 Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations): The Well Woman Program (WWP) grant allows the Milwaukee Breast and Cervical Cancer Program (MBCCAP) to serves as a care coordinator and provider for breast and cervical cancer screenings, diagnostics, and case management to eligible persons. MBCCAP hosts a clinic up to twice weekly at Southside Health center (SSHC) to provide clinical breast exams, mammograms, and Pap smears. Eligible patients include:

- Women, transgender women (who have taken or are taking hormones), transgender men (who have not undergone a bilateral
 mastectomy and/or have not undergone a total hysterectomy)
- Age 45-65
- Non-insured or under insured
- Low income
- 2. Relationship to City-Wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives: As a coordinator, MBCCAP enrolls all Milwaukee residents into the WWP to receive services at SSHC or other WWP external provider locations. MBCCAP welcomes and pursues partnerships with stakeholders to increase its community engagement and educational efforts. MBCCAP utilizes an electronic health record for tracking of enrolled persons and services received. This serves as a means to collect data to strategically assess and formulate program objectives. This aids the City's Mission to advance the health and equity of Milwaukeeans.
- 3. Need for Grant Funds and Impact on Other Departmental Operations (Applies only to Programs): The grant funds allow MHD to provide breast and cervical cancer screening, service coordination, and education to help individuals reduce negative health outcomes in higher-risk populations. WellWoman is currently fully funded by grants from the State of Wisconsin – funding these services through the City budget would likely result in ending the service or reducing another Health Department service to fund Well Woman services.

4. Results Measurement/Progress Report (Applies only to Programs): Results are measured using the Health Department electronic health record which allows for tracking of enrolled persons and services received. This also allows for tracking of demographics such as race, address, and language. MBCCAP also tracks its participation in community events. Reporting forms are required to be completed by all providers who perform care for enrolled persons. These reporting forms collect data which is reported to the Centers for Disease Control. MBCCAP can request these reports from the state.

- 5. Grant Period, Timetable and Program Phase-Out Plan: July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024. Funding is set in State statute, and made by sum-sufficient appropriations in the State's biennial budget, with supplemental funding from a CDC grant to the State. MHD does not anticipate a need to phase out WellWoman services.
