The library is requesting funds to support educators to work with children who have been identified at the greatest need for literacy enrichment over the summer of 2012. The educators will have weekly contact with these children at their summer camps and share a love of books to spark a passion for reading in the children. The educators will also inform the children about the resources at the library. Each location will receive a collection of library books for use over the summer.
