In accordance with the provisions of Section 320-21 (11) and (12) of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances, the Milwaukee Historic Preservation Commission has issued a certificate of appropriateness for the work listed above. The work was found to be consistent with preservation guidelines. The following conditions apply to this certificate of appropriateness:

- 1. HPC staff shall participate in the onsite color-matching process for the TexCote coating.
- 2. Bollards will be a "precast, reinforced concrete design that is a more substantial 10" diameter. The site plan will also be revised to reduce the passable opening to 6'-2""

All work must be done in a craftsman-like manner, and must be completed within one year of the date this certificate was issued. Staff must approve any changes or additions to this certificate before work begins. Work that is not completed in accordance with this certificate may be subject to correction orders or citations.
