



Equity Impact Statement

1. Describe the proposed ordinance or resolution. File number: 220634

Resolution approving Amendment No. 6 to the Project Plan for Tax Incremental District No. 56, Erie Jefferson, and authorizing additional expenditures, and approving a development agreement in the 4th Aldermanic District. This resolution will allow the City to enter into an agreement with Milwaukee Apartment Ventures, LLC to facilitate the design and construction of improvements to right of way with an extension of Corcoran Street and the addition of a sidewalk and tree lawn to Harbor Drive in the Historic Third Ward neighborhood.

2. Identify the anticipated equity impacts, if any, of this proposal.

The infrastructure project is necessary for the adjacent private development to move forward. In turn, the project will increase the tax base of the City, which allows for City services to be provided to residents throughout the City and/or allows for the reduction in the property tax burden for all residents. In addition, this project will create a more regular and functional street grid, to better serve the transportation needs of the neighborhood.

3. Identify which minority groups, if any, may be negatively or positively impacted by the proposal.

All minority groups, of all levels of ability, will be positively impacted through the created opportunity to enjoy the benefits of improved pedestrian and bicycle safety and a more functional street grid for the transportation needs of the neighborhood.

The approval of the financing for this project includes public hearings at the Joint Review Board, Redevelopment Authority of the City of Milwaukee and the Zoning Neighborhood and Development Committee of the Common Council.

The City does not have a means to measure the impacts but it can be seen that overtime the improvements are beneficial in cultivating a thriving community through improved pedestrian and bicycle safety and a more functional street grid.
