This report is written by Police Officer Corstan D. COURT, assigned to the License Investigation Unit, Days.

The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

- 1. On 11/02/2017 at 2:01am officers investigated a shots fired Complaint in the area of E. Mason St and N. Broadway St. While on scene a shooting victim arrived at St Mary's Hospital. The investigation revealed the victim was at the District Night Club earlier with a group of friends. During the night an unknown subject bought her a drink. The same subject later touched her breast. After closing the situation escalated outside which resulted in shots being fired by both parties. The District was cooperative with the officers and provided video surveillance footage. The District pats down all patrons prior to them being allowed inside and the subjects involved had obtained their guns from their cars.
- 2. On 11/13/2018 officers investigated a Battery DV that started at 628 N. Water St in line waiting for the District Bar. The victim was in line with the suspect who was kicked out of the line by security for smoking and a dress code violation. The victim and suspect walked off and the suspect hit the victim in the head. The victim asked security to help her get her keys from the suspect but they refused stating she would need the Police to do that. The victim then leaves the scene. The tavern supplied video to the officers.
- 3. On 12/14/2017 at 3:07am a subject went to District One to report an incident that occurred at The District, 628 N. Water St. The victim stated she was standing at the bar when a subject came up behind her and pulled up her skirt exposing her underwear. She reported the incident to security who confronted the subject and kicked him out. The victim observed him return at

closing time and be allowed back in the bar. The officer made attempts to follow up at the tavern but it was closed.

4. On 01/09/2018 a meeting was held at District 1 regarding incidents at The District, 628 N. Water St. Captain Rowe suggested an ID scanner and a staggered or early release to avoid problems with 618Live closing at the same time. Security cameras were discussed. The applicant stated she has 6 cameras inside and 2-3 outside. She stated the footage is saved for 7 days. The applicant was reminded to call the Police when incidents occur. She stated she has hired a new General Manager but he doesn't have his manager's license yet.

5. On 02/28/2018 an officer met with the applicant regarding safety updates. The applicant advised the officer of the new ID scanner which is connect to a data base that track people kicked out of taverns nationwide. She also showed him new security cameras installed inside and outside. She stated that she has added two security officers outside in a car that are capable of going mobile if needed.

- 6. On 10/06/2018 officers responded to St Mary's Hospital to investigate a battery that occurred at District on Water, 628 N. Water St. The victim stated she was inside when a subject pushed her. When she confronted the person about the push she was punched in the face by a third subject. the Police responded to District on Water and spoke with the applicant. The officers were shown the ID scanner which had a picture of the subjects ID but could not view the video surveillance because nobody, including the applicant, knew how to operate the system. The suspect was located and arrested.
- 7. On 11/04/2018 officers were monitoring District on Water, 628 N. Water St. The Officers reported there were shots fired inside the tavern and located a victim, who is 18 years old. The victim was inside the tavern with her 17 year old friend. The investigation revealed the victim and her friend used an ID that belonged to someone else to get in the tavern. The employees were cooperative with the investigation and provided a copy of the video to the officers. The officer estimated there were 300 patrons inside and saw the posted capacity was 225. The officer used the video surveillance on the front door to count the patrons as they left and had a count of 383 when the video stopped at 1:20am, prior to all patrons exiting. This count was 158 over capacity. While watching the cameras the officer observed patrons walking around with full bottles of liquor. The business manager was not able to provide names of security personal on scene, he could only give nicknames. The officer also observed a smell of marijuana by the hooka pots and packaging for marijuana that tested positive for THC. The applicant was issued a citation for over capacity.

8. On 11/09/2018 a meeting was held at District 1 regarding District on Water. The issues discussed included: over capacity, marijuana recovered by the hooka, not knowing the names of security officers, using a promoter, and underage patrons. The applicant stated they do not use a promoter, they have a subject on staff the promotes the business on Facebook and would install a metal detector.

