The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

1. On 1-29-98 a sting operation, utilizing a police aide to attempt to purchase alcohol from a Class B Premise, was conducted at Jim Mitchell's 10433 W Appleton Ave. The 19-year-old police aide was able to purchase a beer from the bartender without being asked for identification. The bartender serving the beer to the aide was Brent T. Rock. Rock stated that he carded everyone who was in the bar and that no one was underage. After pointing out that the aide was 19 years old, Rock admitted that he served him without asking for identification.

- 5. INCIDENT On 9-5-04, an officer was dispatched to 10433 W Appleton Avenue, for the second time for reckless vehicles in front of Mitchell's Tavern. Multiple calls have come into dispatch regarding this complaint, along with a walk in at District #4. On arrival, the officer observed multiple tire burn outs in the tavern parking lot, along with the same marks on W Appleton Avenue, from the exit/entrance of the tavern, to West Bobolink Avenue, approximately 200 feet long. Upon speaking with the licensee, Brent Rock, he stated an officer told him last year that vehicles at the car show were allowed to make one burn out, no more. He did not know the name of the officer who told him this. He said none of the vehicles at his car show were involved, and if they were, he advised them to stop driving recklessly. Report filed.
- 6. On 1-13-05, police officers, along with an underage police aide, conducted a premises check at Mitchell's Tavern, 10433 W Appleton Avenue. The police aide purchased alcoholic beverages from the bartender, Rex Platke. An ID was requested, by the bartender, and shown. The ID indicated the police aide was under 21 years old, but she was served anyway

7. On 7-30-2005 at 1:06am Milwaukee police were sent to 10433 W Appleton Ave., Mitchell's Tavern regarding a battery complaint. Investigation showed that an argument began in the tavern and spilled onto the front parking lot where a fight began. Two patrons battered a 3rd patron. The victim suffered a skull fracture and bleeding to the brain and was in a coma the next morning. A girlfriend of one of the batterer's was in the tavern and was involved in the argument in the tavern. The girlfriend was underage. Two bartenders on the premise Dorthy A Hausman and William C Armstrong were on the premise. On 8-15-2005 when the officers finally contacted the licensee, Brent Rock, he was found to be very intoxicated as a patron of his establishment. He told the officers to "Get the fuck out of his bar". He also said that they couldn't write him any tickets.

9. On 11/01/07 at 12:26 pm, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 10433 W Appleton for an Entry Into Auto complaint. Investigation revealed that the victim was a patron inside Mitchell's Tap and his auto was broken into with someone stealing his laptop that was left on the front passenger seat. There were no outside video cameras and a report was filed.

10. On 07/11/2010 Milwaukee police responded to the shooting at 10433 W. Appleton Ave. (Mitchell's Tavern). Investigation revealed an argument occurred inside the business between the bartender and two subjects who refused to show identification. These subjects were asked to leave the bar. As they left, the subjects pushed over two motorcycles in the parking lot. The owners of the motorcycles attempted to prevent the subjects from leaving. One of the subjects produced a handgun and shot one of the bar patrons in the arm. Milwaukee police incident report # 101920024 filed.

On 04/24/2015 Milwaukee police, along with agents from the Wisconsin Department of Revenue, conducted a tavern check at 10433 West Appleton Avenue (Mitchell's Tavern). 5 contaminated bottles of alcohol were discovered and disposed of and the applicant was advised to keep invoices on the premises for two years. No other violations were observed.

13. On 12/15/2019 at 1:06am officers were dispatched to a Battery at Mitchell's Tavern, 10433 W. Appleton Av. When the officers arrived they observed a subject with a small cut and swelling near his eye. The subject refused medical and did not want to report a crime. The officers spoke with the bartender, who stated there was an argument between the patron and another group of subjects. All of the subjects went outside and the one patron returned alone, she was unsure what happened outside.

14. On 04/05/2022 at 8:53pm officers were dispatched to Shots Fired at Mitchell's Tavern, 10433 W. Appleton Av. The officers searched the area and found no casings or property damage. The officers spoke with the applicant, who stated he heard the shots fired coming from the parkway. The parkway was searched and no evidence was recovered.

NATURE OF CALL/ JUSTIFICATION

On Tuesday, April 5, 2022 at approximately 8:53 pm, a caller stated that she heard shots fired across the street from Mitchell's Tavern located at 10433 W Appleton Ave. The caller of this complaint stated that she heard approximately 5 to 6 gunshots.

INVESTIGATION

Upon arrival at the mentioned address, officers searched the area for casings or signs of property damage and did not observe anything. The Milwaukee County Sheriff Department was contacted to assist with searching the Milwaukee County Parkway in which no casings were recovered.

I then entered Mitchell's Tavern and spoke with the owner Brent ROCK. ROCK stated that he heard the shots being fired from across W Appleton Ave in the park area. ROCK stated that he heard gunshots coming from the park area often but could not provide a description of the offenders.

FOLLOW UP

While speaking with ROCK in the parking lot of Mitchell's Tavern I observed that the exterior pole light on the eastside of the parking lot was very dim. ROCK stated that the pole light was owned by the city and would contact them to have the light replaced. ROCK agreed that replacing pole light would aide with lot security.

I viewed the security camera footage of the exterior of Mitchell's Tavern and did not observe anyone discharging a firearm in the area.

Those wishing to provide oral testimony will be asked to do so by phone or internet and are asked to contact the staff assistant, Yadira Melendez at (414) 286-2775 or stasst5@milwaukee.gov for necessary information. Please make such requests no later than one business day prior to the start of the meeting. You are not required to attend the hearing, but please see the information below if you would like to provide testimony. Once the Licenses Committee makes its recommendation, this recommendation is forwarded to the full Common Council for approval at its next regularly scheduled hearing.

Important details for those wishing to provide information for the Licenses Committee to consider when making its recommendation:

- 1. The license application is scheduled to be heard at the above time. Due to other hearings running longer than scheduled, you may have to wait some time to provide your testimony.
- 2. You must testify as to matters that you have personally experienced or seen. (You cannot provide testimony for your neighbor, parent or anyone else; this is considered hearsay and cannot be considered by the committee.)
- 3. No letters or petitions can be accepted by the committee (unless the person who wrote the letter or the persons who signed the petition are willing to testify).
- 4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.
- 5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)

- 6. You may then provide testimony.
- a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
- b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
- c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
- d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
- 7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.
- 8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.

Please Note: If you have submitted an objection to the above application your objection cannot be considered by the committee unless you personally testify at the hearing.
