




Total Crime by Month







TRAFFIC STOP ACTIVITY AND CITIZEN COMPLAINTS JANUARY – AUGUST FOR EACH YEAR








2012 Calls for Service, Violent Crime, Traffic Stops, and Subject Stops compared to Milwaukee Demographics

Population Below Poverty






