Dear Bob,

I can't go to the hearing, because I have a previous commitment that can't be changed. I am in favor of a mixed used (retail/office/muni court/other (e.g. housing) development that would contain the police headquarters.

From watching the news it sounds like this might be a hard sell with the Mayor and the Police Chief. However, there are a number of benefits to bringing this proposed development to 27th and Wells (central location, economic upside, having the police there should increase the perception of safety, etc.); also, the cost in comparison to \$58M may not be unattractive. Further, reworking an old facility can be charming but the opportunity to build something like this new may provide a "one time" opportunity to create great efficiencies through the creation of a model facility. These sorts of options and comparisons might be worth discussing, and the overall cost benefit of incorporating 27th and Wisconsin could prove favorable. I would think the Mayor and Police Chief might entertain such discussions.

Also, Rocky has talked about a McArthur Square strategy. Relatedly, the removal of that current Police Headquarters building on State could open up that area to the implementation of a new McArthur Square strategy.
