security to establish a pilot program to expand the visa waiver program for up to five new countries that are cooperating with the United States on security and counterterrorism matters. [citation needed] The bill would have changed the nonimmigrant visa refusal rate threshold - from 3% - to 10%, thus making (as of 2010) 28 countries^[17] qualify for inclusion in the visa-waiver program. Argentina, Bahamas, Bahrain, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Brazil, Chile, Croatia, Cyprus, Hong Kong (HKSAR passport and British National (Overseas) passport), Israel, Kazakhstan, Kuwait, Malaysia, Mauritius, Mozambique, Oman, Papua New Guinea, Paraguay, Poland, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Sevchelles, South Africa, Swaziland, Taiwan, Turkey, United Arab Emirates and Uruguay. Note that Cyprus, Malta, Timor Leste, and Vatican City, had already (in 2006) (http://travel.state.gov/pdf/FY06.pdf) refusal rates less than the original 3%, but were not included in the VWP countries (whereas a year later, some additional countries had this original low level: Cyprus and Taiwan). However, for continued participation, DHS re-evaluates participating countries every two years, as required by Congress. Through this process, two countries, Argentina and Uruguay, now are no longer eligible to participate. Current members will have to fulfill any new requirements to continue their eligibility for membership in the program. The European Union is currently planning to negotiate for participation of all of its members in the Visa Waiver Program. [18]

In October 2008, President Bush announced that the Czech Republic, Estonia, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Slovakia and South Korea would be added to the program on November 17. [19] "It is a removal of the last relic of Communism and the Cold War", said Czech Prime Minister Mirek Topolánek. [20]

On December 22, 2008, in a joint press conference at Auberge de Castille, Maltese Prime Minister Lawrence Gonzi and U.S. Ambassador Molly Bordonaro announced that Malta would join the program with effect from 30 December 2008. [21]

In January 2009 the first Assistant Secretary (acting as Under Secretary-equivalent) for Policy at the United States Department of Homeland Security Stewart Baker announced that Croatia is expected to join the Visa Waiver program by 2011. [22]

On June 17, 2008, Bulgarian Foreign Minister Ivailo Kalfin and U.S. Homeland Security Secretary Michael Chertoff signed an interim agreement under the Visa Waiver Program, the press service of the Bulgarian Foreign Ministry said in a statement. [23]

Greek citizens became eligible to travel to the U.S. without a visa on April 5, 2010. [24][25]

President Obama promised that Poland would be added to the program, in a meeting with Polish President Bronislaw Komorowski in December 2010; however no date has been set for when Poland will be added [26]

The only European microstate that is not a member of the program is the Vatican City. Its candidacy in the program is still a mystery, with no knowledge of whether it will or will not seek membership in the program.

History

Congress passed legislation in 1986 to create the Visa Waiver Program with the aim of facilitating tourism and short-term business visits to the United States, and allowing the United States Department of State to focus consular resources on addressing higher risks. The United Kingdom became the first country to participate in the Visa Waiver Program in July 1988, followed by Japan on 16 December 1988. [27] In October 1989, France, Italy, the Netherlands, Sweden, Switzerland, and West Germany were added to the VWP.

In 1991, more European countries joined the Program - Andorra, Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, Monaco, Norway, San Marino and Spain - as well as New Zealand (the first country from Oceania). In 1993, Brunei became the second Asian country to be admitted to the Program.^[28]

On 1 April 1995, Ireland was added to the VWP. In 1996, Argentina (the first Latin American country) and Australia joined, although Argentina was later removed in 2002. On 30 September 1997, Slovenia was added. On 9 August 1999, Portugal, Singapore and Uruguay joined the program, although Uruguay was subsequently removed in 2003. [29]

Following the September 11 terrorist attacks, the George W. Bush Administration decided to tighten entry requirements into the United States, as a result of which legislation was passed requiring foreign visitors entering under the Visa Waiver Program to present a machine readable passport upon arrival starting from 1 October 2003. However, as a number of VWP still issued non-machine readable passports (for example, more than a third of French and Spanish passport holders held a non-machine readable version), the implementation of the new rule was postponed to 26 October 2004, with the exception of Belgian citizens, as there were concerns about the security and integrity of Belgian passports. [30]

The George W. Bush Administration originally planned to require all visitors to the US under the Visa Waiver Program to hold a biometric passport starting from 26 October 2004 if their passport is issued on or after that date. However, after the requirement to have a machine readable passport was postponed to 26 October 2004, the biometric passport requirement subsequently had its implementation date moved to 26 October 2005, only to be further postponed by another year to 26 October 2006 at the request of the European Union, which raised concerns about the number of participating countries which would have been able to make the deadline. [31]

