

WEPA Process Overview

- WEPA Wisconsin Environmental Policy Act (1971)
 - Identify potential positive and negative impacts
 - Solicit public input
- Follow UW System Guidelines, adopted by UW Board of Regents (Resolution #8015)
- Three types of actions
 - Type I: Requires development of a full Environmental Impact Statement (EIS)
 - Type II: May or may not require an EIS but must be evaluated using an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA)
 - Type III: does not require an EIA or EIS, but a Preliminary Environmental Review must be on file with UW System
