Description of work Replace existing gutter with new 2 piece gutter. Bottom 2 courses of slate and starter slate shall be removed. An outer profile or "box" will be laid flat to the overhang and duplicate the profile of the house gutters. An inner profile or "liner" will fit inside the box and be pitched toward the outlet. The liner will be attached to the box at the top outside edge. The liner will have a continuous back flashing that extends under the slate 4". Copper bar hangers will be installed every 32" with the top edge mounted under the slate. Both box and liner will be fabricated from 20 oz. copper. All seams will be soldered. New underlayment shall be spliced in where slate was removed. Slate shall be reinstalled back to its original position. Existing downspout at the N. end will releive the gutter. Downspout at the S. end will be eliminated. 8/30/2022

Staff must approve any changes or additions to this certificate before work begins. Work that is not completed in accordance with this certificate may be subject to correction orders or citations.
