


STEEL CRAFT (California, Santa Ana)

- Outdoor Eatery made with repurposed food containers.
- 3 Locations (Long Beach, Bellflower, and Garden Grove).
- Each location includes up to 7 restaurant tenants
- 15,000-square-foot cityowned lot (Bellflower location).
- Created by private developer
- Estimated to generate \$50,000 in annual sales tax and \$22,000 in annual lease revenue for the city of Bellflower.




BOX PARK (U.K.)

- Boxpark Shoreditch opened in 2011 as the world's first pop-up mall.
- Made out of 60 recycled shipping container. Has 19 restaurants and bars and 27 shops.
- In 2016 the second Boxpark was built in Croydon, with a \$4 million dollar loan from the Croydon Council. Intended to be a temporary structure that would last for five years until homes and offices could be developed on the sites two-story structure. Constructed out of 96 shipping containers. (3 locations in total)



Dekalb Market (Brooklyn, NY)


- Opened in 2011 on an empty lot on Flatbush Ave in Downtown Brooklyn. Food and other vendors sold their wares out of repurposed shipping containers.
- 20,000-square-foot open-air mall operate year-round because the containers included electrical outlets that heaters. featured many Brooklyn-based food vendors, artists' booths, clothing stands and an urban farm that grew produce.
- The market was forced to close due to construction of City Point, a multi-use retail, office and residential development project at the site. A new market concept with a similar name - DeKalb Market Hall opened in 2017 inside City Point. The 26,000 square-foot food hall has room for 55 vendors and two full-service restaurants.




BOX OFFICE WAREHOUSE SUITES (Fort Worth, TX)

- Box Office Warehouse Suites is a 50,000-squarefoot business park. It is a business center made entirely out of shipping containers opened in 2018.
 - The development has a 38multi-use office-business suites and retail spaces, using more than 100 shipping containers, with rents starting at \$875. Space ranging from 320 to 1,600 square feet
