## Alderman Dudzik:

I am a resident of the 11<sup>th</sup> District, and I am writing tregarding the Milwaukee Police Department's hiring process.

I took the written test for the Milwaukee Police Department in July 2010. At that time, I was placed in the middle 400s among the thousands of applicants who took that test. A few applicants were hired in 2011 from the 2010 application process, but most of the cadets in the 2011 police academy were police aides. In 2012, 68 applicants were hired, mostly from the 2010 list.


After more than three years of waiting for an opening at the Milwaukee Police Department, I was just informed by the Fire and Police Commission that I am unlikely to be hired during 2013. As you are aware, sir, the city's 2013 budget only allows for 20 new police officer positions, and the FPC has informed me most of those vacancies will be filled by police aides. The 2010 list expires next year, though it may be renewed.

Sir, I mean no disrespect, but my wife and I have been holding off on finding a new home and making other life decisions because of my desire to work for the Milwaukee Police Department. Regretfully, I may have to start looking for other employment opportunities outside the city. We cannot wait another year for this process to evolve. The MPD is absolutely what I would call a dream career, but I may have to settle for other employment in the interest of financial security for my family.

I have been treated most professionally and most courteously by the Police Department, the FPC and everyone I have encountered at City Hall. I realize this is an unfortunate circumstance caused by the city's fiscal crisis. I know this is no person's fault, but it is frustrating.

I am currently a police officer for the Federal government. I have a university degree, I am an Emergency Medical Technician, I am fluent in Spanish and I have more than a decade of law enforcement education and experience that I am willing to bring to the City of Milwaukee. The city must realize that it will lose valuable candidates if only 20 officers are hired this year and the current hiring process extends into another year.

Is there anything that can be done to increase the number of new hires for 2013? Thank you any information you can provide.
