# City-County Heroin, Opioid and Cocaine Task Force

## Background

- 3-year, grant funded project through federal Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA)
- Comprehensive Opioid, Stimulant, and Substance Abuse Program (COSSAP)
- County-level through Medical Examiner's Office
- Focus on preventing overdoses and fatal overdoses in particular
- Bringing multi-disciplinary partners together
- Also added a toxicology resource to the Medical Examiner's Office, as well as two social work positions for postvention follow-up and next of kin interviews

## OD-PHAST Guiding Principles

North Star: Our shared goal is to reduce overdoses in Milwaukee County.

We recognize substance use disorder as a chronic, treatable disease.

We will use multi-sector data responsibly to inform response strategies.

We share accountability for reducing overdoses.

### What is going to change?

Structure of meetings and coordination between aggregate data (DST) and case review (OFR)	<ul> <li>Connecting the aggregate data review and case selection more intentionally</li> <li>Theme-based</li> <li>Increasing opportunities for partner presentations</li> </ul>
Frequency, length, and cadence of meetings as well as location	<ul> <li>Moving to a combined meeting once per month</li> <li>Currently planning for quarterly in person, but may revisit</li> </ul>
Recommendation process	<ul> <li>Prioritization process for recommendations</li> <li>Coordination with existing groups for recommendations implementation for those that need additional support to move forward</li> </ul>
Leadership structure	<ul> <li>Identifying public health and safety leaders to help support and champion the work</li> <li>Specifics still under consideration</li> </ul>