- 9. On 12/06/2018 at 2:05am officer conducted a tavern check on District on Water, 628 N. water St. The officer observed a patron leaving after hours. The officer went in and spoke with the applicant who stated the subject was having trouble closing his tab and another person was waiting to give an employee a ride home. The applicant was advised a PA33 would be written.
- 10. On 12/28/2018 officers, along with an inspector from the health department, conducted an inspection at District on Water, 628 N. Water St. The applicant was on scene.
- 11. On 01/26/2019 officers were dispatched to a battery cutting at District on Water, 628 N. Water St. The officer spoke with the applicant who stated she did not know of any problem in the tavern. she then remembered a friend who had a cut on his head from a broken bottle. The officers returned later and spoke with the bar manager who provided video of the victim leaving the business with the cut on his head.

Item #7 updated with disposition on 01/31/2020

- 12. On 06/15/2019 at 2:00am officers were monitoring the bars in the 600 block of N. Water St. The officers heard a loud argument in the area and located a subject on the ground unconscious at 600 N. Water St. The witnesses stated the subject was leaving the bar at 628 N. Water St and got into a fight with another patron of the same bar. The fight had originated from inside the bar. The suspect hit the patron one time knocking him to the ground. The victim was taken to the hospital where he died from his injury. On 06/26/2019 the officers attempted to contact the applicant at the business but it was closed. They called her by phone and she stated she would help in any way possible.
- 13. On 08/03/2019 at 12:43am while on foot patrol in the 600 block of N. Water St, officers observed a fight in front of 628 N. Water St, The District Nightclub. The officers interviewed one of the subjects who stated he was inside the tavern ordering drinks when an unknown actor began hitting him from behind for no reason. The subject stated he was defending himself when security pushed both parties outside, where the fight continued. The officer interviewed security who stated an unknown actor struck the victim from behind while outside the tavern, he did not mention that the fight had started inside.
- 14. On 08/10/2019 at 12:00am The District Nightclub, 628 N. Water St, reached capacity and the applicant advised security to not allow anyone else inside. At 1:57am a fight between two patrons of the District started outside in front of The District. Security separated the subjects and assisted police. Security cleared the sidewalks after closing and there were no further incidents.

15. On 03/07/2020 at 1:43am officers conducted a license premise check at District IV on Water, 628 N. Water St. The officer estimated there were about 300 people inside the tavern, which has an occupancy limit of 225. The officer conducted a head count as the patrons left for the night and counter 282 patrons and employees. The applicant was on scene and stated she has a security guard at the door counting patrons as he comes in and she counts as they leave. The officer advised that one person should do the counting. No citations were issued.

- 16. On 06/13/21 at 2:11am, Milwaukee Police were dispatched to N. Water Street and E. Michigan Avenue for a shooting complaint. Investigation revealed that two groups exited the tavern located at 628 N. Water Street and began to re-initiate an argument, about a necklace, which occurred inside the establishment. Police and security separated the subjects and kept them moving down the street. Ten minutes later, one of the subjects received a gunshot wound to the shoulder at N. Water Street and E. Michigan Avenue.
- 17. On 03/28/21 at 12:50am, Milwaukee Police responded to 628 N. Water Street for a fight complaint. Investigation revealed that three underage subjects, who were intoxicated, were pushed out of the establishment for fighting. While officers were on scene, they observed ten to fifteen underage subjects exit the tavern with a security guard that was seen running inside the club after police arrival. The applicant was cited for Presence of Minor at License Premise (3 counts).

INITIAL INVESTIGATION

This report was written by Police Officer Devon WILLIAMS, assigned to District Three Modified Early Shift.

On Saturday June 12, 2021 while working code red at 600 N Water St, and assigned to squad 1421 with Police Officer Jamar LUCKY we responded to a shooting.

The shooting happen at approximately 2:11 A.M on Sunday June 13, 2021 at N Water St and West Michigan.