Eventually, starting from 26 October 2006, travellers entering the US under the Visa Waiver Program have been required to present a biometric passport if their passport was issued on or after that date. When the new rule came into force on that day, three countries (Andorra, Brunei and Liechtenstein) had not yet started issuing biometric passports.^[32]

In November 2006, the George W. Bush Administration announced that plans for an "Electronic Travel Authorization" program (officially named "Electronic System for Travel Authorization") would be developed so that VWP travelers can give advance information on their travels to the United States. In return, they will be given authorization electronically to travel to the United States, although it does not guarantee admission to the United States. This program will be modeled on the Electronic Travel Authority scheme that has been used in Australia for many years.^[33]

While all participating nations must provide reciprocal visa-free travel for U.S. citizens (usually ninety days for tourism or business purposes), Australia is the only nation that requires U.S. citizens^[34] to apply for an Electronic Travel Authority (ETA), which in fact is a visa that is stored electronically in a computer system operated by the Australian Department of Immigration and Citizenship (DIAC). The ETA has replaced visa-free travel to Australia, and the only nation accorded visa-free travel rights to Australia is New Zealand under the auspices of the Trans-Tasman Travel Arrangement (rather than not requiring a visa, NZ citizens are accorded one automatically upon arrival). A passport holder must apply for and purchase an ETA through an authorized travel agency, airline, or via the official DIMA website^[35] before departing for Australia. However, as the ETA process is relatively free of formality, the United States recognizes it as the equivalent of visa-free travel. Citizens of the European Union and other European nations must apply for an eVisitor electronic travel authorization for travel to Australia, which is similar to the ETA program, but free. Australian government policy in this respect is similar to U.S. policy, which similarly requires Visa Waiver Program participants to apply for an ESTA.

Guam and Northern Mariana Islands Visa Waiver Program

In the neighboring U.S. territories of Guam and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI), both located in the western Pacific Ocean, the U.S. federal government has implemented a specific Guam-Northern Mariana Islands Visa Waiver Program. As insular areas of the United States, entry requirements for these territories are the same as any other U.S. destination. However, under this program, first enacted in October 1988 and periodically amended, nationals from several additional countries^[37] in Asia and the Pacific islands are permitted to enter the Northern Marianas and Guam as tourists without a visa for up to 45 days (as of November 28, 2009). [38] Travel is not permitted onwards to the mainland United States, [37] and because of special visa categories for the CNMI foreign workers, traveling between Guam and the CNMI still requires a full immigration inspection.

In addition to citizens from the 36 nations designated for the federal VWP, citizens of the following countries in possession of a machine readable passport and with completed Form I-736 (Guam-CNMI Visa Waiver Information form) and Form I-94 (Arrival-Departure Record) may enter Guam or the CNMI visa-free under the specific waiver program applying to the two U.S. territories:

- Hong Kong (holders of Hong Kong Special Administrative Region passports, in conjunction with a Hong Kong permanent identity card)
- Malaysia
- Nauru
- Papua New Guinea
- Taiwan, in conjunction with a ROC National Identification Card, only on non-stop flights from Taiwan^[39]
- ➡ Holders of British National (Overseas) passports, in conjunction with a Hong Kong permanent identity card

Despite not being included in the new Guam-CNMI visa waiver program, citizens of the following countries can still visit the Northern Mariana Islands in a parole arrangement for up to 45 days.^[40]

- People's Republic of China
- Russia

The Northern Mariana Islands had previously been a separate jurisdiction from the United States in terms of immigration control. Under a federalization law passed by the U.S. Congress in 2008, the Northern Marianas' immigration functions were taken over by United States Department of Homeland Security agencies on November 28, 2009. The present Guam-Northern Mariana Islands Visa Waiver Program took effect at that time, replacing previous Northern Marianas' legislation governing entry to the islands and also replacing a previous Guam-specific Visa Waiver Program. That program had included the aforementioned countries as well as Indonesia, Samoa, Vanuatu, and the Soloman Islands, though these countries were removed from the list of eligible nations for the new program. [38][41]

In the past, the government of the Northern Mariana Islands had issued Visitor Entry Permits (VEP) instead of visas. Citizens of all countries in the federal visa waiver program were exempt from the VEP requirement, as were citizens of Taiwan and holders of Hong Kong Special Administrative Region passports and British National (Overseas) passports. [42][43][44] Under the islands' previous immigration policy, citizens of the following countries or jurisdictions were prohibited from entering the CNMI: Afghanistan, Algeria, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Cuba, Egypt, Eritrea, Fujian Province of China, Indonesia, Iran, Iraq, Jordan, Kuwait, Lebanon, Libya, Morocco, Myanmar, North Korea, Oman, Pakistan, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Somalia, Sri Lanka, Sudan, Syria, Tunisia, United Arab Emirates and Yemen. [45]

