This grant will support a Public Health Strategist who will support nutrition education programming, community gardens and urban agriculture, healthy food retail support in existing and new businesses, City policy, zoning, and practice, Healthy Food Financing initiatives, creation of a community commercial kitchen, resident leadership and engagement, and other things. The goal of this position is to increase access to and consumption of healthy foods among the SNAP-Ed target audience, which includes those with risk factors for nutrition-related chronic disease, such as obesity, prevent or postpone the onset of disease by establishing healthier eating habits and being more physically active.  Relationship to City-Wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives:  There is growing local momentum to implement strategies that influence the policy, system, and environmental factors that impact food access. In 2017, the MHD published MKE Elevate, a Community Health Improvement Plan which identified access to basic needs such as healthy food as a priority for improving the health of Milwaukee. This plan followed the 2013 publication of ReFresh Milwaukee, a city-wide strategic plan to address sustainability, which identified many goals related to food access. MKE Elevate and ReFresh Milwaukee preceded the City of Milwaukee's 2019 Healthy Food Access Plan, a plan aimed at increasing healthy food access across the city. Despite the publication of these three plans, progress has been slow on implementing the identified activities.
