To the Honorable Common Council City of Milwaukee

Dear Council Members,

Enclosed herein is Port Milwaukee's *Infrastructure Survey/Security & Resilience Report*, which was completed by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA).

The Port partnered with DHS to analyze the safety and security of its commercial operations on Jones Island, including the ability to (i) identify, deter, detect, disrupt, and prepare for threats and hazards; (ii) reduce vulnerabilities of critical assets, systems, and networks; and (iii) mitigate the potential consequences to critical infrastructure of incidents or adverse events that do occur.

The report provides a list of identified significant assets or areas (SSAs) at the Port. The report also lists commendable actions (what the Port is doing well), vulnerabilities (what the Port could improve), and options for consideration (potential security or resiliency enhancements) for Port and City leadership review, including the Board of Harbor Commissioners, the Milwaukee Common Council and Mayor Cavalier Johnson.

On behalf of Port Milwaukee staff and the Board of Harbor Commissioners, I am pleased to present you with the enclosed copy of the report findings. We recommend that the report findings be leveraged by current and future policymakers and funders, particularly to strategically plan for needed Port enhancements that will better sustain and protect the Port's commercial, multimodal and recreational mission in the decades ahead.