Entry into American Samoa

The U.S. territory of American Samoa, located in the southwestern Pacific Ocean, remains outside the standard immigration jurisdiction of the U.S. federal government. The territory's government regulates entry into the territory, permitting tourists to visit for up to 30 days, with an option to extend their stay for an additional 30 days, with approval from the territory's Attorney General. All visitors from outside the islands, including United States citizens, are required to possess a valid passport and proof of onward travel; U.S. citizens may substitute a passport with an authentic birth certificate verifying their nationality. Persons wishing to stay or work in the islands must receive approval from the Office of the Attorney General.

Currently, the territory's government allows visa-free tourist entry to U.S. citizens and citizens of countries in the federal Visa Waiver Program as well as citizens of Canada and the Pacific island nations of Palau, the Marshall Islands, and the Federated States of Micronesia. Upon arrival, nationals of other countries are issued entry permits which are valid only for visiting American Samoa. [46]

Requirements for the visa waiver program

The requirements for the visa waiver program are as follows:

Machine readable and biometric passports

All travelers must have individual passports. It is not acceptable (for the visa waiver scheme) for children to be included on a parent's passport.

Passport requirements (for citizens of VWP pre-2008 members only) depend on the date the passport was issued:

■ Passports issued before 26 October 2005 must be machine readable.

- Passports issued between 26 October 2005 and 25 October 2006 must be machine readable and contain a digitized photograph.
- Passports issued on or after 26 October 2006 must be biometric—that is, an 'e-passport,' containing an electronic chip with biographic and biometric information. An e-passport is mandatory for Visa Waiver travel on a passport from one of the most recently added VWP countries, to wit: Czech Republic, Estonia, Greece, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Malta, Slovak Republic, and South Korea. [47]

Electronic System for Travel Authorization (ESTA)

All incoming passengers who intend to take advantage of the Visa Waiver Program are required to complete the I-94W form online before departure to the United States, but preferably at least 72 hours (3 days) in advance. This new requirement was announced on June 3, 2008 and is intended to bolster U.S. security by pre-screening participating VWP passengers against terrorist and/or no-fly lists and databases. [48] The electronic authorization, which is valid for a two-year period, [49] mirrors Australia's Electronic Travel Authority system. The authorization is mandatory for participating VWP citizens before boarding flights destined to the United States, but as with formal visas this does not guarantee admission into the United States since final admission eligibility is determined at U.S. ports of entry by CBP officers.

According to the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's ESTA fact sheet:

An approved ESTA travel authorization is: • valid for up to two years or until the traveler's passport expires, whichever comes first:

- · valid for multiple entries into the U.S.; and
- not a guarantee of admissibility to the United States at a port of entry. ESTA approval only authorizes a traveler to board a carrier for travel to the U.S. under the VWP. In all cases, CBP officers make admissibility determinations at our ports of entry. (For additional information, please visit "Know Before You Go" at www.cbp.gov/travel.) Currently all travelers from VWP countries are required to obtain an ESTA approval prior to boarding a carrier to travel by air or sea to the United States under the VWP. [50]

Passport validity

The standard requirement for passport validity is 6 months beyond the expected date of departure from the United States. However, the US has signed agreements with a number of countries to waive this requirement. [51]

Return or onward ticket

If entering the United States by air or sea, additional requirements apply. The traveler must:

- Be traveling on a participating commercial carrier and;
- Be holding a valid return or onward ticket. Where the ticket terminates in Canada, Mexico, Bermuda or an island in the Caribbean, the traveler must be a legal resident of that country or territory.

Other eligibility requirements

Applicants for admission under the visa waiver program:

- Must have complied with the conditions of all previous admissions to the United States.;
- Must never have been convicted of, or arrested for, an offense or crime involving moral turpitude (there is an exemption in some cases for a single offence committed before age 18 and the crime was committed (and the alien released from any confinement to a prison or correctional institution imposed for the crime) more than five years before the date of application for a visa, and also for a single instance if the maximum possible sentence in the U.S. is one year or less in jail, and less than six months was served. However these exceptions cannot be applied by the individual as the question on ESTA is specific) or a "controlled substance," or (two or more) crimes with a maximum aggregate sentence of five years' imprisonment or more, no matter how long ago. National regulations which normally expunge criminal records after a certain length of time (e.g. The Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974 in the UK) do not apply.
- Must not be otherwise inadmissible to the United States, such as on health or national security grounds;
- Must be intending to visit the United States for a purpose of transit, tourism, or a short term business visit. Journalists and their accompanying staff cannot use the visa waiver scheme to file and work on news reports for their news organisations from the United States and must instead apply for an I visa.

