The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

 On 06/18/2008 at 2:09am Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a trouble with juvenile complaint at 1202 W. Highland Ave. (Pantry 41). Investigation revealed a group of four juveniles created a disturbance in the parking lot of the business, swearing and tipping over garbage cans. The caller later discovered the taillight of his car, which was parked in the lot of the business, was broken. Incident #081710021 filed. Page 2 Walia, Ajit S

- 3. On 06/18/09 at 2:18 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 1202 W Highland for a Fight complaint. Investigation revealed that two patrons were involved in a physical fight inside the store. Officers observed several broken food item containers and food that was thrown against the wall and floor. Officers spoke to the clerk, identified as Chaitanya Kumar Rajo regarding this incident. Rajo was unable to provide officers a copy of the surveillance due to the fact she didn't know how. Officers made contact with the licensee Ajit Walia regarding the fight. The patrons were cited for Assault & Battery and Vandalism.
- On 05/18/2010 at 1:51am Milwaukee Police responded to an armed robbery complaint at 1202 West Highland Avenue (Pantry 41). Investigation revealed a patron was robbed of his vehicle at gunpoint while at the gas pumps at this location. Milwaukee police incident report #101380013 filed.
 - On 05/24/2010 at 2:21am Milwaukee Police responded to an armed robbery complaint 901 West Winnebago St. #105. Investigation revealed a patron was robbed of his vehicle and additional personal property at gunpoint while at the gas pumps at 1202 West Highland Avenue (BP gas station). The victim then went to his cousin's home at 901 West Winnebago St. #105 and called police. Milwaukee police incident report # 101440020 filed.
- 6. On 03/04/14, Milwaukee police investigated were investigating an armed robbery and attempted to obtain video surveillance from the BP located at 1202 W Highland Avenue, which occurred outside the gas station. The officer was advised that an employee named "Jay" could obtain the video for him and was given a number to reach "Jay". The officer called the number and received no answer. On 03/05/14, the officer made contact with "Jay" and agreed to meet that day at 2:30 pm. The officer was there at 2:30 pm and waited for 31 minutes in which "Jay" did not show up. An employee called "Jay" and was told that he would be there by 3:30 pm. "Jay" never showed up and didn't answer any calls that were made by the officer to his cell. The officer, using MPD resources, later determined that "Jay's" real name was Ajit Walia and that he is the owner of the gas station.

- 7. On 10/18/16 at 2:37 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 1202 W Highland for a Reckless Use complaint. Investigation revealed the station clerk, identified as Tarig Warraich, got into a verbal argument with a patron over a gas purchase. The patron called Warraich a derogatory name which Warraich repeated back to the patron when he observed the patron holding a gun at his side. Warraich stated the subject moved from one end of the counter to the other, as if he was looking for a way to get behind the counter. Warraich then called his security guard who was sitting in a vehicle in the parking lot to have him call police. Warraich then stated the patron when out to his car saying he would be back. Warraich stated while the security guard was speaking to the subject, the subject tried to walk back towards the door to the store, but that security stopped him. The subject ultimately left.
- 8. On 10/24/16 at 2:30 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 1202 W Highland for a theft complaint. Officers spoke with the clerk, identified as Tariq Warraich, who stated 6 subjects entered the business and ransacked the store. All subjects had their faces covered by hoods and filled backpacks with food, candy and beverages totaling at least \$500 and fled the store. Warraich stated this was an ongoing issue which usually occurs between 1:00 am and 2:00 am. Officers contacted the agent, Ajit Walia, and advised him a report would be filed.

