16. Board of Zoning Appeals

I. BUDGET OVERVIEW.

The 2014 Proposed Budget includes no changes in positions for the Board of Zoning Appeals ("BOZA"), which is entirely funded through an SPA. A small reduction in fringe benefit costs and the elimination of equipment purchases account for the 1.7% decrease 2014 funding.

II. EXPENDITURES.

BOZA salary expenditures increase by 0.1% in 2014, and fringe benefit costs decline by \$2,147 (-3.7%). Operating Expenditures, both total expenditures and individual line items, are unchanged from 2013. There are no Equipment Purchases budgeted for 2014; the 2013 Budget provided \$3,000 for the purchase of 5 PC workstations for staff.

III. REVENUES.

BOZA's revenues, which come from application fees, entirely offset its operating expenditures. Last year, BOZA revenues exceeded expenditures by almost \$57,000. The 2014 Proposed Budget projects that BOZA will again recover all of its operating costs through fee revenues.