 Starting from 8 September 2010, a fee of USD \$14 is collected. This is payable by credit/debit cards online only, in advance of travel.

Those who do not meet the requirements for the visa-waiver scheme must obtain a U.S. tourist visa from an American embassy or consulate.

Having been arrested or convicted does not in itself make a person ineligible to use the visa waiver scheme. You are only ineligible if you do not meet the requirements of the scheme. However, some U.S. embassies advise such persons to apply for a tourist visa even though there is no legal obligation for the individual to do so. There is no right of appeal if an immigration officer decides to refuse entry, unless you hold a visa when an appeal can be made to an immigration judge.

Those previously refused entry to the United States are not automatically ineligible for the visa waiver program, but unless the reason for refusal is addressed, it is likely to reoccur. Hence again, many embassies advise such persons to apply for a tourist visa.

Visa Waiver Program restrictions

A person entering the United States under the VWP cannot request an extension of the original allowed period of stay in the U.S. (this practice is allowed to those holding regular visas). However, VWP visitors may seek to adjust status on the basis of either (1) marriage to a US citizen or (2) an application for asylum. [52] If one seeks to enter the U.S. under the VWP and is denied at a port of entry, no path of appealing the denial of entry is allowed.

Travelers can leave to contiguous countries (Canada, Mexico and the Caribbean), but will not be granted another 90 days after reentry in the United States. [53]

There are restrictions on the type of employment-related activities allowed. Meetings and conferences in relation to the alien's profession/line of business/employer in their home country, are generally acceptable, but most forms of "gainful employment" are not. There are however poorly-classifiable exceptions such as persons performing professional services in the US for a non US employer, and persons installing, servicing and repairing commercial or industrial equipment or machinery pursuant to a contract of sale. [54] Performers (such as actors and musicians) who plan on performing live or taping scenes for productions back home, as well as athletes participating in an athletic event are likewise not allowed to use the VWP for their respective engagements and are instead required to have an O or P visa prior to arrival. Foreign media representatives and journalists on assignment are required to have a nonimmigrant media (I) visa. [55]

Applicant should display social and economic ties which bind them to their country of origin or may be refused entry. [56]

Citizens of Canada

Canadian citizens do not require a non-immigrant visa when entering the United States, except those Canadians that fall under nonimmigrant visa categories E, K, S, or V,^{[57][58]} but under different legislation from the Visa Waiver program.^[59] This does not preclude them from meeting the requirements of the appropriate status they wish to enter in, for example, while a Canadian does not require a F-1 visa to study in the U.S., they are still required to be in F-1 status, not requiring a visa simply allows a Canadian to obtain the status at the Port of Entry.^[60]

Citizens of Canada who enter as visitors are exempted from being fingerprinted or photographed under US-VISIT and do not require a machine readable passport. Canadian visitors also are generally not issued an I-94, and US Customs and Border Protection decide whether to allow entry based on non-immigrant intent. There is no fixed maximum amount of stay, although CBP usually consider six months to be the maximum permitted per calendar year, except under unusual circumstances (such as medical treatment).

Before 23 January 2007, citizens of Canada, (provided they held valid photo identification) were able to enter the United States with only a birth certificate as proof of citizenship and were not required to show a passport. Citizens of other parts of North America, such as Mexico or Bermuda have always been subject to holding a valid Visa stamp or a border crossing card along with their passports. On 23 January 2007, Canadian and U.S. citizens were required to have passports when entering the U.S. by air only.

As of 1 June 2009, Canadian and U.S. citizens are required to present either a valid passport, a NEXUS card, a Free and Secure Trade card (FAST) or an enhanced driver's licence/enhanced identification card when entering the United States by land or water. Canadians entering the U.S. by air are still required to present a valid passport or NEXUS card. A NEXUS card can only be used at designated U.S. and Canadian airports with NEXUS card kiosks. Children under 16, or under 19 while traveling with a school group need to only present a birth certificate or other similar proof of citizenship when entering the U.S. from Canada by land or water. [61][62]

British Overseas Territories Citizens of Bermuda

British Overseas Territories citizens by virtue of their connection to Bermuda can enter the United States visa-free provided they are bona-fide visitors - no I-94 is required. [63] To qualify, they must not have had a criminal conviction or ineligibility, violated U.S. immigration laws in the past and must not be arriving the United States from outside the Western Hemisphere. In addition, they must present a Bermudian passport which fulfils the following criteria:

