If the activities of the applicant involve a licensed premises, whether the premises tends to facilitate a public or private nuisance or has been the source of congregations of persons which have resulted in any of the following: disturbance of the peace; illegal drug activity; public drunkenness; drinking in public; harassment of passers-by; gambling; prostitution; sale of stolen goods; public urination; theft; assaults; battery; acts of vandalism including graffit, excessive littering, loitering, illegal parking, loud noise at times when the licensed premise is open for business; traffic violations; curfew violations; lewd conduct; display of materials harmful to minors, pursuant to s. 106-9.6; or any other factor which reasonably relates to the public health, safety and welfare, or failure to comply with the approved plan of operation. Proof of warrant satisfaction or payment of fines must be submitted at the hearing on the above date and time. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in a delay of the granting/denial of your application.

Failure to appear at this meeting may result in the denial of your license. Individual applicants must appear only in person or by an attorney. Corporate or Limited Liability applicants must appear only by the agent designated on the application or by an attorney. Partnership applicants must appear by a partner listed on the application or by an attorney. If you wish to do so and at your own expense, you may be accompanied by an attorney of your choosing to represent you at this hearing. You will be given an opportunity to speak on behalf of the application and to respond and challenge any charges or reasons given for the denial. No petitions can be accepted by the committee, unless the people who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify. This report is written by Police Officer Corstan D. COURT, assigned to the License Investigation Unit, Days.

The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

- 1. On 06/17/09 at 7:09 pm, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 7th and Layton for a Trouble With Subject complaint. Officers spoke to the caller who stated he was a patron at Sollazo's Club when the owner kicked him out for no reason. The victim stated he had money sitting on the bar and he wanted it returned. Police spoke to the owner/bartender Ronald Sollazo who stated the patron was in the bar earlier but after a while, he realized that this patron had been told not to come back due to a fight and property damage he caused when he was at the bar previously. Sollazo stated that is when he kicked the patron out and further stated that the subject did not have any money sitting on the bar. The call was advised.
- 2. On 10/20/09 at 1:08 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 703 W Layton Avenue for an Armed Robbery complaint. Investigation found two unknown suspects entered the tavern armed with guns and demanded money and property from the bartender and two patrons that were inside at the time. One suspect then struck the bartender identified as Ronald Sollazo in the head with his shoe and ransacked the cash register. The suspects then fled the scene. Sollazo was able to provide officers descriptions of the suspects as well as the information on the car they fled in. Minor injuries were reported. Video surveillance was to be provided to police once a company technician arrived later that morning.

3. On 02/26/12 at 12:26 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 703 W Layton Avenue for a Threat complaint. Police spoke with the bartender Mary Schock who stated two patrons were exchanging words with one another and that she had asked all parties to leave. The patrons left without incident. Police later cited both patrons for disorderly conduct.

4. On 03/02/2016 Milwaukee police responded to a theft complaint at 703 West Layton Avenue (Club 703). The caller told officers that sometime between 3:00pm and 6:00pm someone had broken into four video poker machines inside the business and taken over \$100.00. Milwaukee police incident report #160620151 filed.

5. On 11/27/20 at 11:45pm, Milwaukee Police conducted a license premise check at 703 W.

5. On 11/27/20 at 11:45pm, Milwaukee Police conducted a license premise check at 703 W. Layton Avenue. No violations were found and the applicant was cooperative.

6. On 02/11/23 at 8:47pm, Milwaukee Police were dispatched to 703 W. Layton Avenue for a subject with gun compliant. Investigation revealed that an unruly subject, who damaged equipment, was kick out of the establishment. The applicant, during the confrontation, had a firearm on his hip.

On Saturday, February 11th, 2023, while dressed in Full Milwaukee Police uniform and utilizing body worn camera, P.O Frank HEEG and I responded to a subject with Gun complaint located at 703 W. Layton Ave the 703 Club. During the investigation we spoke with owner Ronald A. SOLLAZO, W/M, 8-17-48 who stated he had got into an argument with a customer, and he had his firearm on his right hip. SOLLAZO stated by the time we arrived the argument was over, and the subject left the establishment without incident. He stated the caller was being unruly and was asked to leave, there was no weapon involved and the caller was just angry he was kicked out. He stated the caller made a deal with another patron over a pool game and refused to honor it. The caller then began damaging bar equipment, SOLLAZO did not want anything done about the damage. The caller was not on scene and did not answer a returned phone call. This incident was given a c10 (ADVISED)

During this incident there was no security on scene and there has been 2 calls for service at this location this year.

Those wishing to view the proceeding are able to do so via the City Channel – Channel 25 on Spectrum Cable – or on the Internet at http://city.milwaukee.gov/citychannel. Those wishing to provide oral testimony via phone or internet are asked to contact the staff assistant, Yadira Melendez at (414) 286-2775 or stasst5@milwaukee.gov for necessary information. Please make such requests no later than one business day prior to the start of the meeting. You are not required to attend the hearing, but please see the information below if you would like to provide testimony. Once the Licenses Committee makes its recommendation, this recommendation is forwarded to the full Common Council for approval at its next regularly scheduled hearing.

Important details for those wishing to provide information for the Licenses Committee to consider when making its recommendation:

- 1. The license application is scheduled to be heard at the above time. Due to other hearings running longer than scheduled, you may have to wait some time to provide your testimony.
- 2. You must appear in person and testify as to matters that you have personally experienced or seen. (You cannot provide testimony for your neighbor, parent or anyone else; this is considered hearsay and cannot be considered by the committee.)
- 3. No letters or petitions can be accepted by the committee (unless the person who wrote the letter or the persons who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify).
- 4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.
- 5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)

- 6. You may then provide testimony.
- a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
- b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
- c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
- d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
- 7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.
- 8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.

Please Note: If you have submitted an objection to the above application your objection cannot be considered by the committee unless you personally testify at the hearing.
