WHEREAS, Elena Castañeda was one of the first Mexican-Americans born in Racine, Wisconsin and she obtained her bachelor's degree in Early Childhood Education, with a minor in Bilingual Education from Alverno College and obtained a Master's of Science degree in Elementary Education from UW-Whitewater and went on to become the first bilingual administrator to initiate the UW System's bilingual education program and Elena volunteers at the Racine County Zoo, Racine Art and Historical Museums and the Racine County visitors Bureau; and

WHEREAS, Jimmy Castañeda served in the U.S. Army, rising to the rank of sergeant and was honorably discharged after earning a Purple Heart, and he then pursued a vocational career and was the first Mexican-American to obtain a Tool Room Machinists Journeyman's Card, and he went on to work for the American Motors Company, and wanting to help others achieve he took a three year hiatus to teach Spanish speaking students in Racine how to read blueprints and learn machine operations, and he was also a baseball and basketball coach in Racine and served on the Hispanic Advisory Board for Milwaukee Public Television; and

WHEREAS, The UMOS Hispanic Awards honor the contributions of Wisconsin Hispanics to their communities, and in 2013, UMOS celebrates 48 years of building better futures for the individuals, families and communities it serves, the Jimmy and Elena Castañeda family is an outstanding example of a family that is making a positive impact on the lives of others; now, therefore, be it