- The front cover has printed on it "Government of Bermuda"
- The holder's nationality must be stated as either "British Overseas Territory Citizen" or "British Dependant Territories Citizen"
- The passport must contain one of the following endorsement stamps: "Holder is registered as a Bermudian", "Holder Possesses Bermudian Status" or "Holder is deemed to possess Bermudian status"

Citizens of the Bahamas

Bahamian citizens do not require a visa to enter the United States if they apply for entry at one of the Preclearance Facilities located in Nassau or Freeport International Airports. Bahamian citizens must not have had a criminal conviction or ineligibility, violated U.S. immigration laws in the past and must be in possession of valid, unexpired passport or a Bahamian Travel Document indicating that they have Bahamian citizenship. In addition to a passport, all applicants 14 years of age or older must present a police certificate issued by the Royal Bahamas Police Force within the past six months. All Bahamians applying for admission at a port-of-entry other than the Preclearance Facilities located in Nassau or Freeport International Airports are required to be in possession of a valid visa to enter the United States. [64]

British Overseas Territories Citizens of the Cayman Islands

Whilst residents of the Cayman Islands, as British Overseas Territories Citizens, are eligible automatically to register as a full British citizen under Section 4(A) of the British Overseas Territories Act 2002, thereby able additionally to enter the United States under the Visa Waiver Program, they can alternatively enter visa-free using their Cayman Islands passports. To qualify under the latter method, their Cayman Islands passports must confirm their British Overseas Territories citizenship and be endorsed by the Cayman Islands Passport and Corporate Services Office with a Cayman-U.S. visa waiver, issued at a cost of \$15–25 and valid for one entry. [65][66] They must travel directly between the Cayman Islands and the United States and their Cayman Islands passport must also have a validity of at least six months beyond their intended departure date from the United States. [67] If Cayman Islanders elect to enter the U.S. using the Cayman-U.S. visa waiver, they are not required to apply for an ESTA online, since they are not entering under the VWP.

Citizens of the Federated States of Micronesia, Marshall Islands and Palau

Under the Compact of Free Association, citizens of the Federated States of Micronesia, [68] the Republic of the Marshall Islands, and the Republic of Palau^[70] (except for adopted children) may enter, reside, study, and work indefinitely in the United States without visas. These three sovereign nations hold the distinction of being the only countries in the world whose citizens do not require visas or other required documents (except a valid passport) for permanent residence, employment, educational pursuits, or for general visits in/to the United States. Time spent in the United States does not count towards permanent residency status, and those wishing to emigrate to the United States must obtain an immigrant visa prior to arriving to the country.

British Overseas Territories Citizens of the Turks and Caicos Islands

British Overseas Territories Citizens by virtue of their connection to the Turks and Caicos Islands can enter the United States visa-free for short business and pleasure. To qualify, they must not have had a criminal conviction or ineligibility, not violated U.S. immigration laws in the past and must arrive in the United States on a direct flight from the territory. In addition, they must present a Turks and Caicos Islands passport which states that they are a British Overseas Territory Citizen and have the right to abode in the Turks and Caicos Islands. In addition to a valid, unexpired passport, all travellers 14 years of age or older must present a police certificate issued by the Royal Turks and Caicos Islands Police Force within the past six months. All British Overseas Territories Citizens of the Turks and Caicos Islands who apply for admission at a port-of-entry that does not have direct air service to/from the territory, are required to be in possession of a valid visa to enter the United States.

I urge your support of Senate Bill 497 and House Resolution 959 entitled "The Secure Travel and Counterterrorism Partnership Act of 2011."

For too long the United States has treated individuals and families in Poland as second class citizens requiring them to pay hefty fees to apply for visas to visit our country, while Europeans from other countries travel here without visas.

Currently, citizens from 36 foreign countries can travel to the U.S. for up to 90 days without a visa. Poland has been excluded because Congress changed the Visa Waiver Program rules for countries that have more than 3% of their citizens denied visas. However, fewer than 3% of Poles who visit the U.S. stay longer than the 90 days allowed on their visas. S.B. 497 and H.R. 959 are needed to allow countries with an overstay rate of less than 3% to be included in the Visa Waiver Program.



We have received your claim in the amount of \$517.62, relating to alleged damage to your vehicle when it collided with a pothole at North 91st Street and West Calumet Road.

Our investigation reveals that the Infrastructure Services Division (ISD) reviewed their records relative to this incident. They found they had no prior notice of this hazard along the roadway prior to June 15, 2011. They also checked the records relative to your allegation regarding the barricade that was near this loss location. They found the barricades were left there for another DPW operation that was set to begin on June 16, 2011.

