Proposal Applicant purchased this house in May this year.

Applicant wants to replace windows with vinyl substitutes because he states most are painted shut, have storm windows, appear to be deteriorating and he thinks vinyl will be more energy efficient. He does not want to change the first floor front windows

and is willing to keep the second story front windows.

Staff comments The HPC has consistently denied the use of vinyl, vinyl clad, fiberglas and metal clad

windows among others, for residential properties because they cannot meet the profiles of the originals. The reasons stated for replacement are easily fixed. There are studies showing that original windows with weather-stripping and storm windows

are comparable to new windows at a fraction of the cost.

Wood windows can be rehabilitated, made weather tight and the use of storms add the equivalent of a double planed window. If windows are too deteriorated, wood replacements are required. This house is a Sears House, named the Alhambra. A very similar house was illustrated in the Gordon Van Tine catalogue. It is important to keep the character defining windows. Houses have four sides and all sides are considered important. The owner may be eligible for Historic Tax Credits for the

restoration of his windows.
