## Tips and information for elected officials to share with residents and community members supporting DPW Sanitation for clean Milwaukee neighborhoods

- Securely bag all garbage and tie off or seal bags. Reduces attraction of flies, wasps & rodents to food waste and the likelihood of rodents biting holes in cart; prevents litter from spilling out of the cart when it is dumped.
- Clean garbage carts regularly and disinfect. Reduces attracting flies and rodents that bite holes in carts.
- Place carts at the collection point (alley line or curb line) the night before collection or by 7 AM on designated pickup dates.

After collection, return carts to storage area by 10 PM.

To ensure collection, carts must have a clear path to them and cannot be blocked by parked vehicles. Carts must be free from ice and snow accumulation during winter.

- Follow the recycling guide! (see <u>MilwaukeeRecycles.com</u> for info)
- No plastic bags are allowed in recycling carts and do not bag recyclables except for shredded paper which may be enclosed in paper bags.
- Do not place liquids or any hazardous materials in garbage or recycling carts
- The following items are NOT collected curbside.
  - Appliances, TVs and Computers, and Tires take to a Drop Off Center
  - Grass clippings, garden trimmings, and weeds leave on the lawn, compost, or take to a <u>Drop Off Center</u>
  - <u>Household Hazardous Waste</u> take to any MMSD Collection Site
- Schedule neighborhood litter cleanups.

Notify Sanitation ahead of time of the organized neighborhood cleanup date and the desired pickup location. Items will be collected by Sanitation crews on the next business day.

- Clean up litter around your property, your block, and green spaces.
- Clear debris from storm drains near your house and on your block. Our mechanical brooms do sweep the curb, but aren't always able to sweep everything due to obstacles such as parked cars.
- Keep an eye out for illegal dumping. Evidence of illegal dumping can be reported at <u>www.milwaukee.gov/illegaldumping</u>. Pictures and videos can be uploaded. Contact the police if witnessing illegal dumping as it occurs.
- **Cut brush down to size.** No branch should be longer than 4 feet or larger than 6 inches in diameter. Place up to 2 cubic yards (size of a couch) between the curb and sidewalk or alley for collection. Please keep brush piles out of the street.
- Brush piles larger than 2 cubic yards must be taken to a Drop-Off Center for disposal.