The Milwaukee Water Works (MWW) also reviewed their records. They found they had completed a branch repair on April 7, 2011 at 7622 North 91st Street. Once the repair was completed, the excavation crew completed a temporary pavement repair in preparation of permanent repairs at a later date. The MWW and ISD received no complaints other than this claim, regarding this situation. The departments also noted this is a heavily traveled roadway. The City department followed their standard procedures in this matter. As such, we are denying your claim.

We have received your claim in the amount of \$525.89, relating to damages done by the Milwaukee Police Department (MPD) on October 26, 2011 at 1032-34 South 19th Street.

Our investigation reveals that the MPD executed a lawful search warrant which necessitated the use of forced entry. The use of force is authorized by Wis. Stat. § 968.14. The MPD served the warrant at this location related to alleged drug activity. The decision was made by the onsite supervisor to enter the target location because it was felt the side door was a common entryway and the search warrant team did not want any potential individuals in the unit to escape. Since the use of force was authorized by state statutes and the MPD was acting within the sphere of responsibility, we are denying your claim.

If you wish to appeal this decision, you may do so by sending a letter within 21 days of the receipt of this letter to the Milwaukee City Clerk, 200 East Wells Street, Room 205, Milwaukee, Wisconsin 53202, requesting a hearing.

This letter is for the purpose of filing a claim against the City of Milwaukee in accordance with the instructions sent to me for filing a claim. On October 26, 2011 at 8:45 a.m., the Milwaukee Police Department executed a search warrant at 1032 S. 19th Street, Milwaukee, WI which is a duplex I own. During the process, the door for the upper apartment (1032 S. 19th) was kicked in, as well as the side door for the lower unit which address is 1034 S. 19th. When I spoke to Officer Metz, who was one of the officers that carried out the search, he explained to me that the 1034 door was kicked in by mistake and that they thought it was a common door for both units, which it is not. The tenant of the 1034 address was home at the time and told us that if the police would have given him a few seconds to open the door they wouldn't have had to kick it in, destroying both the door and frame. The door frame for the 1032 address was also damaged but did not require a full replacement, only repair. The officer also explained that nothing illegal was found at the address stated on the warrant. He told me it appeared to have been a mistake and that the suspect they were looking for did not appear to live at the property. We have no one on the lease that describes the person they were looking for. I am very surprised at the lack of evidence needed to carry out a search warrant and kick in citizen's doors. There was no evidence of drug activity or the person they were looking for living at this location. The elderly tenants including an 80 year old man were all put in handcuffs as they searched the premises. My tenants are VERY upset. Also, had they looked at the clearly marked 1034 address, they should not have concluded that the side door was a common door. The door at the 1034 address needed to be replaced and we had it replaced with a similar door which was a 6-panel steel door. I am requesting \$525.89 for replacing the door, installation of the door, and repair of the frame. The receipt and pictures are enclosed. My address and contact information is listed below.



I am writing this letter in response to the decision that was made regarding the damage to my vehicle that was caused when my car was towed to the city tow lot.

My can was towed on November 9, 2011. That same day I had a workshop in Manhattan, New York. My plane departed from Milwaukee Mitchell International airport at 11:30 on 11-9-2011 my return date was 11-14-2011. I retrieved the vehicle around 9:30am the morning of 11-9-2011 and then had to rush to make my 11:30 flight. I got back in town on November 14, 2011 at around 8:00 am. The next day 11-15-2011 I went to the city lot and filed a claim for the damage caused to my car by the tow. A picture was taken of the damage. The reason for the delay in filing the initial claim was that I went to a workshop conference in New York City from 11-9-2011 to 11-14-2011.

According to your letter, the forms completed prior to the tow claim that there were minor scratches and dents to the car. This is far from the truth. My vehicle has been kept and maintained in great shape. In fact there were no dents to the car and there still are not dents to the car. The minor scratches to the car are on the driver door and are hardly visible. The scratches that I reported that were caused by the tow truck are not minor they are white deep scratches to the driver side bumper area that in all honesty were never there before the car was towed.

If the intake video does not indicate damage to the front side bumper and corner area then with all due respect it needs to be viewed again because there was and still is damage that was a direct result of the tow action. Even the two body shops that the car was looked at could tell by the way the car was scratched and the area it happened, that this type of damage was not random scratches but major scratches when someone is trying to tow a vehicle and being very careless in the process.

In conclusion, I am asking for justice to prevail and the right decision be made. I feel as though I have been victimized and I have not received a fair decision. Why should I have to pay for damages that were caused by the tow truck in the amount of \$473.51 Although the City has denied the claim, the facts still stand, the tow truck that towed my car on the morning of November 9, 2011 caused major scratches and damage to my vehicle(never existed before the tow.)