- 9. On 10/30/16 at 7:50 pm, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 1202 W Highland for a property damage complaint. Police spoke with Cornelius Degefferd, who stated five juveniles were throwing rocks or concrete pieces at the location, with some of them striking his auto. Police did observe some damage to his auto. Police spoke with Tariq Warraich, who was the clerk on duty, who stated those same juveniles entered the store and grabbed merchandise from the shelves and stuffed it into back packs and then fled. Police were able to arrest one of the juveniles and recovered some of the stolen property. She was cited for retail theft. Police were unable to view surveillance video of the criminal damage complaint.
- 10. On 11/13/16 at 1:00 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 1202 W Highland for a theft complaint. Police spoke with Tariq Warraich who stated that 5 juveniles came into the store and stole approximately \$1,500 worth of merchandise. Warraich stated that the juveniles came in at three different occasions throughout the night with the same tactics. The juveniles would the store with backpacks, load them with various candy, drinks, pizzas, chicken, and canned goods. They fled the store in an unknown direction. Warraich stated he did not know how to view the video footage of the store.
- 11. On 11/19/16 at 12:44 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 1202 W Highland for a subject with weapon complaint. Investigation revealed a patron was asked to leave the business property by security and refused. The patron stated the security guard threatened her and that she refused to leave. The patron was cited for trespassing.
- 12. On 11/20/16 at 9:50 pm, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 1202 W Highland for a subject with weapon complaint. Police spoke with security for the station, Cornelious Degefferd, who stated while he was working, the store was robbed by 2 males, one who was armed with a gun. The suspects entered the business, grabbed two boxes of beef sticks and then ran out of the business. Degefferd attempted to chase after the suspects to recover the merchandise but that one of the suspects armed with a gun threatened to shoot him and Degefferd backed off. Security footage of this crime was captured but police were unable to obtain a copy of it at the time of the investigation.
- 13. On 12/24/16 at 9:00 pm, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 1202 W Highland for a property damage complaint. Police spoke with Ajit Walia who stated three juveniles entered the store and began to fill their backpacks with merchandise. Walia believed they were going to steal it, so he told them to put it back. The subjects refused, so Walia used the magnetic door locks to trap them inside the store until police arrived. As a result, the unknown juveniles trashed the store, broke the door and ran off. A report was filed.
- 14. On 01/28/17 at 4:10 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 1202 W Highland for a theft complaint. Police spoke with Tariq Warraich who stated 2 unknown suspects entered the business and began to fill up bags with candy. The suspects then fled the business.
- 15. On 01/29/17 at 5:49 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 1202 W Highland for a theft complaint. Officers spoke with Tariq Warraich who stated 2 men came into the business with one male standing by the door holding it open, while the other filled bags with various boxes of candy, drinks and beef jerky. Warraich stated video footage was not available at the time of the incident.
- 16. On 01/30/17 at 2:30 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 1202 W Highland for a theft complaint. Police spoke with Tariq Warraich who stated 2 suspects entered the business and

started grabbing large amounts of candy bars and filled a yellow mesh bag. Both subjects then fled. Warraich stated he does not have access to the video. Report filed.

- 17. On 02/02/17 at 12:50 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 1202 W Highland for a theft complaint. Police spoke with Tariq Warraich who stated 4 subjects entered the store. One subject stayed and held the door open while the 3 others filled bags with merchandise and then fled. Total estimate value of merchandise was \$400. A report was filed.
- 18. On 02/10/17 at 1:00 pm, Milwaukee police met with Ajit Walia, owner of the BP gas station at 1202 W Highland, to attempt a CPTED survey of this location regarding recent incidents. An officer contacted Walia one week prior to the meeting which was initiated by MPD in attempt to help resolve escalating incidents of crime and disorder. Discussed were measures Walia could take in order to prevent/deter these incidents from occurring. Some suggestions that were provided to Walia were adding cameras to the parking lot to monitor employees and activity, removing unnecessary signage from the windows and relocating the coffee maker to increase sightlines to the pumps and parking area, training employees to retrieve security footage for police, and increasing security during the nighttime hours. Another meeting was scheduled for 03/21/17 at 1:00 pm.
- 19. On 10/02/17 at 4:01 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 1202 W Highland for a criminal damage complaint. Police spoke with Tariq Warraich who stated an unknown male entered the store and accused Warraich of overcharging for cigarettes after the subject's Visa was declined. Warraich stated the subject became very upset and began knocking down the bread shelf and picked up the coffee machine and slammed it on the ground destroying it, then fled the store. Damage was estimated at \$300.
- 20. On 03/24/17 at 8:45 pm, four subjects entered the store at 1202 W Highland and attempted to steal numerous refrigerated items. One subject held the door while the other three filled backpacks with merchandise. The subject who was holding the door got spooked and ran off, allowing the door to close. This allowed the clerk, Tariq Warraich, to secure the doors and not let the remaining subjects in the store run out with their backpacks that was filled with merchandise. When the other subjects realized they couldn't leave, one picked up a fruit display stand and used it to smash out one of the stores glass doors allowing the subjects to flee with the merchandise. Warraich stated that the security guard who was supposed to work that night did not show up. Report filed.
- 21. On 09/14/19 a 16 year old working in conjunction with the Milwaukee Police Department and WI WINS Tobacco initiative, was able to purchase a 2 pack of Black and Mild Cigars at 1202 W. Highland Blvd, The sales clerk admitted to selling the item and the applicant was issued a citation.

22. On 09/28/19 at 9:45pm, Milwaukee Police were dispatched to 1202 W. Highland Blvd for a sick/injured person complaint. Upon arrival, the officers found the subject on the northeast side of the property, behind a short brick barrier, and he/she was deceased due to a drug overdose.

