- 1. Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):
- The 2022 Collaborative Crisis Response and Intervention Training Program grant will fund development of an advanced crisis intervention team (ACIT) program to improve law enforcement response to behavioral health calls for service. The purpose of the grant is to train and equip 100 police officers to better identify and respond to behavioral health calls with the goal to reduce police use of force, divert individuals from jail and the criminal justice system, and reduce involuntary admissions to Milwaukee County Mental Health. Advanced CIT training will promote the development of a specialized skill set to effectively understand, communicate, and adapt to individuals in a behavioral health crisis. The Department will collaborate with Milwaukee County Behavioral Health Services and NAMI Southeast Wisconsin to develop and deliver the training program.
- Relationship to City-Wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives: As a result of this grant, each police district will have ACIT trained officers to respond to the unique demands of behavioral health calls for service. This team of trained officers will supplement the Department's Crisis Assessment Response Team (CART) response that pairs a licensed clinician with a MPD officer to behavioral health calls.

Need for Grant Funds and Impact on Other Departmental Operations (Applies only to Programs): The total grant award of \$250,000 with a grantor funded amount of \$250,000 (100%) and a local match of \$0 will fund development of an advanced CIT curriculum approved by U.S. Department of Justice and prepare 100 officers with enhanced skills to effectively interact with individuals in crisis demonstrating behavioral health conditions.
