Re: Resolution to approve settlement agreement in the matter of Bernson v. City of Milwaukee and Kurt Kezeske, U.S.D.C. Case No. 10C00009 (a/k/a Wisconsin Carry, Inc., et al v. City of Milwaukee, et al)

Dear Council Members:

Enclosed please find a resolution to approve a proposed settlement agreement in the matter of *Bernson v. City of Milwaukee and Kurt Kezeske*, which is pending in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Wisconsin under the above referenced case number.

The litigation concerns a claim advanced by David Bernson and an organization called Wisconsin Carry, Inc., that Mr. David Bernson's arrest and the seizure of his gun on June 6. 2009 violated Mr. Bernson's constitutional rights. The complaint was originally filed on January 8, 2010 and included other municipalities and other defendant officers. The allegations in the original complaint included challenges based upon unreasonable search and seizure and also alleged that the Wisconsin Gun Free School Zone Act was unconstitutional. On May 31, 2011, the Court granted a motion to sever claims, and plaintiff Bernson amended the complaint as a sole plaintiff alleging claims against the City of Milwaukee and Officer Kezeske.

The settlement calls for payment of \$6,500 full payment of all damages including attorney fees and costs in exchange for a complete release of all claims that could have been brought by against the City, the Officer Kezeske or any other Milwaukee police officer concerning the June arrest and gun seizure. There is no admission of liability.

The City Attorney requests referral to the Judiciary and Legislation Committee for a meeting in closed session for purposes of conferring with the City Attorney pursuant to §19.85(1)(g), followed by open session for action as part of the regular agenda.
