Subject: Response to Milwaukee Grow

To CPC, Common Council and others:

As an upper Eastside resident for over a half century I oppose the current Milwaukee Grow plan for my area of the City and for all the long-established already dense and diverse historic areas of Milwaukee. Accessory Dwelling Units, ADU in-law cottages would infringe on the small green spaces left. ADUs making residential use of attics and upper levels of duplexes and single-family homes would naturally require fire-escapes that would disrupt the historic appearance of these cherished portions of the City. Such growth in population would also require vast increases in water, sewer, electricity, health services etc that today are suffering staff shortages in service to our current population.

Though 3 of us came early to the July 29th meeting to complete our nearly-first-in-line forms wishing "to speak" due to our time constraints, we left without speaking because of the long sequence of speakers selected before us. Those speakers notably also clarified my support of Alderman Stamper's position and his many black and brown constituents who oppose this project for their residential communities many of which are also historic.

Milwaukee Grow is a huge plan being rapidly developed and feeling rushed to a point that almost assures "unintended consequences."
