Resolution approving Amendment No. 5 to the Project Plan for Tax Incremental District No. 41, Time Warner Riverwalk and authorizing additional funding and expenditures, and approving a grant agreement, in the 6th Aldermanic District. This resolution will allow the City to enter into an Grant Agreement with the Business Improvement District No. 8, to facilitate the construction and installation of various public street amenities within 1/2-mile of the TID No. 41, Time Warner Riverwalk, boundaries.

2. Identify the anticipated equity impacts, if any, of this proposal.

he grant will create positive equity impacts through its support of the mission of the Historic King Drive Business Improvement District to improve and revitalize the district and bring investment and new businesses to the area. The BID boundary encompasses diverse neighborhoods with a distinct cultural flavor. A recent strategic plan for the BID adds "the future of the district for profitable businesses requires that the area be safe, clean and vibrant"" and this grant will allow for the BID to positively benefit its members through the implementation of this project.
