1. Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):

The purpose of this program is to assist high-risk youth and families and promote resilience and equity in communities that have recently faced civil unrest through implementation of evidence-based violence prevention, and community youth engagement programs, as well as linkages to trauma-informed behavioral health services. These efforts will target the neighborhoods and populations that reside and work in Milwaukee's Promise Zones, as defined in the Blueprint for Peace.

2. Relationship to City-Wide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives:

The ReCAST grant meets the City's goals by identifying evidence-based practices that reduce violence and implementing them in the Promise Zones. This supports the City's goal of reducing violence and the Health Department's goal of protecting the health and safety of all Milwaukeeans.

3. Need for Grant Funds and Impact on Other Departmental Operations (Applies only to Programs):

Grant funds will augment other City and grant-funded work in violence prevention, specifically working both up- and down-stream of occurrences of violence. No additional impact to Health Department programs.

4. Results Measurement/Progress Report (Applies only to Programs):

The following measures are collected quarterly:

- 1. The number of people in the mental health and related workforce trained in mental health-related practices/activities that are consistent with the goals of the grant.
- 2. The number of individuals who have received training in prevention or mental health promotion.
- 3. The number of organizations collaborating/coordinating/sharing resources with other organizations as a result of the grant.
- 4. The number of people receiving evidence-based mental health-related services as a result of the grant
- 5. The number of individuals exposed to mental health awareness messages.

5. Grant Period, Timetable and Program Phase-Out Plan:

The ReCAST grant is awarded every five years and runs through September of 2026 – this file is the Year 3 award (2023-24). This grant period runs from October 2023 to September 2024. Currently, a phase-out plan has not been established because the Health Department intends to reapply for ReCAST funds for the 2026-2031 period.
