AAFRC provides services and resources to victims of domestic and sexual violence.

AAFRC is proposing to occupy a portion of the third floor in Suit 321 building located at 1037 W. McKinley Avenue, within the Brewery Project DIZ overlay zone. This use has been defined as a social service use, which the overlay allows, but requires a public hearing before the City Plan Commission.

AAFRC is a safe space that provides empowerment and support primarily to immigrant families, Sickle Cell families and other individuals seeking services.

AAFRC's mission is to ensure that every woman, man and child has access to necessary services within their community.
