


Proposed 2024 Budget (Levy)







Staffing Vacancies

There are 56 vacancies in 3 titles in Sanitation.

Position	Vacant
Equipment Operator (formerly Operations Driver Worker)	54
Sanitation Supervisor	1
Self-Help Yard Supervisor	1

In addition, there are 28 vacant seasonal laborer positions. A recruitment for those positions was recently completed.

Reclassified Positions

39 positions in 6 titles in Sanitation were reclassified by Common Council files 230220 and 230454 to new paygrades.

Four titles were reclassified to new titles, including 236 Operations Driver Workers who were reclassified to the title of Equipment Operator.

The reclassification was the primary contributor to the \$2.5 million increase in salaries from 2023.




Operating Expenditures Budget

CDL Requirements

The new Entry Level Drive Training (ELDT) CDL requirements that began in early 2022 continue to have impacts on the CDL driving industry across the country for both public and private entities. The training/testing requirements have increased the demand for CDL drivers and have impacted DPW's ability to attract and retain CDL drivers.

The recently enacted changes to the Salary Ordinance combined with the department's efforts to grow drivers through training support will likely make the City more successful with hiring and retention.

Snow Routes

The routes for snow removal in the Central area have been redesigned to align each route's arterial and residential streets. They were also adjusted so the average lane miles would be more equal. Residential street sections were limited to 2 per route. If the route changes improve the efficiency of snow operations, the North and South areas will be rerouted over the next 2 years.

Material Recycling Facility (MRF) Fire

A fire at the MRF on May 31, 2023, damaged the facility. Collected recycling material is taken to the City yard on West Lincoln Avenue where a contracted operator loads material into semi-trailers and delivers it to processing facilities in Madison, Appleton, and Franksville. No decision has been made about future operations at the MRF.


The purchase of salt and the cost of waste disposal are Sanitation's 2 largest operating expenses.


Landfill tonnage costs are budgeted at a rate of \$50.30 per ton, an increase of 3% from 2023.

Street Sweeping

Currently, most of the area outside of the combined sewer area is swept once per month while most of the combined sewer area is targeted to be swept twice per month. The downtown area (roughly from Juneau to Canal and 6th to Lake Michigan) is targeted to be swept weekly.

In 2024, the department will target the same sweeping frequencies. However, actual sweeping frequency is expected to vary based on staffing availability.
