

ORDER

The above-captioned matter came on for hearing pursuant to the plaintiff filing a summons and a complaint and a motion for a temporary restraining order allowing the plaintiff's tavern to operate on after the expiration of its current Class "B" Tavern license, and the refusal of the Milwaukee Common Council to renew the same. The plaintiff appeared by Attorneys David Hal brooks and Matthew Lerner, Maistelman & Associates, 5027 West North Avenue, Milwaukee, WI 53208. The Court was able to obtain the presence of the Milwaukee City Attorney in the person of Assistant City Attorney Bruce D. Schrimpf, Room 800, City Hall, 200 East Wells Street, Milwaukee, Wisconsin 53202. During the proceedings it appeared that during the floor debate on this matter before the Common Council, the Chairman of the Licenses Committee did not correctly summarize the record of this location to the members of the Common Council.



Based upon the pleadings on file, and a Brief in Opposition filed by the City the

Court:

ORDERS

1. The request for temporary relief is held by the Court, without ruling, until further

order of the Court.

2. The matter is returned to the Common Council for a rehearing allowing the

licensee to correct the mistaken comments and to allow the Common Council to

come to a decision on the renewal of the Class "B" Tavern and tavern related

licenses of the licensee in light of the corrected record.

3. The Council is free to come to any judgment it wishes, warranted by the evidence

before it, regarding the renewal of this license.

4. The Court shall retain jurisdiction of this case pending further action of the

Milwaukee Common Council.
