Subject: Port of Milwaukee – Revenue Trends, Revenue Forecasting, and Rail Data

At the October 11, 2022 Finance and Personnel Committee Hearing to discuss the Port of Milwaukee's proposed 2023 budget, Aldermen Spiker and Murphy requested the Port's revenue trends and forecasts, as well as data relating to rail use. This information is provided below.

Revenue Trends

Port revenue consistently outpaces expenditure, though expenditures have grown at a faster pace than revenue since 2016. Port revenue increased by about 20 percent from 2016-2021, while expenditures increased by 32 percent during this time (excluding Milwaukee World Fair [MWF] transfer). However, it should be noted that this trend is not linear—2020 revenue was 41 percent higher than 2016 revenue, while expenditures only increased by 12 percent.

Full revenue and expenditure data by type and year are outlined in Table 1, located on Page 2.

Revenue Forecasting

The Budget Office and the Port of Milwaukee have insufficient data at this time to reliably forecast revenue out for multiple years. Many of the revenue sources are highly variable and depend on a multitude of market and meteorological forces. However, applying the proposed 2023 tariff increase of 5 percent to 2021 actuals yields a projected revenue increase of about \$113,000.

Rail Usage

Railcar visits decreased slightly from 2019 to 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, but remain at higher than 2018 levels (Table 2).