Prior to the shooting victim 1 who was identified by Wisconsin registration card as Angel NAVARRETE (m/w, 3/21/00) was at a club by the name of District located 628 N Water St.

NAVARRETE who was wearing a black t shirt and blue jeans came out of District with another guy who was wearing an army fatigue shirt and khaki pants.

NAVARRETE came out of the club and walked to a vehicle that was parked in the street in front of the club, after going to the vehicle the subjects opened the rear but never entered the vehicle.

NAVARRETE and his friend walked to the curb and began to accuse some other citizens who had recently walked out of the same club of stealing NAVARRETE necklace.

The other citizens were made up of two black males, one who was approximately 6'0", 160 pounds light skinned with dread locks up in a ponytail on top of his head wearing a black t shirt, black jeans and white tennis shoes, the second male was approximately 5'6", 120 pounds, dark skinned with his hair braided to the sides, wearing a black hooded pull over sweater, dark colored jeans and unknown shoes. The subjects were also accompanied by three females, the first female was approximately 5'3. 110 ponds dark skinned, with short black dread locs, wearing a black polo shirt with white on the sleeves and down the sides with black jeans and white tennis shoes, the second female subject was approximately 5'5, 125 pounds, light skinned, black hair wearing a pink one piece shorts outfit with white shoes, and the last subject was approximately 5'5, 180 pounds heavy build, black hair with a yellow bandanna tied around her head, glasses, wearing a pink shirt with a hooded sweater on one half of her body (her right arm was in a hooded sleeve and it was pulled over her head, her left arm was not in the hoodle) blue jean shorts and fur slide on sandals.

During the verbal altercation the bigger party was stating "Talk that shit now, ya'll was talking plenty shit in the club what's up now".

Both parties tried to engage each other but the security along with P.O LUCKY stepped in the separate the parties before anything physical happen. While keeping the parties separated NAVARRETE and his friend began to throw up gang signs and make statements about being gang related.

The other party stated "we don't gang bang" as they walked away going south bound on north Water St.

NAVARRETE and his friend continued to try to engage the other party who was walking away, P.O LUCKY and I continued to try to stop NAVARRETE and his friend from attempting to engage the other party but they were consistent and became slightly aggressive towards us.

P.O LUCKY and I were able to get NAVARRETE and his friend away from the club and almost on north Water St and west Wisconsin St. NAVARRETE and his friend turned their attention to us and began calling us names and telling us to turn off our body cameras and see what happen. At that point I told P.O LUCKY that we were done and turned around and walked away.

P.O LUCKY pulled NAVARRETE to the side and tried to speak with him about his necklace that was lost or stolen, P.O LUCKY asked him if he wanted to file a report for the necklace and he stated no. P.O LUCKY then stated well we're done here.

NAVARRETE and his friend continued trying to follow behind the other party, we tried stopping them again, they walked in the middle of the street and stated "fuck yall" before walking south bound on north Water St.

The initial contact with both parties was approximately 2:00 A.M and lasted approximately four or five minutes.

After further review of my body worn camera it was revealed that while P.O LUCKY and I were trying to move NAVARRETE away from the other party they were accompanied by two Hispanic males, one was wearing a red t shirt with white lettering that said JORDAN and had the jump man logo in white on the front of the shirt, black pants and red, white and black shoes, the second subject was wearing a dark colored t shirt.

At or around 2:10 A.M while standing in front of club District monitoring the let out I heard what sounded like a single gun south coming from the south of our location. When I first heard the gun shot I didn't think it was gun shots I thought it was fireworks because someone had been letting them off all night.

I then noticed people just south of us on the same block crouching down on the west side of the street, at that moment I realized that what I heard could be gun shots and we need to see what was going on.

