If adopted, the resolution authorizes partial settlement of litigation by entering into a repair contract with J. P. Cullen & Sons, Inc. which will require the City to pay 6.707 million dollars to J. P. Cullen & Sons, Inc., a figure far below the fair market value of the work to be performed. Additional costs listed in Section H are anxillary expenses the City currently anticipates. These figure are estimates only, and the full costs will not be known until the repair work is completed. The City is claiming these costs, and potentially other costs, as part of its damages in the ongoing litigation.
