

Northwest Side Plan

- Adopted in 2008 and amended in 2017 to include the Granville Strategic Action Plan and Land Use Study.
- Plan recommends that, when this site is developed, there is an emphasis on creating new connections between the multiple uses in the area.
- Plan calls for creating an "urban business park" at 60th and Green Tree.
- Proposed development preserves the adjacent city-owned land to the west for potential future use as an urban business park or light industrial uses.
- Proposed DPD addresses Plan goals including locating residential uses that are compatible with adjacent nonresidential structures and on sites with good access to transit along main arterials.
- Citywide Policy Plan (adopted in 2010) calls for providing a mix of housing options to meet the needs of all residents regardless of age or ability, and increasing the regional supply of supportive housing with features and services for people with special needs while partnering with nonprofits helping those who are unhoused or at risk of becoming unhoused to find suitable housing.
- This proposal is consistent with the plan recommendations.
















Beyond virtually eliminating Veterans homelessness in Kansas City, the VCP Village has **enhanced the safety** and increased the stability of the surrounding community.
