

## Indonesia – Midwest Trade on 2011

According to the Foreign Trade Division, US Bureau of Census's data, for the 13 of Indonesian Consulate in Chicago accreditation states. Total volume trade between Indonesia – Midwest in 2011 increases to US\$ 4.1 billion from US\$ 3.1 billion in 2010. The increase comes from Indonesia's exports that raise from US\$ 2.3 billion to US\$ 2.8 billion, despite Indonesia's imports increase from US\$ 1 billion to US\$ 1.2 billion. Hence, in 2011, Indonesia enjoys a trade surplus increase of over US\$ 300 million from US\$ 1.2 billion to US\$ 1.5 billion.


## Global Economy Update

Although Europe is slowing down, **the U.S. economy, Japan, China and other Asian countries will grow better than Europe in 2012.**

## INTERNATIONAL TRADE ( Billion USD)




## GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT (%)



The economy remained strong amidst global economic slowdown and possible Government policy in subsidized fuel prices. **The economy is to grow by 6.3% in the 1st quarter 2012** and will continue to expand in the 2nd quarter of 2012.

This growth is bolstered by strong domestic demand with robust **private consumption and an increasing role of investment.**










## INDONESIA ECONOMIC CORRIDORS: MAIN POTENTIALS






