#### Background

- 3-year, grant funded project through federal Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA)
- Comprehensive Opioid, Stimulant, and Substance Abuse Program (COSSAP)
- County-level through Medical Examiner's Office
- Focus on preventing overdoses and fatal overdoses in particular
- Bringing multi-disciplinary partners together

## OD-PHAST Guiding Principles

North Star: Our shared goal is to reduce overdoses in Milwaukee County.

We recognize substance use disorder as a chronic, treatable disease.

We will use multi-sector data responsibly to inform response strategies.

We share accountability for reducing overdoses.

#### SOS process

All meeting activities address one or more of these goals.

**Shared understanding** – develop a common understanding of overdoses in Milwaukee County and evidence-based prevention and intervention strategies

**Optimized capacity** – collaborate across agencies within our county and state to strengthen our capacity to reduce overdoses within Milwaukee County.

**Shared accountability** – share responsibility for implementing recommendations to achieve our North Star – to reduce overdoses within Milwaukee County.

## Data Strategy Team (DST)

Analysis of aggregate overdose-related data

Fall/Winter 2022 Data Strategy Team (DST) meeting summary

- Analysis of suspected nonfatal overdoses from July 2021

   June 2022 revealed areas of high density varied by
   racial and Hispanic ethnicity groups
- Fall 2022 focused on suspected nonfatal overdoses among Hispanic individuals
  - Focus area identified and data reviewed
  - Presentations from UCC, UMOS, and 16<sup>th</sup> Street Clinic
  - Development of recommendations by the DST
- Also had presentations by partner agencies that provided additional important context for overall overdose trends and prevention (e.g., Vivent Heath presented on a variety of areas related to harm reduction)



Focus area identified for suspected nonfatal overdoses among Hispanic individuals

- North: Pierce St.
- South: Cleveland Ave.
- East: I94/I43
- West: 38<sup>th</sup> St.

#### Adopted recommendations for the focus area

- Identify or create and disseminate overdose prevention educational materials, resources, and trainings in Spanish (e.g., Narcan training video).
- Distribute harm reduction materials, including Nalox-ZONE boxes, with instructions in Spanish in places that people frequent (e.g., gas stations, grocery stores).
- Conduct targeted outreach in the focus area with information on harm reduction and treatment resources.
- Conduct an overdose prevention education and awareness campaign through local Hispanic media.
- Develop and implement strategies aimed at utilizing evidence to reduce stigma associated with substance use disorder, treatment, and harm reduction through a unified community approach.
- Expand bilingual outpatient substance use disorder services with on-demand access.

#### **Next Priorities**

- Develop implementation plans for the recommendations and seeking assistance if implementation challenges are encountered
- Repeat the focus area analysis with suspected nonfatal overdoses among other racial and ethnic groups
- Collaborate with multiple agencies on identifying current locations and types of naloxone availability across the county and how that overlays with the density of fatal and nonfatal overdose incidents.
  - Will be valuable for planning additional naloxone distribution options and sites
- Enhance and expand the current Overdose Dashboard based on input from the team and other partners
- Will be requesting a no cost extension through Sept 2024

## Overdose Fatality Review (OFR)

Case level review of drug deaths in Milwaukee County

### OFR Updates

Bereavement support, referrals to county resources, and interviews with next of kin continue.

Next of kin information has been a valuable addition to the case review process.

OFR partners brought concerns about Delta-8 reactions to the OFR team.
