LOCAL BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (LBE) BID INCENTIVE PROGRAM

BACKGROUND

The LBE contracting program, adopted in 2009, was designed to provide an incentive to increase local business participation in order to:

- Create more jobs for the city.
- >Yield tax benefits that would be an advantage to the city and its economic development.
- Diminish the harm suffered by the city and city residents without a substantial increase in cost to the city.



PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION

The LBE contracting program is administered by the Department of Administration (DOA), Purchasing Division who:

- > Develops rules and procedures for city departments to ensure compliance.
- Coordinates, monitors, and enforces the implementation of the program's goals.
- Collects and reviews data to determine program efficacy.



REQUIREMENTS OF CITY DEPARTMENTS

- >Apply an award standard in all formal bids (>\$50K) so that a local business has an advantage in being awarded a contract, provided that its bid does not exceed the lowest bid by 5% or \$25,000.
- As a result of state legislation passed in June 2011, the LBE program is no longer enforceable for public works contracts.
- ➤On July 20, 2016, the LBE Ordinance was updated to create an additional incentive for local firms that are certified as a Small Business Enterprise (SBE) firm to receive a 10% bid preference when the difference does not exceed \$30,000.




CONTRACTOR CRITERIA

- 1. Operates a business, or owns or leases property within the geographical boundaries of the City of Milwaukee.
- 2. Has been doing business in the City of Milwaukee for at least one (1) year.
- 3. Not delinquent in payment of local taxes, charges or fees, or has entered into an agreement to pay any delinquency and is abiding by the terms of the agreement.
- 4. The business will perform at least 10% of the monetary value of the work required under the contract.



Chart 2: Purchasing Contracts Awarded to Milw. Businesses



CONCLUSION

- ➤ The estimated total cost of the LBE bid incentive program since inception has been \$310,700. This breaks down to an annual average cost of approximately \$26K.
- ➤ To increase the impact of the incentive for local businesses, consideration should be given to lowering the threshold for the application of the LBE bid incentive.
- ➤ In an effort to maximize local workforce participation, consideration should be given to implementing an incentive for businesses that have a majority City resident workforce (Modeled after the City of Chicago's Local Bid Incentive Program).