Please remind those who work for the towing lots to be more careful to people's cars. There job is to tow cars not recklessly damage vehicles. The cost of their damage is ten times higher then the cost of the tickets I owed that have since been paid off.

We have received your claim in the amount of \$473.51, relating to damage to the front driver side bumper and corner area of your vehicle allegedly sustained when it was towed to the City of Milwaukee Tow Lot.

Our investigation reveals that your vehicle was towed on November 9, 2011 for being Illegally Parked/Unpaid Citations. The form completed prior to the tow indicates general minor scratches and dents to the vehicle. The forms completed at the time of the arrival/departure from the tow lot and the intake video does not indicate damage to the front driver side bumper and corner area. The vehicle was released, without incident, to you on that day. The exit form does not indicate the alleged damage. You returned on November 15, 2011 and filed a complaint. As such, the City cannot accept liability. Therefore, we are denying your claim.



Subject: Licensing and Regulation of Tobacco Retail Activities

The following summary of applicable state laws and related legal opinions provided by the Office of the City Attorney has been prepared at your request to assist discussion of Communication File Number 120216 entitled, "Communication relating to state and municipal licensing and regulation of retail tobacco sales." This File is Item 21 on the Judiciary & Legislation Committee Meeting Agenda for Monday afternoon, June 4, 2012.

• Section 134.66(55), Wis. Stats., requires municipal tobacco licensing ordinances to be in strict conformity with state law.

The Wisconsin Court of Appeals in *U.S. Oil Inc. v. City of Fond du Lac*, 199 Wis. 2d 333 (1996), held that the regulation of tobacco sales was a matter of statewide concern and that any municipal regulation not in strict conformity with state law was pre-empted.

The City Attorney has issued opinions consistent with the holding in U.S. Oil Inc. v. City
of Fond du Lac:

Opinion of June 22, 2004 – s. 106-30 of the code prohibiting sale of cigarettes in any form other than as a package or container on which a tax stamp is affixed is in conformity with s. 139.32(1), Wis. Stats., and prohibits sale of single cigarettes to persons of any age

Opinion of November 1, 2005 – singly-packaged cigars fall within the state's definition of "tobacco products" and not the definition of "cigarettes" and therefore are not subject to the prohibition against single sales of cigarettes

Opinion of October 13, 2006 – blunts or single cigars may not be regulated as "drug paraphernalia" where the state has excluded items from the definition of "drug paraphernalia" that are designed for use or primarily intended for use with tobacco products.

• The licensing system established under s.134.65, Wis. Stats., for retail tobacco sales provides the following applicable requirements:

No person may sell, possess with intent to sell, exchange, barter or give away cigarettes or tobacco products without obtaining a license from the city clerk

No license may be issued unless the applicant specifies whether the sale or other transfer of cigarettes or tobacco products is over-the-counter or by vending machine

Licenses shall name the licensee and specifically describe the premises

Licenses are not transferrable from the licensee to another or from one premises to another

A renewal license application may only be made by the licensee and not by an "attorney-in-fact" (City Attorney opinion of November 2, 2004)

Accurate records of purchases and receipts must be kept and preserved for inspection on the premises for 2 years

Penalties for violating the section include fines of not less than \$25 nor more than \$100 for a first offense; and

Conviction results in immediate termination of the license "of the person convicted of being personally guilty" and the person is not entitled to another license for a period of 5 years, and the person shall not act on behalf of a licensee.

 Restrictions on the sale or gift of cigarettes or tobacco products are provided in s. 134.66, Wis. Stats., including the following:

A retailer may not sell or provide cigarettes, nicotine products, or tobacco products to any person under the age of 18

Retailers must post notice of the prohibition on sales to minors including vending machines

Agents, employees and contractors of licensees must be trained

A court shall suspend licenses for unlawful sales to minors for periods of not more than 3 days for a first violation in 12 months and not less than 15 days nor more than 30 days for a violation within 12 months after committing 3 or more other violations

2011-12 Legislative Session Wrap-up

The City of Milwaukee's Intergovernmental Relations Division (IRD) recently concluded its efforts for the 2011-12 Wisconsin Legislative Session. The following are some statistics regarding the City's legislative efforts.

- The Legislature introduced 1325 bills in the 2011-12 session, 748 in the Assembly and 577 in the Senate. In addition, 75 bills were introduced between the January and September Special Sessions.
- IRD reviewed all of those bills and the City of Milwaukee registered to lobby on 131 of them (roughly 10%), including 69 Assembly bills and 62 Senate bills. We supported 43 of those bills and opposed 39.
- Of the bills that were introduced, the Governor signed 286 into law and partially vetoed 3.