I then began to run south bound on water St towards where I thought the gun shot came from, P.O LUCKY followed behind me as ran to the corner of north Water St and West Michigan St,

Upon my arrival a male flagged me and down and stated that someone was shot on the other corner. As

I approached I realized that NAVARRETE was the subject that was shot on the south east corner on North Water St and West Michigan St.

NAVARRETE was shot to the left shoulder, after cutting off his shirt it was revealed that the bullet was through and through. There was a hole in NAVARRETE's back where the bullet entered or exited.

I render aid to NAVARRETE until medical arrived and took over.

INITIAL INVESTIGATION

This report was written by P.O. Jacob Baczek, assigned to District 1, Late Power Shift.

On Sunday, March 28, 2021, at 12:50 a.m., myself-and P.O. Richard MICHALAK were working on squad 1420, when we heard on our Milwaukee Police Department radio squad 1424, P.O. Charles SEELOW and P.O. Devon WILLIAMS ask for extra squads regarding a fight at "The District", a night club located at 628 North Water Street in the city and county of Milwaukee. P.O. SEELOW was escorting a subject to my squad car, Wesam S. THABTEH (w/f 03-12-03) and P.O. WILLIAMS placing a female identified as Laila F. HASAN (w/f 09-015-02) in the back of his squad car, who was also in custody. P.O. MICHALAK was then approached by a subject, Malik A. HASSAN (w/m 09-22-00) who stated that he was involved in a fight and the subject appeared to have a broken nose.

According to P.O. SEELOW, he was writing a parking ticket when he observed HASSAN get pushed by someone out of the front door of "The District", and the subject had a bloody nose. P.O. SEELOW then observed THABTEH and LAILA exit "The District" who were also fighting with subjects as they were being pushed out. I then spoke to LAILA who stated she was not intoxicated, and only had two shots, which she vomited out while she was outside. LAILA did have a strong odor of intoxicants emanating from her breath. LAILA stated that it is the "Districts" fault for letting her in, and stated she does not even have identification on her.

I then interviewed THABTEH who stated that he is also underage, and was at the club because he knows they will let him in. THABTEH stated that he never showed his identification card and was let in without being asked. THABTEH stated his friend, MALIK, was involved in a fight, and he was just "backing up his guy". P.O. SEELOW stated that he asked all three subjects to leave numerous times and they continued to try to get back inside "The District" and fight. THABTEH appeared intoxicated and had an odor of alcohol coming from his person, as well as slurred speech.

P.O. MICHALAK stated that he interviewed MALIK, who refused medical attention even though he most likely had a broken nose. MALIK was heavily intoxicated and just continued to say that he does not know why he was in custody. All three subjects admitted to being inside "The District" and two stated that they were not asked for Identification at the door. MALIK did

not have identification on his person, and was observed being physically pushed out side of the club. In attempting to interview security for the District, One security guard, who had a radio and was in street clothes, ran inside of the club and immediately I observed what appeared to be ten to fifteen underage subjects exiting the front of the club with the security guard. Several minutes later another group of underage subjects exited the club with the same security guard behind him. All of the sujbects who appeared to be underage attempted to shield their faces and began to walk quickly toward their vehicels to leave. I then attempted to speak to another security guard, a black male, wearing a black outfit stated, "I don't know nothing about that, I id everybody". The agent for the establishment, Patsy S. SMITH-JAMES (w/f 08-30-42) was on scene and notified of the violations by squad 1410, Sergeant David GRANDSARD. SMITH-JAMES was issued three citations in person regarding having three subjects, ages 18,19, and 20 years of age in a Class B licensed premise consuming alcohol. (Citation#'s 06819114G0, 06819114G1, 06819114G2)

All three subjects were issued citations for underage drinking, and disorderly conduct. Follow up will be required in an attempt to get the names of security working at the door during the evening that allowed the subjects, and what appeared to be numerous other underage subjects into the club without showing identification cards.



- 5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)

- 6. You may then provide testimony.
- a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
- b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
- c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
- d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
- 7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.
- 8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.
