- Bomet County is one of the 47 counties of Kenya with a population of 730,129 (Kenya census, 2009)
- The County lies 220 kilometres (137 miles) South West of the city of the Nairobi (capital of Kenya)
 - The capital of Bomet County is Bomet town with a population of 42,024.

INTRODUCTION

- The County of Bomet has a government consisting of a legislative assembly and a county executive
- Bomet County covers an area of 1,592.4 sq. km and is situated in the highlands south-western of Kenya (2,050 metres above the sea level).
- The County enjoys a cool climate of a mean monthly temperature of 18° C and an annual rainfall of 1,100 1,500 mm.
- The highlands are endowed with rich soils which have enabled Bomet to produce a variety of food and cash crops.
- The region is part of the Mau mountain range with numerous rivers that flow into Lake Victoria, the source of the Nile River.
- Bomet County is a key route to the world famous Maasai Mara Game Reserve that feature the great wildebeest migrations.

- The County is endowed with such resources as Forests, Pasture, Rivers, Wildlife and Arable Land

Kenya-US Relations

- Kenya and the United States of America have enjoyed cordial relations since 1963 when Kenya attained its independence from Great Britain
- Under the African Growth and Opportunity Act, the U.S. exports to Kenya agricultural products, aircraft and machinery
- Kenya exports to USA include apparel, coffee and tea
- U.S. business investment in Kenya is primarily in commerce, light manufacturing and the tourism industry



Kenya-US Trade-Import and Export

- Kenya is currently America's 105th largest goods trading partner with \$846 million in total (two way) goods trade during 2011 (Office of the US Trade Representative, 2013)
- U.S. goods exports to Kenya in 2011 were \$464 million, up 23.7% (\$89 million) from 2010, and up 95.1% from 2000
- U.S. goods imports from Kenya totalled \$382 million in 2011, a 22.6% increase (\$70 million) from 2010, and up 248.3% from 2000

Milwaukee Bomet Sister City Relationship

The expectation is that there would be mutual friendship between the cities based on understanding of each other's culture and cities.
 In addition a delegation of cultural and academic exchanges, musical exchanges, and health care workers (doctors, nurses), going back and forth between the two cities are expected to take place.

Potential Trade Relations between Bomet and Milwaukee

- As a leading tea producer, Bomet could undertake direct tea exports to Milwaukee
- Currently, most of the tea produced in Kenya is exported to Egypt, Pakistan, United Kingdom, Afghanistan and Sudan (Kenya Tea Board, 2013)
- And emerging markets include China, Iran, United Arab Emirates and Russia
- Milwaukee could import directly from Bomet as part of Kenyan exports to North America

Potential Trade Engagements

- A direct market could be developed in Milwaukee for horticultural export from Bomet.
- Fresh fruits and vegetable such as bananas, passion fruit, avocado, chillies, pineapple, onions, leeks and peas could be exported to Milwaukee

Potential Trade: African Art

- Kenya, and thus Bomet is well-known for its African traditional cultures, hence the availability of African hand-made art, craft and gifts . Such items could be exported to Milwaukee for others to know something about these African gems.
- The Bomet community still posses the old cultural and traditional items such as leather garments, utensils, tools and implements that could interest collectors of ancient artifact and history in Milwaukee

Cultural Exchange Programmes

- Experiencing a new culture helps us better understand the world around us
- There is a great deal to discover in the African culture and one way to do it is by cultural exchange programmes
- With a rich African heritage, the community in Bomet County could offer citizens of Milwaukee (and vice versa), an unforgettable cultural experiences
 - Students and teachers, entrepreneurs, music performers, etc
- Group travels involving engineers, police officers, could be organized between the two cities so as to learn how their counterparts deals with some specific issues.
- This could enrich their lives while improving cross-cultural understanding and partnerships for progress

Research and Public Health Exchange Programmes

- Medical and nursing students from Milwaukee could gain invaluable experience at our medical facilities through exchanges programs and internships experience.
- The County's leading hospital, Longisa Hospital, is an established facility that can offer such opportunities.

Sports and Recreation

- Kenya is a powerful nation in athletics
- Sports men and women have made a mark in the Olympics, Commonwealth and the Marathons), though limited to long and middle distance running
- Research has shown that Kenya's favourable climatic conditions and high altitude contribute to the athletic success.
- Consequently, many athletes around the world go to Kenya to participate in several high altitude training camps around the country.
- Currently Bomet County is completing a large stadium (25,000 seats) for high altitude training.
- Milwaukee athletes could join their Kenyan counterparts in routine training and benefit from that environment

Tourism & Investment

- Bomet County is a key gateway to the world famous Maasai Mara Game Reserve
- The County enjoys (62 miles) 100-odd kilometre contiguous boundary with the famous Game Reserve
- Bomet County Government is now constructing a paved road along the game reserve creating potential investment opportunity for private developers of tourist facilities along this boundary
 Milwaukoa investore could evaluate the possibility
- Milwaukee investors could explore the possibility of venturing into tourism industry creating employment for citizens on both sides and reap handsome returns

Infrastructure Rapid Urbanisation
