- 1. Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):
 - This grant will fund a high visibility enforcement campaign targeting pedestrian and bicycle safety enforcement. The City of Milwaukee has a notable problem with motorists, pedestrians, and bicyclists alike, failing to follow rules of the road that endanger safety. MPD will conduct enforcement activities in high traffic areas with frequent pedestrian and bicycle activity. MPD will us both education and citations to improve compliance to create a safer environment for pedestrians, bicyclists, and motorists. Education and enforcement will target motorist failure to yield to pedestrians in the crosswalk, pedestrian crossing outside the crosswalk, and bicyclist failure to follow rules of the road.
- Relationship to City-Wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives: Improved safety on city roadways is a priority for the Milwaukee Police Department and is a focus of the Traffic Safety Unit. TSU utilizes High Visibility Enforcement (HVE) as a universal traffic safety approach designed to create deterrence and change unlawful traffic behaviors. HVE combines highly visible and proactive law enforcement that includes enforcement, education, and engineering solutions to create safer streets and neighborhoods in Milwaukee.

 The total grant award of \$74,250 with a grantor funded amount of \$57,750 (78%) and a local inkind match of \$16,500 (22%) will fund Police Officer overtime for deployments during enforcement periods from mid-July through September 2022.
