## Draft Comments Z & D

Mr. Chairman and member of the committee, I am John Daniels the chairman of the Greater Milwaukee Committee. I appreciate the opportunity to briefly share with you why the Greater Milwaukee Committee wants to express in unequivocal terms its support for the project that you are considering. That support really is not just project specific but it really goes beyond that. We all know that you and many others are working to address the challenges around education in our community.

As chairman of the Greater Milwaukee Committee our members have indicated that finding creative innovative and effective approaches to create educational opportunities for youngsters in this region but especially in Milwaukee is a top priority. Therefore, at the Greater Milwaukee Committee we, in addition to the many efforts of tutoring and school sponsorships, have been supporting and replicating the best initiatives in the country which give us an educational advantage. As a result, over a year ago we pulled together some of the best and most experienced real estate minds in our

community to develop ways to help with housing for educators with other groups. This group formed in February of 2013 and was led by its co-chair Barry Mandel.