Items we Supported

- IRD was authorized to register in support of 43 bills plus their companions. Nineteen of those bills were enacted.
- Ten of the bills that were enacted were items from the City of Milwaukee legislative agenda.
 One additional item from our legislative agenda was enacted in the State Budget.
 - > Act 3 Provides tax credits for businesses relocating to this state
 - Act 4 Expands economic development tax credits
 - ➤ Act 12 Corrects the filing of forms related to Milwaukee's TID #72
 - ➤ Act 17 Allows the City of Milwaukee to sell MPS real estate
 - ➤ Act 31 Prohibits the sale of synthetic marijuana
 - ➤ Act 32 (State Budget) Eliminates prevailing wage requirement for residential properties with less than 4 units
 - Act 98 restrictions on disabled parking identification cards
 - Act 133 Allows Milwaukee to participate in the state health insurance pool
 - Act 136 Expedites the foreclosure process for abandoned properties
 - Act 211 Provides that veterans with the same test score are treated equally by our City Service rules
 - Act 270 Allows for sharing of juvenile records with law enforcement

- An additional 9 of the bills that were enacted were supported through separate Judiciary and Legislation action.
 - Act 77 Authorizes the creation of multijurisdictional tax incremental districts
 - Act 97 Closing hours for certain alcoholic beverage retailers
 - ➤ Act 106 Excludes expenditures made as a result of a purchasing agreement with a school district from the calculation of expenditure restraint payment expenditures
 - Act 132 Extends immunity from liability to discretionary highway maintenance decisions
 - Act 134 Extends the deadline for adopting a maintenance program for private sewage systems
 - Act 135 Affirms municipal authority to set timelines for variances
 - ➤ Act 204 Allows public depositors to use deposit placement programs
 - > Act 267 Increases penalties for prohibited contact in domestic abuse incidents
 - ➤ Act 269 Allows police to recover costs from false information providers
- Another 14 items from the legislative package were introduced as bills or budget amendments but did not pass into law.
 - Allowing for red light safety cameras (State Budget)
 - Changing the format of vehicle registration stickers (study directed in State Budget)
 - Micro-stamping requirement for handguns
 - Increasing recycling grants
 - ➤ Allowing countywide residence of elected officials
 - Restricting the interest rates on pay day loans
 - Repealing the maintenance of effort requirement for emergency services
 - Exceptions to levy limits for service consolidation
 - Municipal consolidation loans
 - Increasing municipal court fees
 - Creating a Joint Committee on State Mandates
 - Restoring indexing to the Homestead Credit
 - Licensing of taxi cabs
 - ➤ Allowing for booting of legally parked vehicles
- Another 5 items were drafted as bills but were not introduced.
 - Recommendations to the Waste, Fraud and Abuse Commission (includes 14 items)
 - ➤ Allowing a staggered timeline for the issuance of food licenses
 - Strengthening regulations for motor vehicle salvage transactions
 - Mandatory licensing of real estate appraisers
 - Concealed Carry trailer bill

Items we Opposed

- IRD was authorized to oppose 39 bills that were introduced. Seven of those bills were enacted, one of which was amended into the State Budget.
- Six of the bills that were enacted were items IRD was authorized by the Judiciary and Legislation Committee to oppose. One was an item we opposed in our legislative agenda.
 - > Act 10 Changes to collective bargaining for public employees
 - > Act 23 Voter identification requirement (now under legal challenge)
 - Act 32 (State Budget) Expanding the Milwaukee Parental Choice Program
 - > Act 35 Concealed carry
 - ➤ Act 39 Redistricting
 - ➤ Act 168 Rules for spending stewardship funds
 - Act 216 Changes to sexual education curricula
- We opposed 32 bills that did not become law. Some highlights of the bills we defeated include:
 - ➤ AB 44/SB 34 Eliminating MPS residency requirements
 - ➤ AB 65/SB 30 Restricting the residency requirement for Milwaukee police officers and firefighters
 - ➤ AB 234 Restricting local ordinances restricting bow hunting
 - ➤ AB 262/SB 182 Restricting the taxation of billboard licenses and permits
 - ➤ AB 219/SB 240 Requiring local governments to actuarially fund postretirement health care benefits
 - ➤ AB 286/SB 207 Permitting employers to refuse to employ felons under the state fair employment law
 - ➤ AB 295 Requiring a local government to hold a referendum prior to enacting a vehicle registration fee
 - > SB 58 Eliminating liability of public utility customers for unbilled utility service.
 - ➤ SJR 48 Taxpayer Bill of Rights
- We opposed one additional item in the version of the State Budget passed by the Senate and Assembly. We were able to obtain a partial veto of this item.
 - Provision requiring the City of Milwaukee to pay discharged police officers while their appeal is pending before the Fire and Police Commission.
