# 1. Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):

This grant will support the following priority recommendations: A legislative council study will begin to develop one cohesive and effective gun violence reduction policy agenda for the county; Establish a regional clearinghouse for all gun violence activities in the city that would include the gun violence activities of community groups, academic researchers and students, law enforcement, federal/state resources, legislative agencies; Establish a safe exchange center in Milwaukee for parents that have an abusive partner, or other safe location to exchange child custody, or where custody arranges have led to violent acts; Support the work of the Collaborative Reentry Project; Reestablish a major violators program for specific police districts and for the entire city; Develop a directed patrol mission for problem taverns and standardize the community prosecution unit target teams; Reestablish in-school suspensions in public and charter schools; Establish a partnership between MPS and MPD to work together on anti-gang related activities.

The MHRC is working in aggressively to expand and provide services through a newly created Center for Community Safety. The MHRC will be a core function of the new Center.

The vision of the MHRC is a violence free community and our mission is to have all sectors working together to reduce homicides and violent crime. The three operation goals that guide the MHRC are: 1) to better understand homicides and violence, 2) to develop innovative homicide and violence prevention strategies and 3) to help focus available resources using real time data.

# 2. Relationship to City-wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives:

Reduction of crime and improvement of health and public safety.

#### 3. Need for Grant Funds and Impact on Other Departmental Operations (Applies only to Programs):

Funds needed to continue supporting the work of the Milwaukee Homicide Review Commission (MHRC). The grant will pay for a portion of two key staff position salaries; the Director and the Research Associate.

# 4. Results Measurement/Progress Report (Applies only to Programs):

The MHRC will hold monthly criminal justice homicide reviews and bimonthly community service and domestic violence homicide review meetings. The MHRC plans to publish a report in February 2011 on all homicides that occur in 2010 as well as a report in June 2010 on all homicides that occur during the first six months of 2011.
