- 1. 2011 Proposed Budget: \$72.4 million
 - \$52.4 million in anticipated grants
 - \$20 million in unanticipated grant authority
- 2. Nine departments anticipate operating grant funding in 2011
- 3. 85 separate anticipated grants
- 4. \$617,000 average anticipated grant amount

- 4. Unanticipated Grant funding decreases by \$3 million (\$23 M to \$20 M)

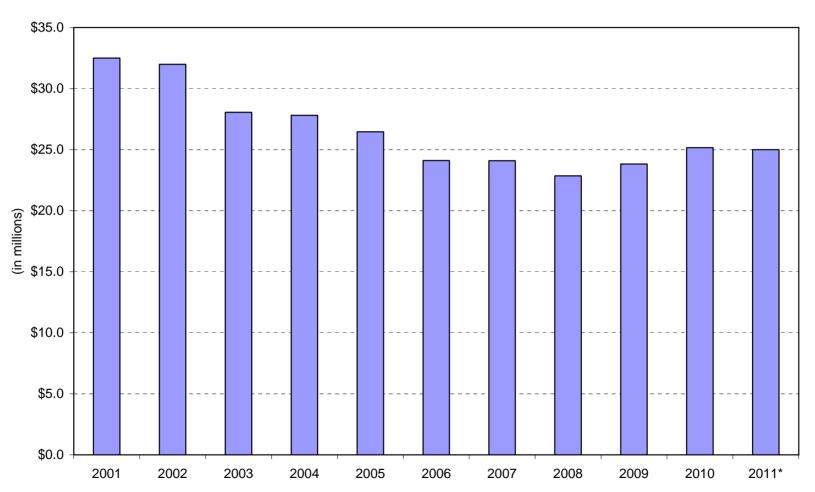
