Re: Report of the Renewal Application of Muhammad F. Yousuf for a Public

Passenger Vehicle Driver License.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Muhammad F. Yousuf (hereinafter the "Licensee") is the holder of a Public Passenger Vehicle Driver license in the City and County of Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Said license expires at midnight, October 31, 2011.

- 2. An application to renew said license was filed with the Office of the City Clerk on October 3, 2011.
- 3. Pursuant to Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and § 349.24 of the Wisconsin Statutes, the matter was referred to the Milwaukee Police Department for investigation. The Milwaukee Police Department filed a police report dated October 5, 2011. That report could form the basis of non-renewal or suspension of this license.
- 4. On October 6, 2011, the City Clerk's Office provided timely notice to the Licensee, pursuant to Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and § 349.24 of the Wisconsin Statutes of a police report that could form the basis for suspension or non-renewal of the license of the licensee and included therewith a copy of the Milwaukee Police Department report. The matter was scheduled for a hearing on the police report on October 18, 2011 at 9:00 a.m. in Room 301B of City Hall. At said date, time and place, the licensee did appear and was not represented by counsel.
- 5. Based upon the sworn testimony heard and the evidence received at the hearing, the Committee finds the following:

On August 17, 2009 officers of the Milwaukee Police Department were dispatched to a motor vehicle crash at South 6th Street and West National Avenue. The applicant was operating a motor vehicle (All City Taxi Cab No. 207) westbound in the 500 block of West National Avenue and was involved in a traffic crash with another vehicle at South 6th Street. The investigation revealed that at the time of the crash, the applicant's driver's license was suspended for unpaid fines.

- On July 10, 2009 the Wisconsin Department of Transportation suspended the applicant's driver's license for 39 days for failure to pay forfeiture.
- On November 16, 2009 the Wisconsin Department of Transportation suspended the applicant's driver's license for two months for driver record.
- On January 20, 2011 the Wisconsin Department of Transportation suspended the applicant's driver's license for 81 days for failure to pay forfeiture.

The applicant's Wisconsin's driver's license was suspended on July 10, 2009 for failure to pay forfeiture. During the period of suspension the applicant failed to return his public passenger vehicle license to the City Clerk as required by City ordinance.

The applicant's Wisconsin's driver's license was suspended on November 16, 2009 for driver record. The applicant did not return his public passenger vehicle license to the City Clerk until December 7, 2009; 22 days after the date of suspension. City Ordinance § 100-59-1-b requires the applicant to return his public passenger vehicle license to the City Clerk within 10 days of the date of suspension.

The applicant's Wisconsin driver's license was suspended on January 20, 2011 for failure to pay forfeiture. During the period of suspension the applicant failed to return his public passenger vehicle license to the City Clerk as required by City ordinance.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Committee has jurisdiction to hold hearings and provide Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and a Recommendation to the full Common Council pursuant to Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and § 349.24, Wisconsin Statutes.
- 2. Based upon the above facts found, the Committee concludes that the licensee, Muhammad F. Yousuf, has not met the criteria of Chapter 100 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances or § 349.24 of the Wisconsin Statutes to allow renewal of his

Public Passenger Vehicle Driver license without undergoing a sixty (60) day suspension based upon the police report and driving record.

3. In order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Milwaukee, it is the recommendation of the Public Safety Committee that the full Common Council of the City of Milwaukee should exercise its judgment to renew the Public Passenger Vehicle Driver license held by Muhammad F. Yousuf with a sixty (60) day suspension based upon the police report and driving record.

RECOMMENDATION

Based upon the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law stated above, the Committee by vote of four (4) ayes and one (1) no recommends that the Public Passenger Vehicle Driver license of Muhammad F. Yousuf be renewed with a sixty (60) day suspension based upon the police report and driving record.

Said suspension is to be in effect from the date of the Common Council hearing of November 2, 2011 and for sixty (60) days thereafter.