- 23. On 11/04/19 at 3:33pm, Milwaukee Police were dispatched to 1202 W. Highland Blvd for a trouble with subject complaint. Upon arrival, officers interviewed the caller/employee who stated that his child's mother came to location and started arguing with another female that was talking to him. She then entered her vehicle and struck the callers vehicle causing minor damage.
- 24. On 02/14/20 at 4:03pm, Milwaukee Police were dispatched to 1202 W. Highland Blvd for a theft complaint. Upon arrival, officers interviewed the manager who stated that an employee had fraudulently refunded \$14,000 to two credit cards. The employee was not on scene and the applicant, who was notified by phone, said that he would provide documentation to the police on a later date.
- 25. On 02/20/20 at 6:16am, Milwaukee Police were dispatched to 1202 W. Highland Blvd for a property damage complaint. Upon arrival, officers interviewed the caller/employee who stated that a customer had damaged his vehicle. Surveillance cameras did not capture the incident but the employee was able to describe the alleged perpetrator.
- 26. On 03/26/20 at 11:53pm, Milwaukee Police were dispatched to 1202 W. Highland Blvd for a theft complaint. Investigation revealed that two unknown subjects entered the establishment and took two cases of the energy drink "Red Bull" without paying for them.

27. On 07/01/2022 at 4:45pm officers were dispatched to a Shooting at 1202 W. Highland Av. The officers observed a blood trail outside. They observed more blood inside and multiple bullet casings inside. The officers spoke with an employee outside, who refused to identify himself. He stated he was outside when he heard shots inside and he saw the clerk run from the building. The officers repeatedly contacted the applicant to get the information for the clerk and he refused to provide it, saying the clerk just started and he did not have his name. A few hours later the clerk arrived back on scene and stated the applicant was his uncle even though the applicant stated he did not know the clerk's name. The officers were able to view video which captured the shooting happening inside and found no employee was involve. The victim ran to Mt Sinai hospital for treatment of his wounds.

INITIAL INVESTIGATION

On Friday, July 1ST, 2022, P.O. Deja Sloan and I were dispatched to a Shooting complaint located at 1202 W Highland Ave in the City and County of Milwaukee, WI.

Upon a arrival we observed a blood trail outside of the gas station. When furthering our investigation we observed blood inside of the gas station as well as multiple spent shell casings, and bullet fragments. An employee (B/M) whom wanted to remain anonymous was outside of the business he stated he was outside of the business when he heard shots being fired and that he ran around to the other side of the gas station. The employee stated that the cashier ran out of the business and had left the scene. I contacted the owner of the business later identified as Aiit WALIA (M/I 08-22-1960) at 5:19 PM to receive information on the cashier to verify if he was not injured and to ask information on what he had observed. When speaking with WALIA he stated that he was driving and could not look to give me the cashier's phone number. I then contacted WALIA at 5:22 PM to ask for the cashier's name, WALIA stated "he just started I do not know it and that the information is not in front of me". I then contacted WALIA at 5:53 which my phone was sent to voicemail. I then contacted WALIA at 5:59 PM and my call was sent to voicemail again. The anonymous employee stated to be at approximately 6:00 PM "My Boss (WALIA) wants you to call him. I contacted WALIA at 6:01 PM and again asked for the cashier's information. WALIA stated "I am not going to give you his number I can bring him to you guys at a later date and time so someone can speak with him. I am a attorney and I know what you guys are trying to do". I expressed to WALIA multiple times that we have to verify that he has no injuries and ask what happened. WALIA stated that we have access to the video surveillance. I explained to WALIA that a felony crime was committed inside of his business and that we have to complete our investigation. WALIA stated multiple times 'I am a attorney and I am being cooperative with you guys but I am not giving you his phone number.

A few hours later the cashier that had left the shooting scene arrived back on scene. The cashier gave his statement as well as telling us that WALIA is his uncle although WALIA stated to us that the cashier just started and that he does not know his first or last name.

The shooting occurred inside of the business address above. The victim had ran to Mt. Sinai Hospital with gunshot wounds. After reviewing video footage no employees were involved with this shooting.

Those wishing to provide oral testimony via phone or internet are asked to contact the staff assistant, Yadira Melendez at (414) 286-2775 or stasst5@milwaukee.gov for necessary information. Please make such requests no later than one business day prior to the start of the meeting. You are not required to attend the hearing, but please see the information below if you would like to provide testimony. Once the Licenses Committee makes its recommendation, this recommendation is forwarded to the full Common Council for approval at its next regularly scheduled hearing.

Important details for those wishing to provide information for the Licenses Committee to consider when making its recommendation:

1. The license application is scheduled to be heard at the above time. Due to other hearings running longer than scheduled, you may have to wait some time to provide your testimony.

2. You must appear in person and testify as to matters that you have personally experienced or seen. (You cannot provide testimony for your neighbor, parent or anyone else; this is considered hearsay and cannot be considered by the committee.)

3. No letters or petitions can be accepted by the committee (unless the person who wrote the letter or the persons who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify).

4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.

5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)

6. You may then provide testimony.

a. Include only information relating to the above license application.

b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.

c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.

d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.

7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.

8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.
