Dear Common Council Members,

In order to be eligible for future grants under the State of Wisconsin's Department of Transportation (WisDOT) Harbor Assistance Program (HAP), an annual update of the Port's Harbor Development Three-Year Statement of Intentions is required to be submitted to WisDOT by April 1<sup>st</sup> of each year.

The enclosed update to the Port's 2024 Statement of Intentions is herewith submitted for the Common Council's approval. The Statement of Intentions was unanimously approved by the Port's Board of Harbor Commissioners (BHC) on Thursday, February 8, 2024.

WisDOT uses this listing of potential future projects for its internal budgeting purposes and planning. The Statement of Intentions is neither an application for funding nor does it represent, in any way, a financial commitment by the City. Project descriptions and proposed dates are attached.

Port staff and the BHC respectfully recommends that the Common Council adopt the attached 2024 Statement of Intentions. With the Council's approval, the Port will transmit the Statement of Intentions to WisDOT before April 1, 2024. The Statement of Intentions is therefore placed before your Honorable Body for its ratification of the Board's action by adopting the enclosed resolution.

2024	Buildings, Terminals and Warehouses	2025	80%-20%	\$ 1,900,000	Port Milwaukee's Administration Building's EFIS façade is at the end of its useful life and is failing in multiple locations, requiring replacement of the EFIS.
2024	Pier, Berth, & Channel Improvements	2025	80%-20%	\$ 1,500,000	Approximately 9,000 feet of Port dockwall is in a state of fair, poor, or deficient condition. 2026	Dredged Material Management Facility (DMMF)	2027	80%-20%	\$ 20,000,000	Port Milwaukee is responsible for a share of the costs related to the design and construction of the Dredged Material Management Facility (DMMF), which will store 1.9 million cubic yards of sediment removed from the Milwaukee Estuary for environmental and commercial navigation purposes.
2026	Buildings, Terminals and Warehouses	2027	80%-20%	\$ 1,100,000	Several Port buildings, terminals, and warehouses are in a state of fair, poor, or deficient condition. Roofing, siding, corrosion remediation, door replacement, window repair is necessary. Deteriorating pavement floors require repaving. The retaining wall at the Port's Terminal 2 is leaning and in need of the installation of a bracing system as well as patching of concrete spawling along the length of the wall.
