"Identify resources to assist low and moderate income homeowners in neighborhoods where rapidly rising values may create a property tax hardship."


#### **Anti-Displacement Fund Timeline**

- December 2018: Common Council directs DCD to develop a proposed local framework for an Anti-Displacement Tax Fund modeled on the Atlanta Westside Future Fund.
- May 2019: DCD presents a potential framework for Anti-Displacement Tax Fund to Common Council. Proposal notes the need to identify a local sponsor, program administrator, and raise private (non-governmental) funds.

#### **Anti-Displacement Fund Timeline**

- June 2019: MKE United agrees to explore sponsoring the creation of the Anti-Displacement Fund.
- October 2019: MKE United secures sufficient fundraising commitments to launch MKE Anti-Displacement Fund during 2019 tax season. Fund contributions were provided by generous philanthropic and private donors, since no public funds can be utilized for tax assistance payments.

#### **Anti-Displacement Fund Neighborhoods**



- Average assessed value of homes increased more than 10% above city average increase between 2014-2019
- Identified by Anti-Displacement Plan as exhibiting indicators associated with risk of displacement due to rising property values

#### **Eligibility Criteria**

- Owner occupied homes in program area
- Must have owned property since January 1, 2015 (or inherited from family member)
- Current on real estate taxes and not subject to mortgage foreclosure
- Income at or below City averages

#### **Anti-Displacement Fund Timeline**

- **November 18, 2019:** MKE United Anti-Displacement Fund launches, begins accepting applications.
- January 2020: Year 1 results:

111 applicants certified as eligible for assistance through Fund (86 received property tax assistance, additional 25 were approved, but did not experience a tax increase)

Fund provided \$38,356 in tax assistance payments (\$446 average)

#### **Anti-Displacement Fund – Year 3**

- Application period opens September 2021
- Direct mail to all 2020 applicants
- Follow up telephone calls to all previous applicants
- Direct mailings to <u>all</u> homeowners in Program area and follow up outreach from local Alderpersons
- Targeted door to door contacts in neighborhoods
- Anti-Displacement Fund Website

#### Results – Year 3

- 122 applications received/94 applicants certified as eligible for assistance through Fund (69 – Northside, 25 – Southside)
- 76 participants received property tax assistance with 2021 tax bill
- 18 additional participants did not experience a tax increase in 2021 but are eligible for assistance in future program years
- Fund provided \$77,904 in tax assistance payments
   \$1,025 average over double the amount in first year

#### **Cumulative - 3 Year Program Results**

- Total Applications Received: 421
- Total Applications Certified: 321
- \$207,225 in assistance payments
- Average income: ~\$22,000
- Age Range: 31-98
- Average (2021): 65
- Average Year of Purchase: 1998
- Race/ethnicity\*: ~75% African American/Black or Latino/Latina homeowners
