

Dear Ms. Sanders:

We are in receipt of your claim for damages that occurred to your 2016 Ford Fiesta, on July 18, 2022, when a City tree branch broke and fell on your vehicle at or near 3838 N. 38th Street.

Our investigation reveals that at approximately 9:15am, on July 18, 2022, the Forestry Section received notification of a broken branch from a City tree that was hanging over the street and sidewalk located at 3838 N. 38th Street. A Forestry crew responded at approximately 10:20am, and confirmed the broken City branch had fallen onto your vehicle.

Further investigation revealed that the subject tree was a 30" Green ash tree that appeared in good health, and the branch that failed was alive and there was no decay evident at the point of failure.

On July 17, 2022 through July 18, 2022, the City of Milwaukee experienced winds with sustained speeds of 15mph and peak winds of 21mph according to reports from General Mitchell by NOAA. The Forestry Section responded to 24 emergency calls regarding broken branches and down trees during this timeframe.

It is our view that the tree failure was not a result of any negligence caused by the City Forestry Division. Therefore, we cannot accept liability for your damages and we are denying your claim.
